Green Labs & Offices Certification Program

Public recognition for staff and faculty engagement:

- Personal lab and office assessments 180 people participated
- More office and labs certified in CHE than the rest of campus combined
- Awards for all certified labs and offices






Methodology/Response Rate

- A pre-survey was administered in April, 2014, yielding 189 usable responses. The post-implementation survey was administered in June 2015 and yielded 158 usable responses.
- The survey was sent through Qualtrics and responses were anonymous though participants did provide basic demographics and some provided contact information for a prize drawing.
- Of those who completed their surveys, 156 identified their Cornell affiliation. One limitation of this reported demographic is participants were not given the choice of "academic professional" so individuals typically identified in this way likely had to choose between identifying as staff or faculty, By default, the current study placed them into the "staff" category to determine approximate response rates.
- Of the 300 staff and academic professionals in CHE, 99, or approximately 33% responded to the survey. Of the 98 faculty, approximately 29% responded to the survey (based on data run from Workday as of 5/8/15).





Quantitative Campaign Results



Energy Smack-Down

- How did we do?
 - MVR West- 33% reduction
 - MVR main and east building- 29% reduction
 - Beebe Hall- 24% reduction
 - Savage/ Kinzleberg- 9% reduction
 - HEB- 5% reduction
 - We have taken actions with the lights, power strips and small appliances and its working.
- We have seen a total savings of roughly \$9000 per month from December- March

Energy Smack-Down-continues

- At the end of April 75% through the year, we have continued our savings and it reflects in our total utility usage.
- Electric is at 62%
- Natural gas is at 21%
- Steam is at 55%
- Water is at 50%
- This is significant and equals a total \$228,085 savings projected to the end of the year

Composting & Green Office/Lab Certifications

Composting: The group has defined 28 locations throughout the college to place new composting containers that COB will support.



How do you* most regularly travel to work?




