I am pleased to present the University of South Carolina's third submission, and my first as UofSC President, to the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education's Sustainability Tracking Assessment & Rating System (STARS). Early in my tenure at the university I initiated a new strategic planning process to map out a path forward for our institution. The result of that process is **For South Carolina: A Path to Excellence,** a comprehensive strategic plan and bold vision to become the nation's preeminent flagship institution.
