before March 2020 (i.e. - before the onset of the COVID-19 pandemic)?









Q6.3 - As campus reopens as in Fall 2021, do you intend to regularly travel to/from

UCSC learning/work site(s) in Fall?




Q6.4 - How do you expect to travel in Fall 2021?


Q6.5 - How many days a week do you plan to work/learn remotely?




Q7.1 - What is your primary affiliation with UC Santa Cruz?


Q7.2 - Which option best describes your current housing situation?

Q8.1 - Which term best describes your employment?






Q8.4 - Would you be interested in a compressed work week going forwards?





I don't have a UCSC parking permit (I'm a broke community college student who cross-enrolls in classes at UCSC), so I usually park in the extended lot (if there's even room) and then take the campus loop bus up to campus. But the campus loop buses are always jam packed, and I often have to wait for several buses to pass before there's room to get it, so it is very time consuming to get to campus. I've really only been able to cross-enroll since COVID began, bc it eliminated the parking/transit barrier.

I currently live and plan to live in College 9 Apartments (ILC).

Getting to campus is hard because of county transportation bottlenecks. Parking is too expensive on lecturer salaries. Lecturers taught more classes than Senate faculty in the 2019-20 academic year but are excluded from campus housing options. Lecturers are more likely to teach the evening and early morning classes, making traditional ridesharing (and especially vanpools) difficult or impossible. Lecturers are more than twice as than Senate faculty to be women, which means they are more likely to have complex caregiving responsibilities in addition to teaching in non-prime-time teaching blocks. Also, faculty and staff need disability transportation on campus. We teach three classes each quarter and these are often spread out across campus and/or distant from our offices.

Students like myself still face barriers to returning to in-person learning. These barriers are not being considered. Financial situations have changed, and Santa Cruz County rent prices increased. It is unfair to require us to return now.

I hope to start biking more regularly to campus. One thing that has prevented me from doing so more often is the shortage of secure bike lockers for e-bikes. Also, several of my students who live off-campus have asked if UCSC could provide lockers so that they don't have to lug around an entire day's worth of books, food, supplies, etc. all day long.




Q13.2 - Do you plan to regularly park a car overnight on the Residential Campus in Fall




Q91 - Do you intend to use the Disability Van Service in the fall?
