Frequently Asked Questions



WHAT IS THE INTEGRATIVE STUDIES PROGRAM?

Students at Keene State College complete two programs of study to earn a degree – the College’s Integrative Studies Program and their major program of study. The ISP is designed to develop intellectual skills and understanding across the arts, the humanities, the social sciences, and the natural sciences.

WHAT MAKES THE ISP INTEGRATIVE?

Integration is something students do. In the words of a KSC student who graduated with a BS in Architecture, Chris Riley, “what I loved most about KSC is that the ISP program connects to the student’s major. I was learning things in geography, sociology, art, graphic design, film, and journalism that directly connected to my studies in Architecture.” Learning in one course informs and deepens their learning in one or more other courses, as well as out-of-class experiences.

DO I ADVISE STUDENTS IN THE ISP?

Yes! As members of the faculty, we guide students to make choices beyond simply filling in categories: we help them integrate experiences in courses across the ISP—with courses in their other program(s) of study and with their co-curricular experiences. As advisors we can help students see connections among the courses they are taking.

WHAT COURSES DOES A STUDENT NEED TO TAKE?

Thinking and Writing: This course increases the probability of being retained from 52.8% to 85.2%. In addition, completing ITW in the first year improves the probability of retention dramatically for many important student demographics.

Quantitative Literacy: Students meet the Quantitative Literacy (QL) requirement by successfully completing IQL 101, MATH 120, MATH 130, MATH 135, MATH 141, MATH 151, MATH 172, MGT 140 or PSYC 251.

Perspectives: The breadth component of the ISP. Students take perspectives courses in six academic disciplines in four content areas; the arts (IA), humanities (IH), natural sciences (IN), and social sciences (IS), as well as an interdisciplinary (II) requirement.

Interdisciplinary courses may be listed as a non-departmental “II” or using a departmental/disciplinary prefix.

Upper-Level Courses: Students complete two upper-level (ISP) courses after completing a minimum of 24 credits at the lower-level, including ITW 101 and the QL requirement.

The “ISP Connections & Relationships” page groups courses by title or subject to help us all begin thinking about the ISP as a flexible program that allows students to build individualized pathways through the program – developing competencies in the College-Wide Learning Outcomes that will serve them as active citizens and lifelong learners.

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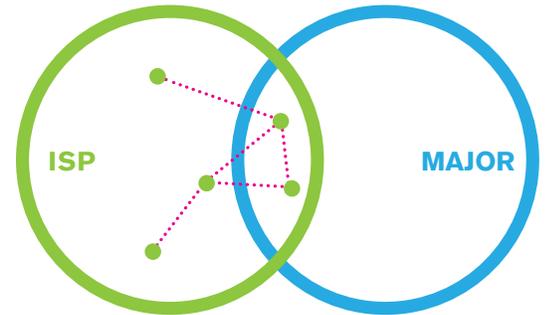
