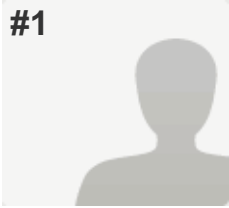

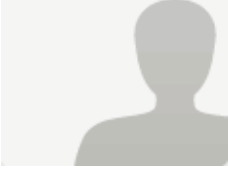

I completed a research project with a couple of undergraduate students that focused on the correlation between vitamin D levels and asthma inflammation. The project was aimed at helping those in an underserved population in Ogden. The participants were recruited from the Midtown Community Health Center. The participants were provided with vitamin D supplement. However, the sustainability portion of the project really aimed at educating those enrolled in the study more about asthma, how to recognize and control triggers, as well as proper use of medications and other important considerations in asthma management (peak flow measurements and use of spacers with medications, etc.). I don't know if that qualifies as sustainability, but the idea was to reduce asthma exacerbations in this group by educating them while also collecting data about their vitamin D levels and asthma inflammation.

My colleagues and I also did some research in Ghana, West Africa a few years ago. We performed some basic lung function testing in areas where we anticipated poor air quality. While not many of the patients smoke in Ghana, many had obstructive lung issues. We measured the air quality in those areas where the participants spent their time. Majority of air quality issues exist because they are cooking over coal pots in non-ventilated areas, and no emission control on vehicles or exposure to open burning. Again, the strategy was to provide them with education about the damage of this kind of exposure while collecting the data. Suggestions for reducing exposure were offered.

I am a researcher involved with an NSF-funded statewide program called iUTAH, researching water and water sustainability issues within UT. Myself and Dan Bedford are currently in the process of conducting a qualitative study of perspectives and attitudes about water and water conservation here at WSU, held by various WSU stakeholders. As a part of this research, my Environment and Society class (SOC 3300) conducted 9 focus groups with different groups of stakeholders this semester, and have presented their findings to WSU FM & ESO, as well as to representatives of iUTAH. Dan and I are also conducting a series of face-to-face interviews that will further inform this project.

Additionally, fall semester 2013 I taught a Sociology of Water course (SOC 4990), and my students conducted a study of bottled water on campus – the use & sales, attitudes, and positive and negative consequences of that use. I have a project looking at the effects of grazing on the endangered autumn buttercup. The autumn buttercup is Utah's rarest species and is endemic to the Sevier River Valley. It was thought that cattle were the major culprit in decimating the population found at the Nature Conservancy's Autumn Buttercup Preserve and cattle were therefore removed. Once cattle were removed the plant completely disappeared from the preserve; likely due to vole herbivory increasing as the lack of grazing by large herbivores allows the local habitat to become ideal for small herbivores. Weber State University, Cincinnati Zoo and Botanical Gardens, The Arboretum at Flagstaff, the Nature Conservancy and US Fish and Wildlife have formed a partnership to look at the use of controlled grazing by cattle as an effective management strategy to increase the survival of autumn buttercups planted June 2013.

I also have a project looking at the nutrient characteristics of sagebrush foraged on by pygmy rabbits. Pygmy rabbits are sagebrush specialists and their population numbers are threatened by habitat fragmentation and destruction. Better understanding of how sagebrush nutrient characteristics like protein and fiber levels affect foraging by this species will allow for better management strategies to be developed to maintain and increase population levels found in the sagebrush steppe habitats in Utah. This project is a partnership between WSU, the Bureau of Land Management and Utah Division of Wildlife Resources.

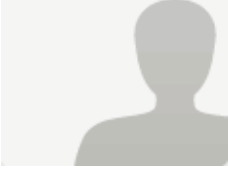
