

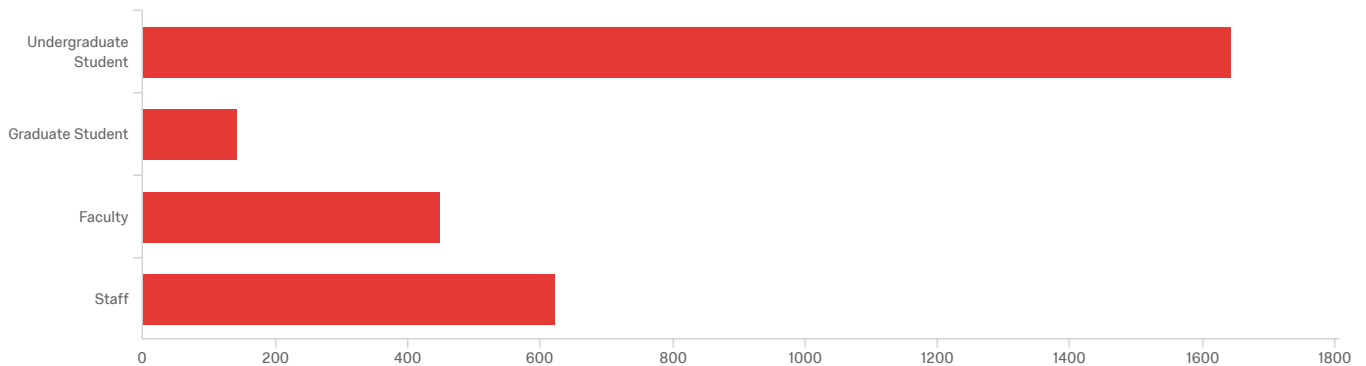

University?



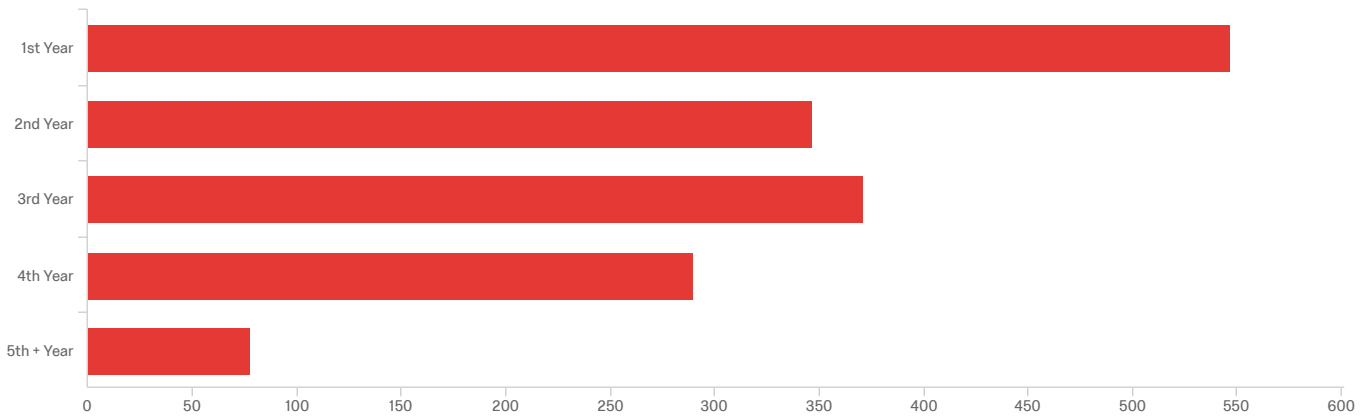

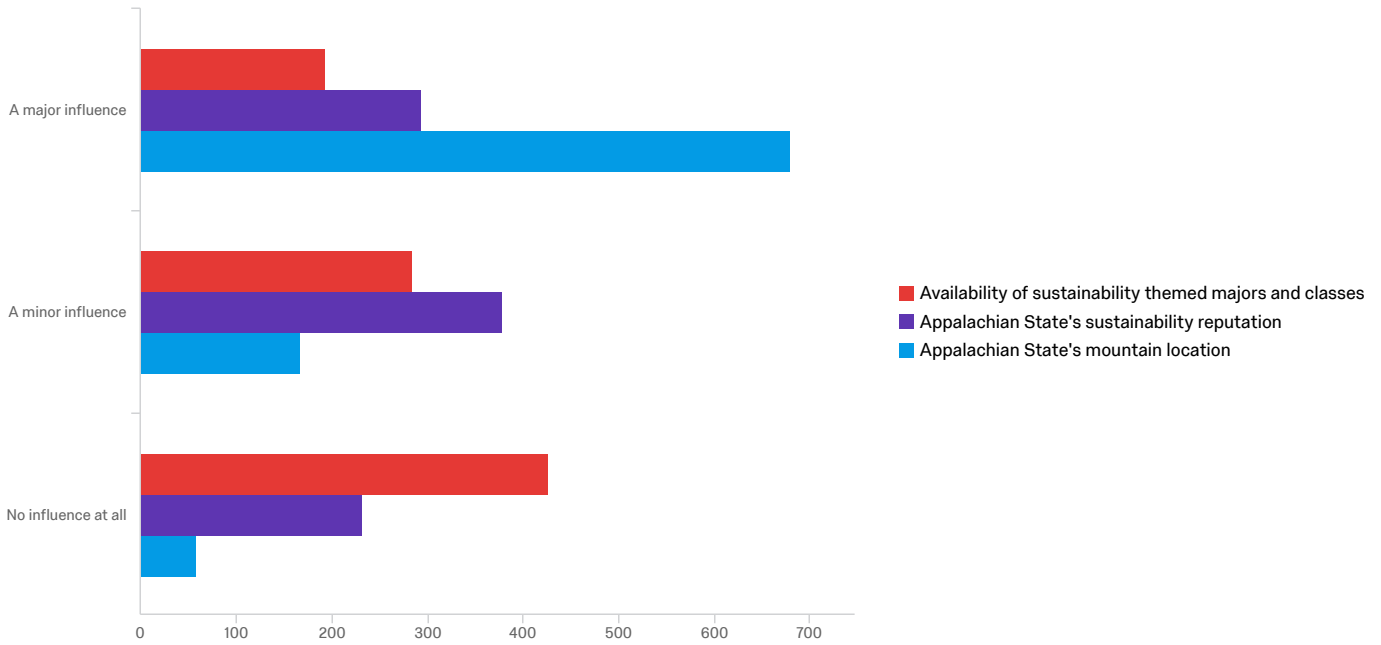

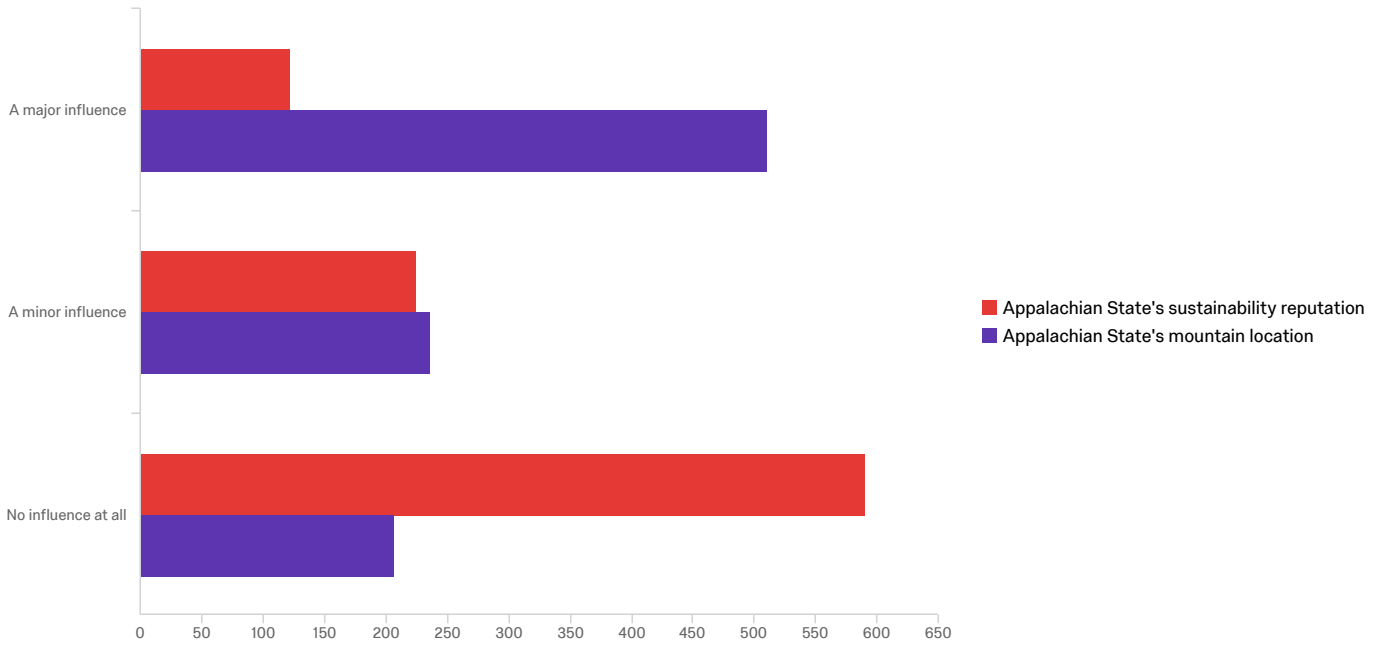

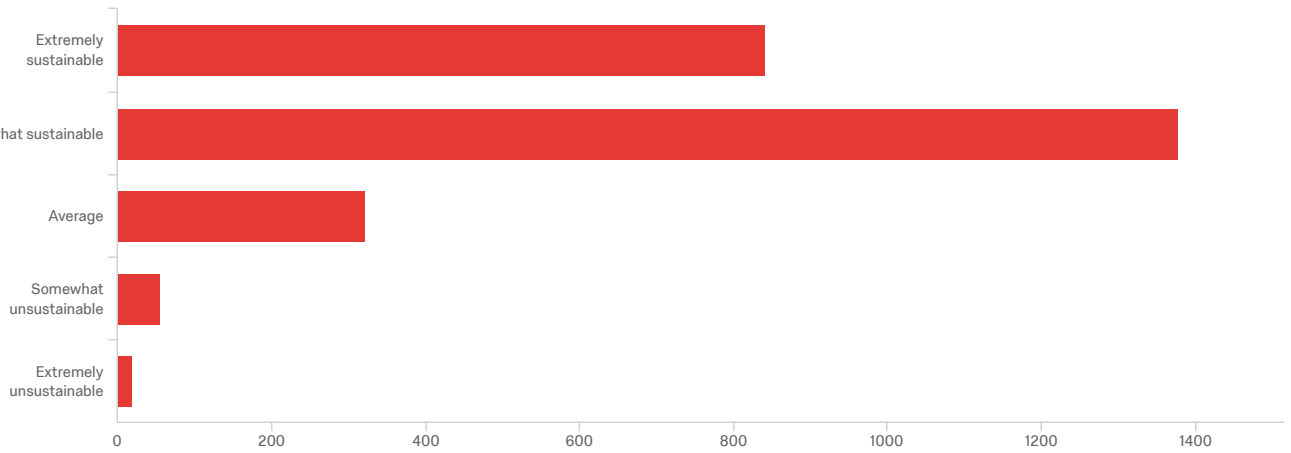

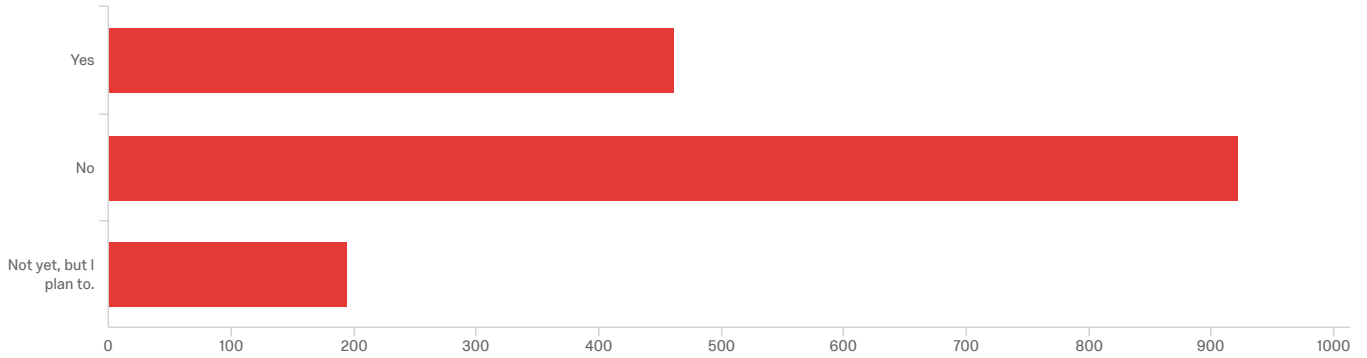

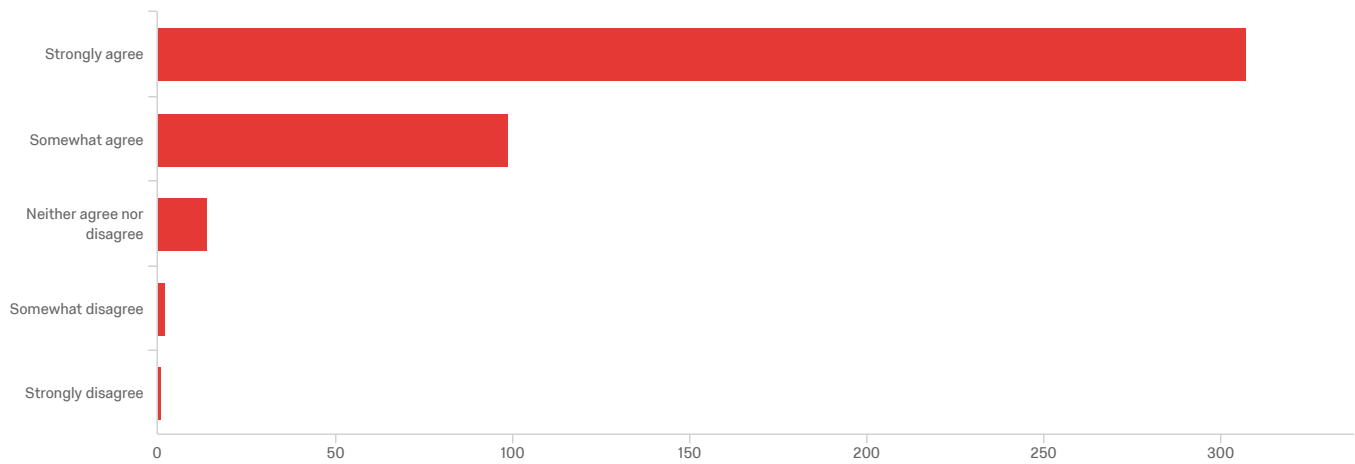

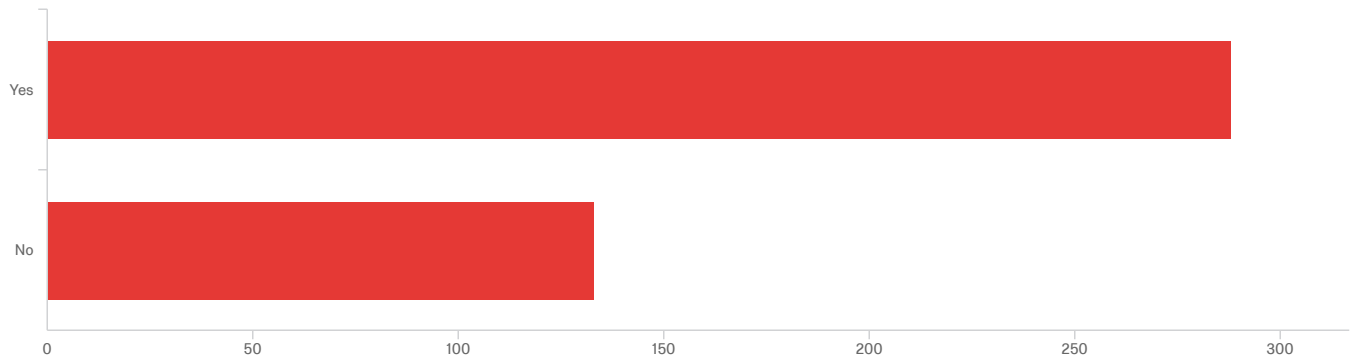

I am not aware of the issues involved.

I teach library science, and we do talk about how to recycle discarded books, but I don't directly discuss the idea of sustainability. I suppose it's somewhat interwoven into a few of the topics.

My courses are individual music and ensemble music.

I am only a student teacher supervisor. Therefore, I do not have a classroom platform.

I teach in a program where it's not the main focus and I'm tenure-track. Because we're currently in a space where issues related to the environment are seen as "political" I'm concerned that students will be upset

Not part of the course curriculum

Not particularly relevant to the course intentions

In a specific sense, it is not a part of the discipline I teach (music); in a broader sense, I suppose I do teach it though.

I teach a studio course in classical ballet, discussing sustainability is outside of the scope discussion topics.

I don't teach classes

While not totally irrelevant, I wouldn't know where or when to work it in.

I teach research methods for the health care field focusing on health outcomes and health economics.

Not applicable to subject matter in a direct way. While the concept of sustainability is relevant to many arts, the connections that can be made are really ambiguous and not terribly meaningful. For example, we all know that art and culture sustain a society, but that's not generally how we discuss sustainability on the campus.

I mostly teach techniques and concepts for using the scholarly literatures. There are sustainability concerns involved in this, but I usually leave those to the (non-librarian) instructor.

I would teach it in the lower level courses, but it isn't really applicable in my advanced courses

It doesn't really apply. I teach in the music therapy program. I discuss social justice issues, but not sustainability directly.

It's not easily incorporated into what I teach (if and when it can be, I do try to incorporate it)

Not relevant to the topics I teach, but I will try to add it to my curriculum.

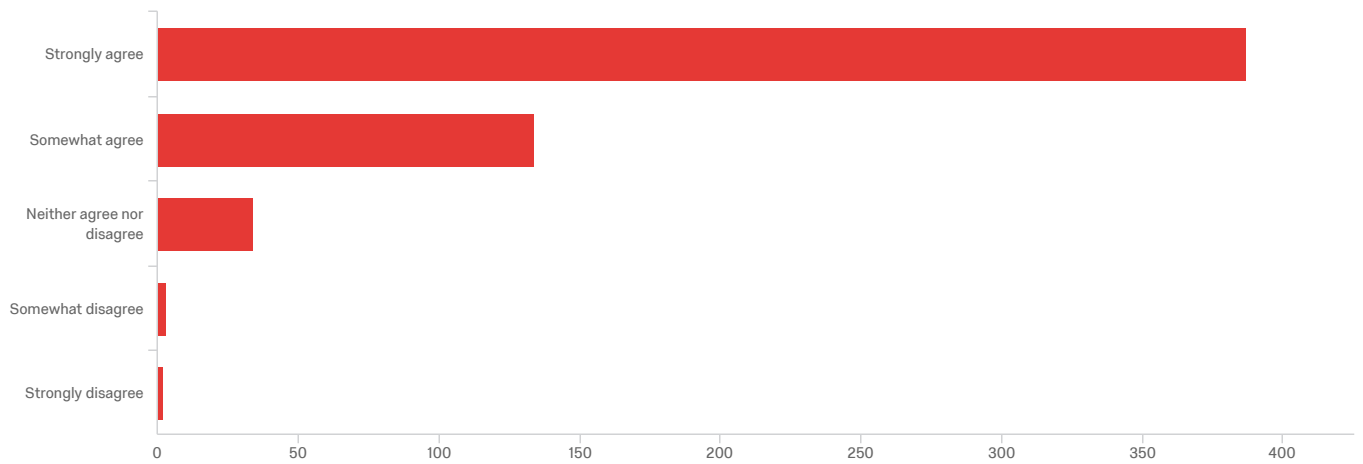
I don't teach

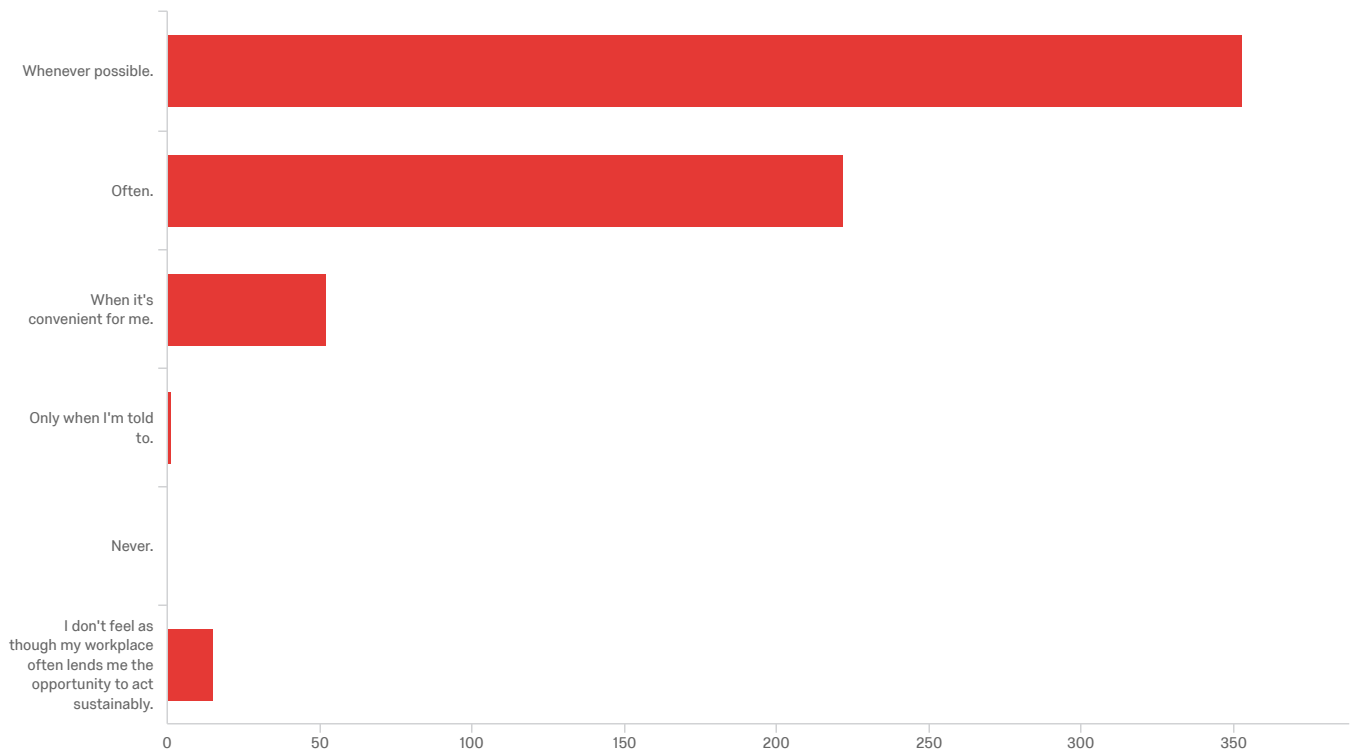

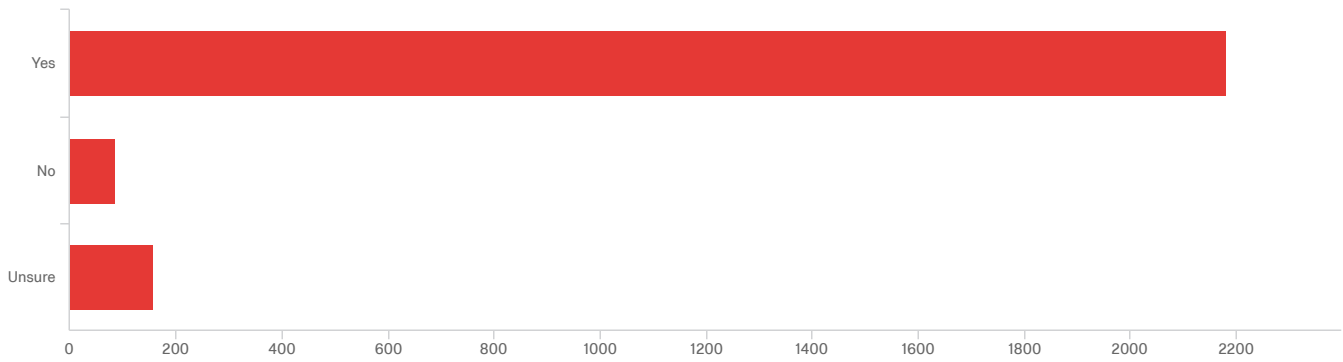

QID5 - Do you think that human activity directly contributes to global climate change?



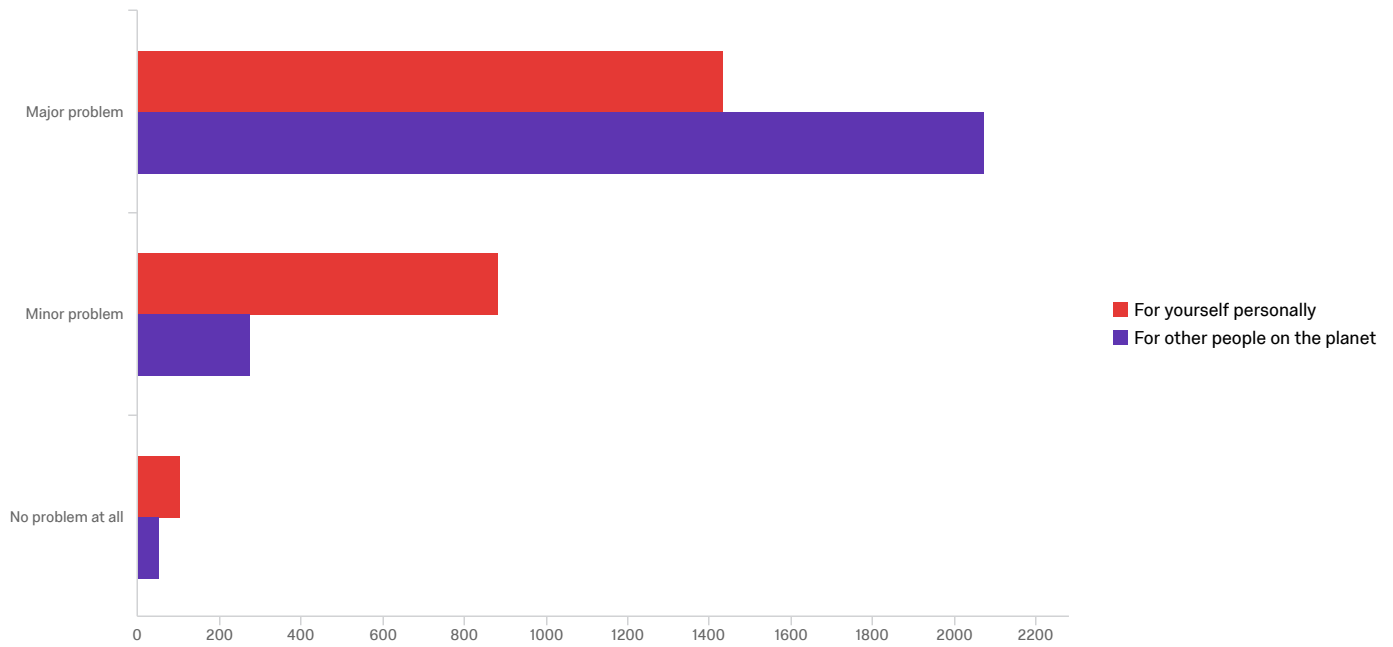

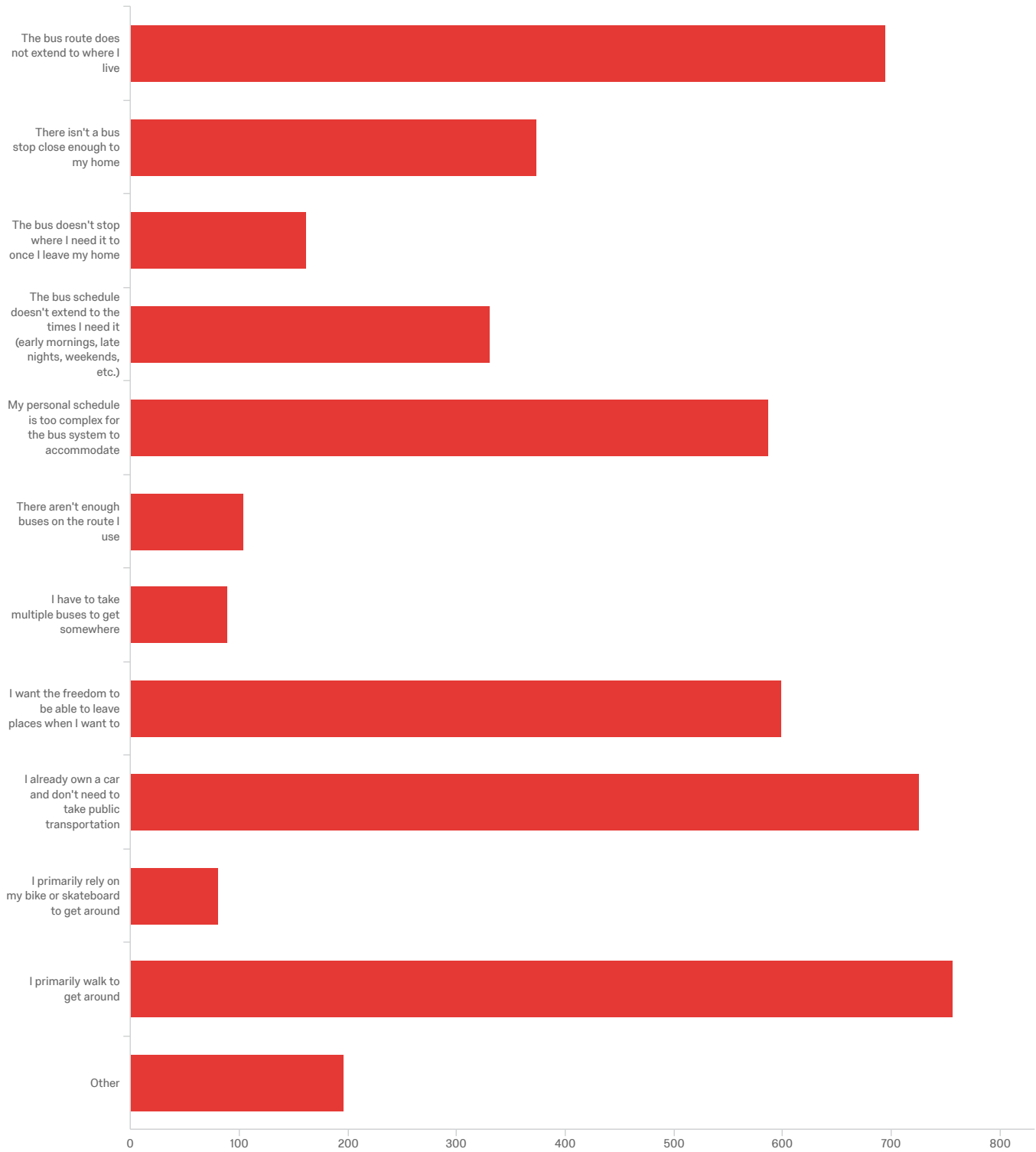

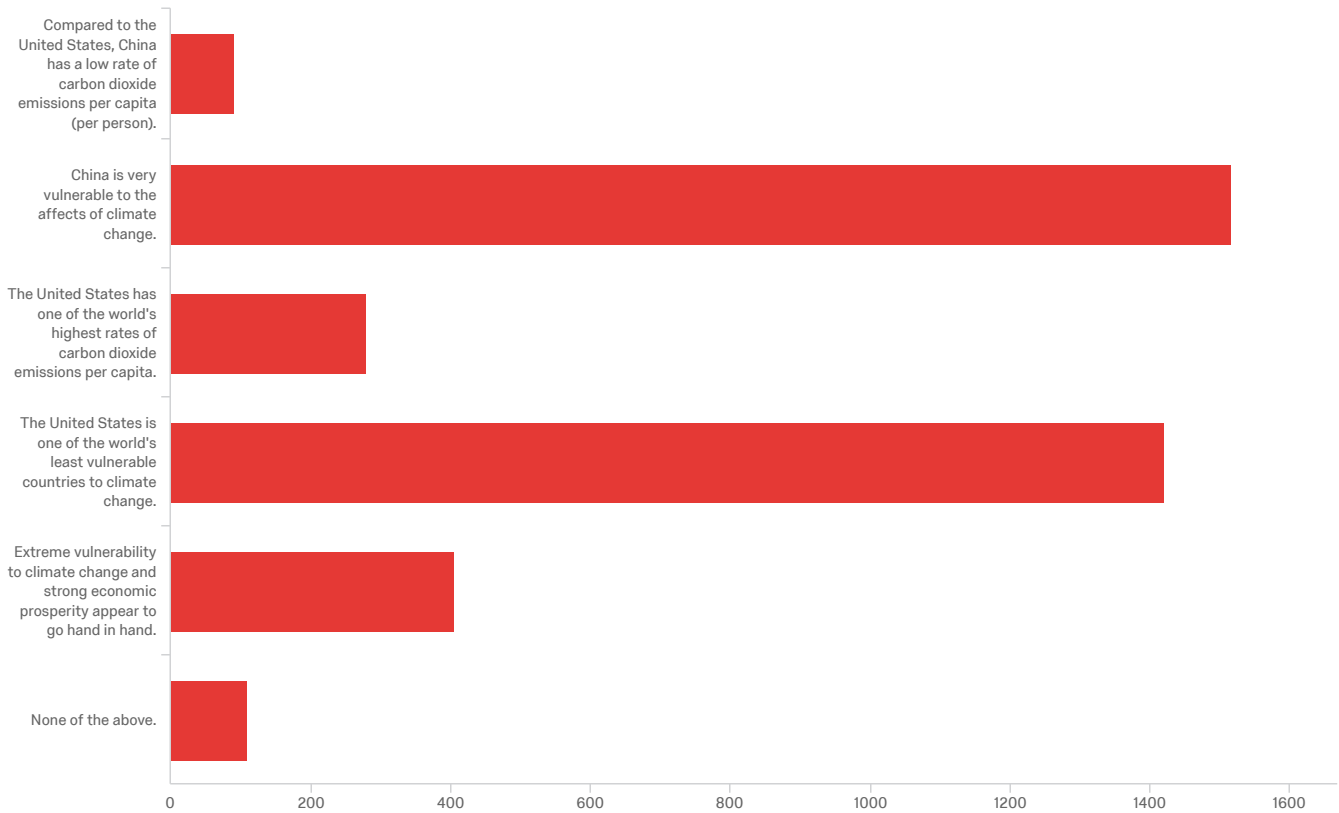

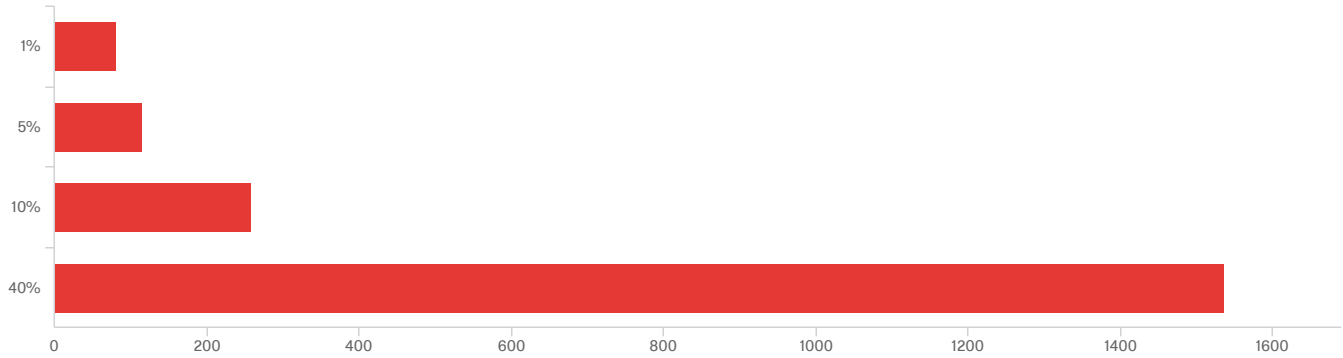

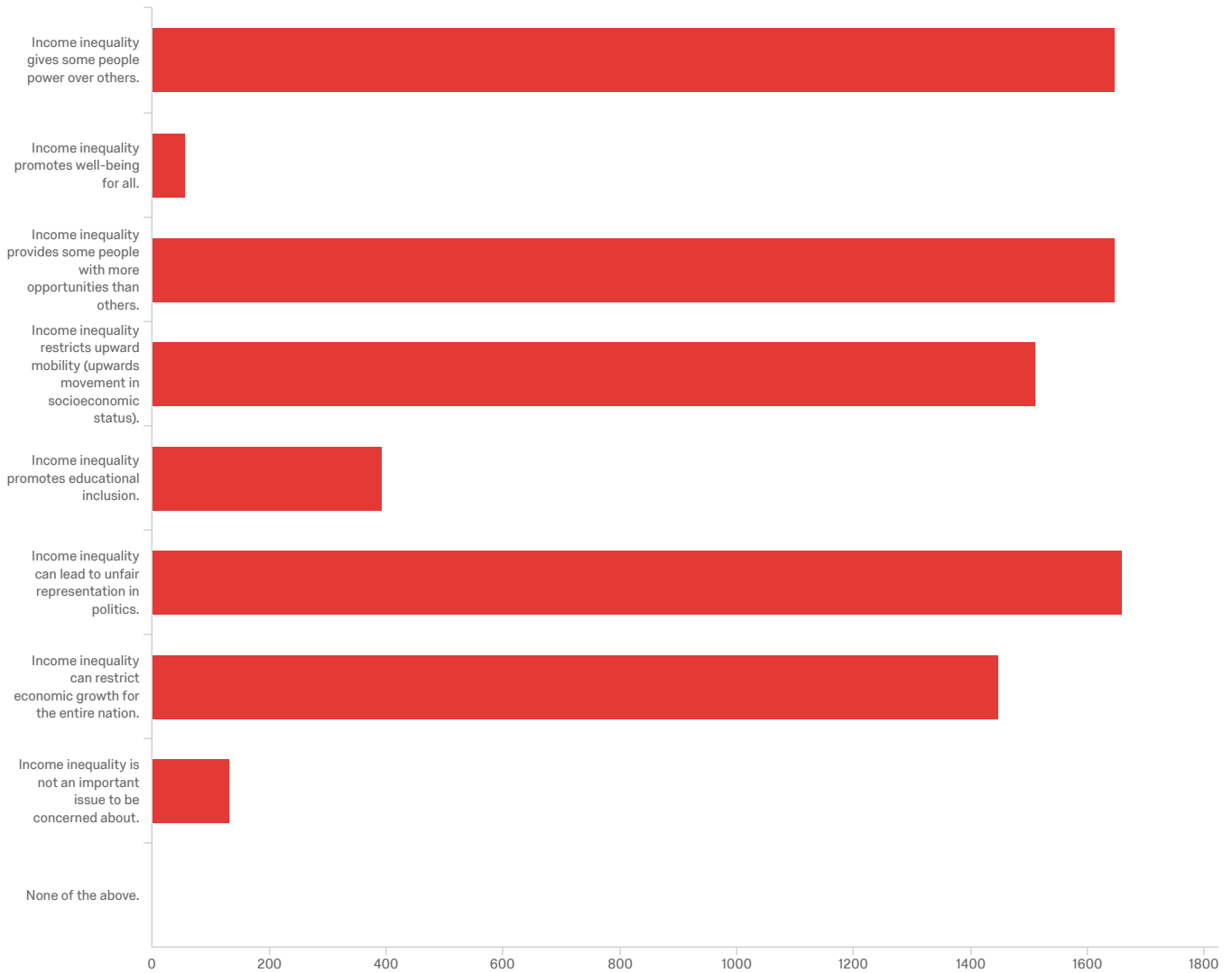

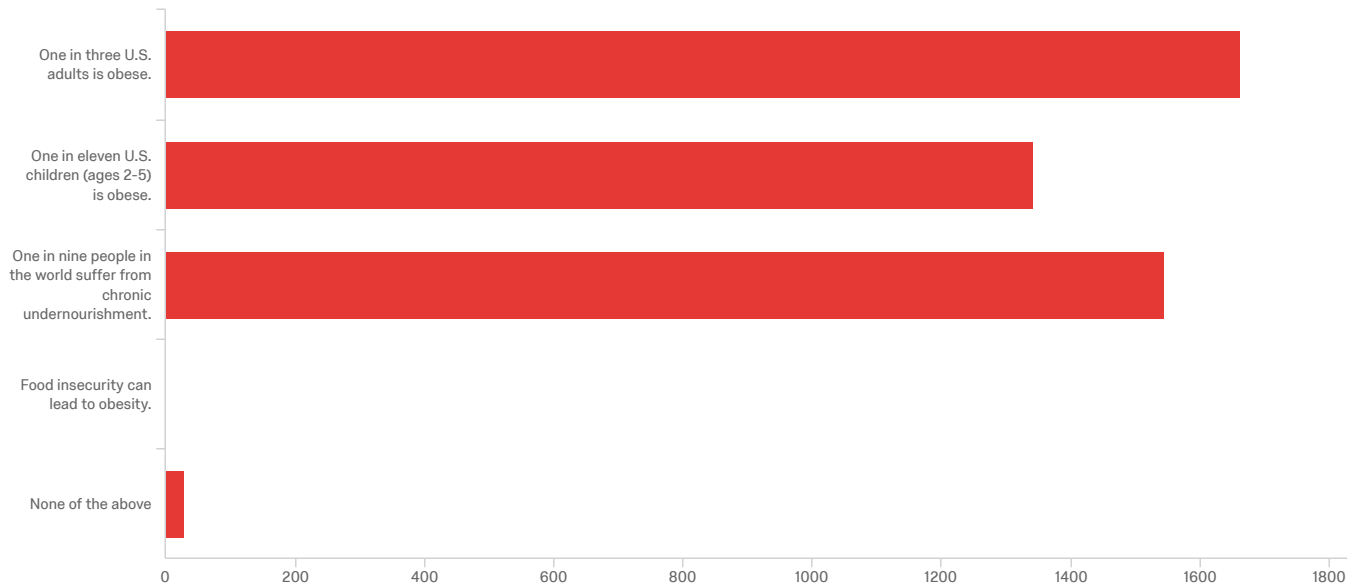

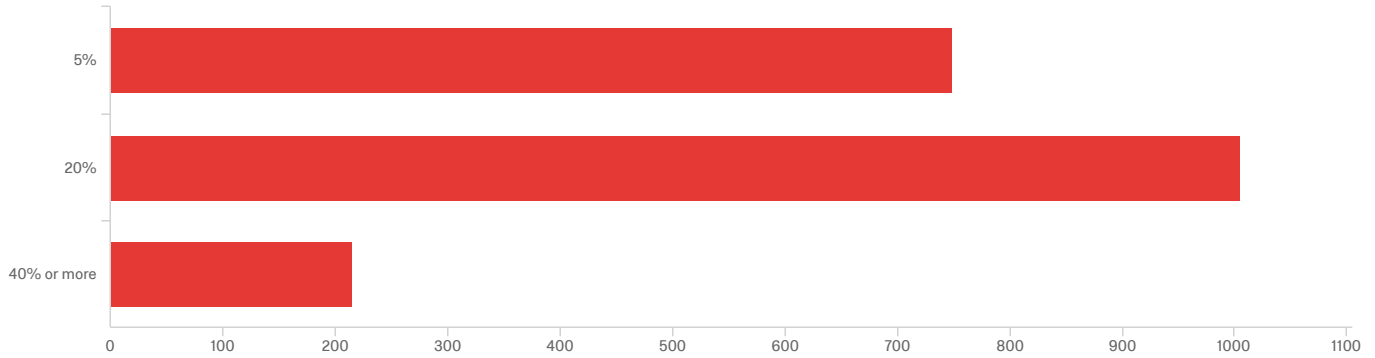

QID26 - About what percent of students at Appalachian State University have struggled with food insecurity (not knowing where their next meal is coming from) in the past year?

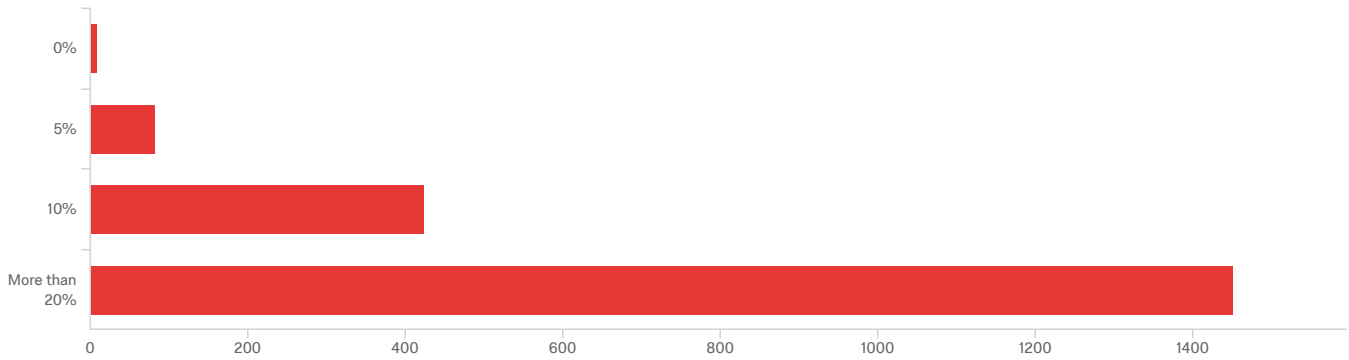

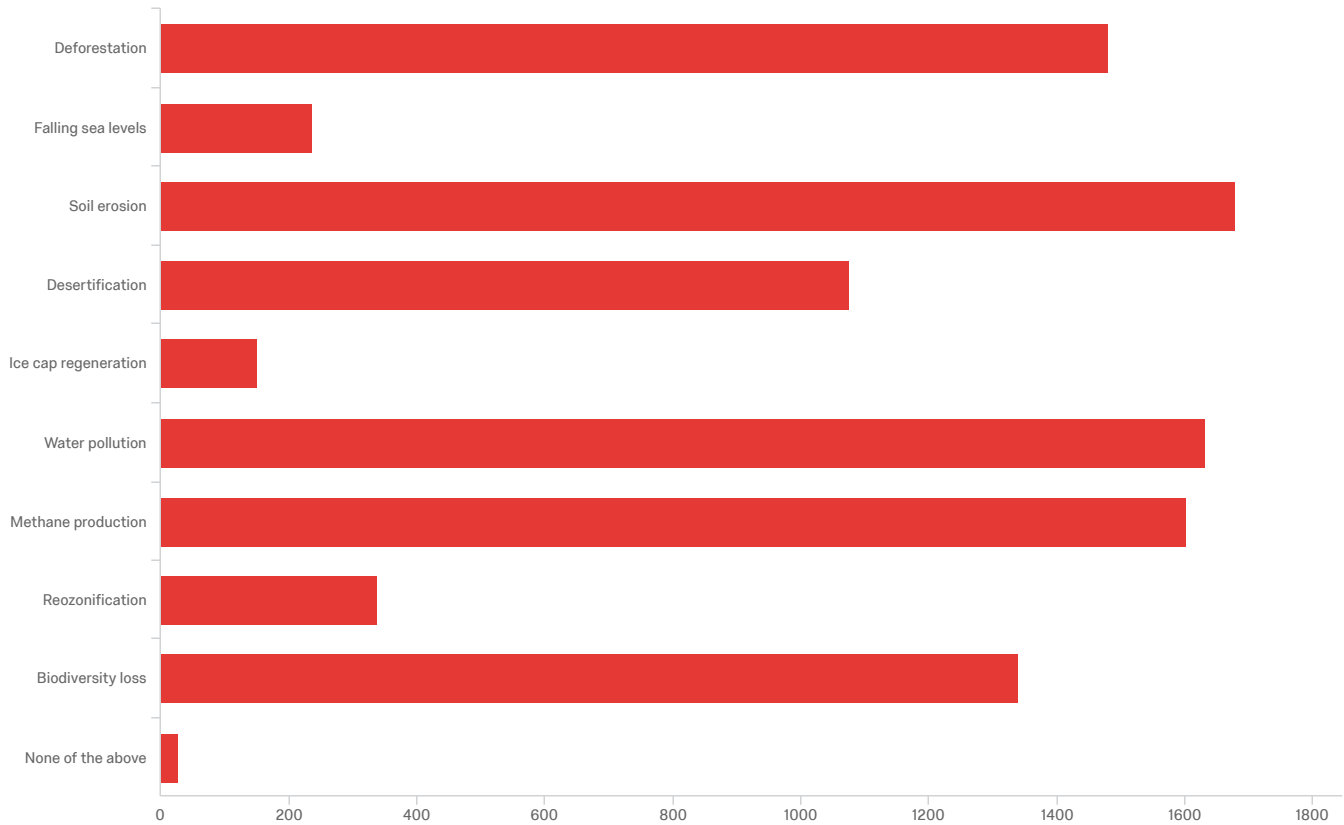

QID17 - What is the most common cause of pollution of streams and rivers in the United States?



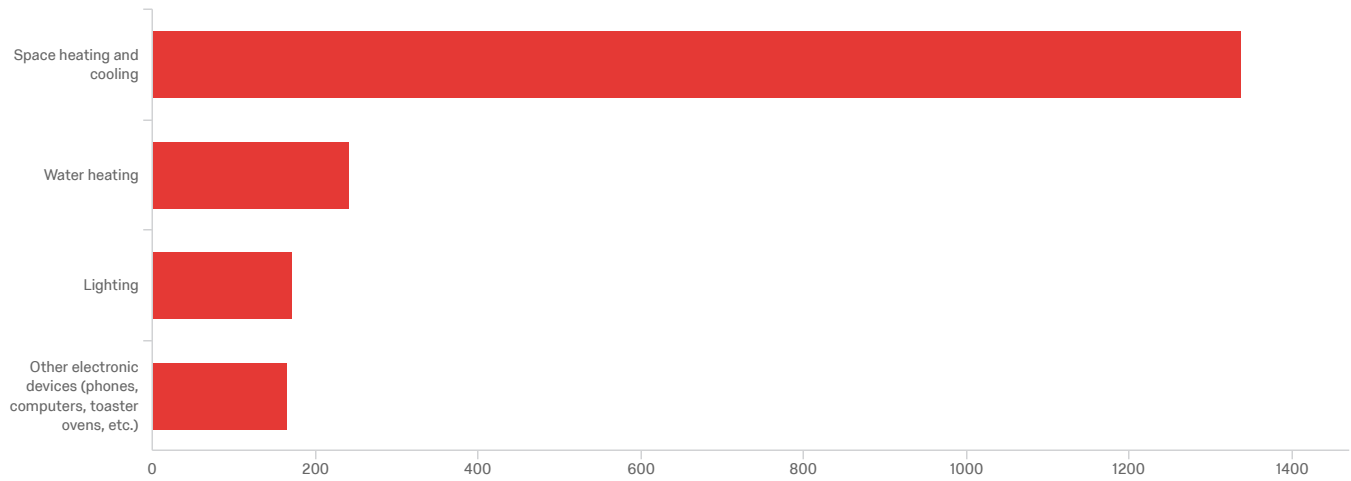

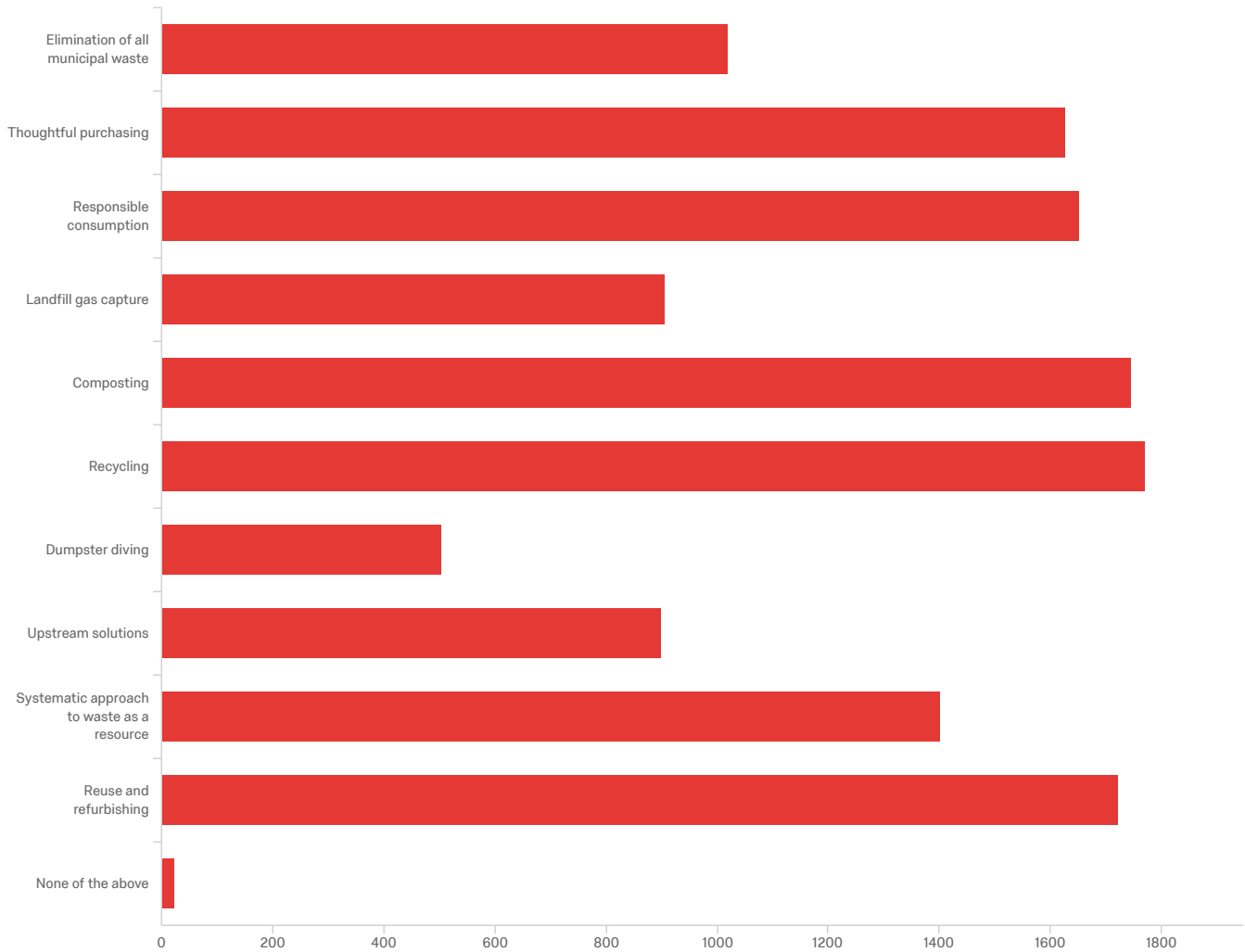

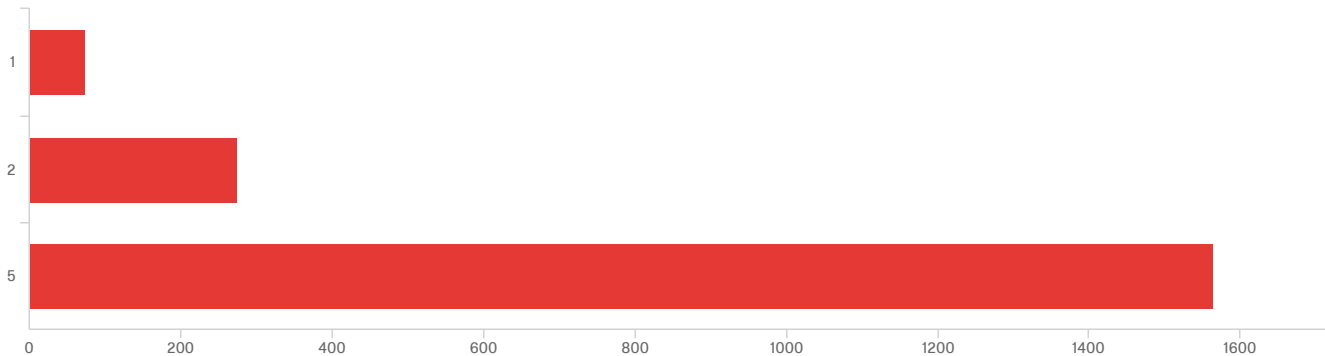
