Tabling Activities for Stormwater Pollution Awareness:

- Button making - visitors were able to choose from two different designs (pictured below) by using a manual button making press.



- Game – “Trash That Lasts” was a game played in which the visitors had to match the number of years certain debris takes to breakdown in the environment. Winners are awarded free admission tickets to the Imaginarium Science Center in Fort Myers.
 - Five trash debris examples used in game
 - Paper Products (2-6 weeks)
 - Cigarette Filters (1-5 years)
 - Aluminum Cans (80-100 years)
 - Plastic Bottles (~450 years)
 - Fishing Line (~600 years)
- Sign-up sheets were placed on the table for students to be able to participate in future outreach activities for service learning and/or volunteer hours (14 students + 4 students that helped during event signed up).
 - Future outreach activities
 - Storm drain stenciling/artwork
 - Storm drain clean-up events
 - Tabling at various events to educate the public
- A dry erase board was placed on the table for visitors to write down any areas of pollution concerns around campus (i.e. littering, dumping).
- Stormwater pollution prevention brochures, created by EH&S, and business cards we placed on the table and several were taken.
- There were four undergraduate students that assisted with the event (Austin, Chyenne Rosas, Kelsey Orr, and Breanna).
- Approximately 120 people stopped at our table to talk about stormwater pollution during the course of the event.
