Bryant University Sustainability Culture Survey Report

Introduction

This document outlines the findings from Bryant's survey on sustainability views and practices that was distributed to staff, faculty, and students in December 2021 and January 2022. The survey results are intended to provide content for Bryant's EN 6 STARS credit as well as gain more insight into how Bryant can better engage its community in sustainability.

Purpose: To summarize key takeaways from the Sustainability Culture Survey administered by Bryant University with the intention of providing content for the results field of the EN 6 STARS credit.

Survey takeaways:

- Sustainability priority: 86% of respondents chose waste minimization as one of the top three topics Bryant should focus on going forward. The next most frequently chosen topics were sustainable food and minimize greenhouse gas emissions, and both had less than 50% of respondents' support. This indicates that waste minimization initiatives are the most likely to get community buy-in.
- Behavior: Close to 50% of participants chose "always" for each waste reduction behavior listed, and answers below "often" were chosen less than 21% of the time for each behavior. This indicates that the Bryant community prioritizes waste minimization in their actions.
- 3. Engagement: About half of respondents selected "no" or "unsure" when asked if they had attended a sustainability event, and when asked why, the majority of participants marked "unsure." This indicates that Bryant would benefit not only from increasing the number and accessibility of sustainability events, but also from focusing on communication strategies to increase knowledge and participation.

Methodology

The survey was drafted by Andrew DeMelia, reviewed by GreenerU and Bryant's staff, combined with another survey, and then distributed to Bryant staff, faculty, and students. First, the survey was sent to first year students as part of the Gateway Program, a requirement for all incoming first year students. The rest of the student population and faculty and staff were surveyed in December 2021 and January 2022.

The survey was created to fulfill Bryant's EN 6 STARS credit requirements for its 2022 STARS submission. The survey aimed to understand the Bryant communities behaviors, beliefs, and engagement in relation to sustainability. It is worth noting that this survey was combined with another survey and distributed through an institution-wide email. Additionally, Instagram was used to remind students to take the survey.

Survey results

This survey aimed to understand awareness of sustainability on campus and the level of importance the community places on the university's sustainability efforts. When the survey closed, 113 students, 41 staff and 14 faculty members had responded.

Main takeaways from the survey results in each category:

- Behavior
 - Volunteering and partnering (Q7): 53% of respondents occasionally volunteer or partner with a community organization.
 - Waste minimization (Q8): About 50% of respondents answered "always" when asked if they engage in common waste reduction activities (recycling, reuse, and energy saving).
 - **Dietary choices:** 50% of respondents rarely or never choose to eat a vegetarian or plant-based meal when it is available. 21% of respondents sometimes choose a vegetarian or plant-based meal.

- Belief:

- **Perception of climate change (Q6a):** 70.2% of respondents strongly agreed with the statement "Climate change is a significant risk to mankind in the next 50 years" proposed.
- **Importance of sustainability (Q6b):** 59% of respondents strongly agreed that climate change is important to them individually. Notably, this level of agreement dropped to 56% when asked if climate change is important to their community at large.
- **Sustainability at Bryant (Q10):** When asked to react to the statement "It is important to me that Bryant operates sustainably, in ways such as reducing waste, minimizing

greenhouse gas emissions, and providing sustainability programs," 63.6% of faculty/staff and 68.1% of students strongly agreed.

- Sustainability at Bryant (Q11): When asked to react to the statement "Bryant's commitment to sustainability factors into my decision to work at Bryant." 27% of respondents strongly agreed or agreed and 73% of respondents disagreed or strongly disagreed with this statement. Faculty and staff were also asked if they feel they can be sustainable working at Bryant, which 80% of respondents reacted in agreement to.
- Sustainability at Bryant (Q12): When asked to react to the statement "Bryant's commitment to sustainability factored into my decision to attend Bryant," 19% of students strongly agreed or agreed. 54% of students agreed that they can be sustainable while attending Bryant in contrast to the 80% of faculty and staff that agreed to a similar statement.

Engagement:

- Sustainability Activity (Q13): 42.9% of faculty, 48.8% of staff, and 32.7% of students have attended at least one sustainability activity for the whole community. Notably, 21.4% of faculty, 12.2% of staff, and 37.2% of students were unsure whether they attended one.
- Sustainability Community Events (Q14): 60% of faculty, 37.5% of staff, and 67.6% of students highlighted unawareness as their reasoning for not attending community sustainability events.






How often do you spend time during the academic year partnering/volunteering with community organizations to support local social, environmental, or economic solutions?




Frequency of Waste Reduction Behavior

Frequency of choosing a vegetarian or plant-based meal













Student statements: sustainability at Bryant




