Sustainability Fellow

The Sustainability Office at Skidmore College seeks a full-time Sustainability Fellow. The Fellow position is a two-year, renewable appointment. The Fellow reports to the Sustainability Coordinator and works closely with the Coordinator for the Environmental Studies Program, faculty and staff in Student Affairs and Academic Affairs, managers within Facilities Services and Financial Services, Skidmore's Campus Sustainability Subcommittee, the student Sustainability Rep program, the North Woods Stewards, the Office of Student Diversity Programs, the student Environmental Action Club, and other programs and constituencies on and off campus.

The Sustainability Fellow will assist in recruiting and managing student staff in the North Woods Stewards Program, Sustainability Representatives, composting, bike share, garden, and other programs. He/she will create and carry out various educational events and programs related to sustainability, including annual campus-wide events such as Skidmore Unplugged, The Big Green Scream, and Earth Week. The Fellow will also assist in managing internal and external communications for the Skidmore Sustainability Office, aid in sustainability assessment which includes collecting data for a greenhouse gas inventory, and assist the Campus Sustainability Subcommittee in a variety of ways. The Fellow will have an excellent opportunity to make an impact both on the ongoing operations of the College and on the development of future leaders.

Skidmore College is especially interested in candidates who can contribute to the diversity and excellence of our academic community through their work, and we encourage applications from under-represented groups as well as individuals who have experience with diverse populations to apply.

BA or BS, strong written and verbal skills, a creative approach to problem solving, and comfort in working with students, faculty, and staff from across the College. The successful candidate should have skills in designing and facilitating programs, projects, and events related to sustainability, and experience with land stewardship is desirable.
