2014 Sustainability Course Inventory

As part of the Sustainability Tracking, Assessment, and Ratings System (STARS), through the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE), Wartburg College completed a sustainability course inventory in January 2014. Following are the findings.

Course connection to sustainability was evaluated using the Wartburg College definition of Sustainability: *The responsible utilization of resources (natural, manufactured and economic) in a fashion that minimizes as much as possible the impacts on the environment and socio-economic parameters. This pattern of use will allow the availability of limited resources for future generations as well as help promote healthier socio-economic conditions.*

Sustainability-Focused Courses

The courses concentrate on the concept of sustainability, including its social, economic, and environmental dimensions, or examine an issue or topic using sustainability as a lens.
