

Project Wingspan Program 2019-2022 Monarch & Other Native Pollinator Habitat Management Agreement

Project Wingspan seeks to increase monarch and imperiled pollinator habitat by engaging public land managers and private land stewards throughout the Midwest and Great Lakes landscape through a series of habitat enhancement activities. Habitat management enhancements include: seeding/planting native milkweed and forage plants, installing windbreaks or native plant hedgerows, invasive species control (weed removal, treatment of woody plant encroachment, etc.), conducting prescribed burns, adopting a limited mowing schedule outside of monarch migration periods (for roadsides and ROWs limited to 1 to 2 times per year), and/or adopting an integrated vegetation management (IVM) program. We recognize that not every management area will practice all actions described above and is dependent on land-use sector.

While we realize public and private lands are managed for multiple species, to ensure that monarch and other native pollinator habitat activities take place on lands that have a landowner or manager committed to pollinator conservation, including long-term habitat management and maintenance, it is requested that landowners and/or land managers sign this agreement for each site recognized as an active participant in this comprehensive survey of viable habitat and potential recipient of seed or plug awards generated by the project. The habitat acres secured through these letters of commitment will help to ensure long-term pollinator habitat conservation efforts across the Midwest and Great Lakes region.
