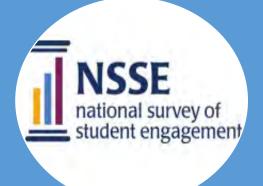

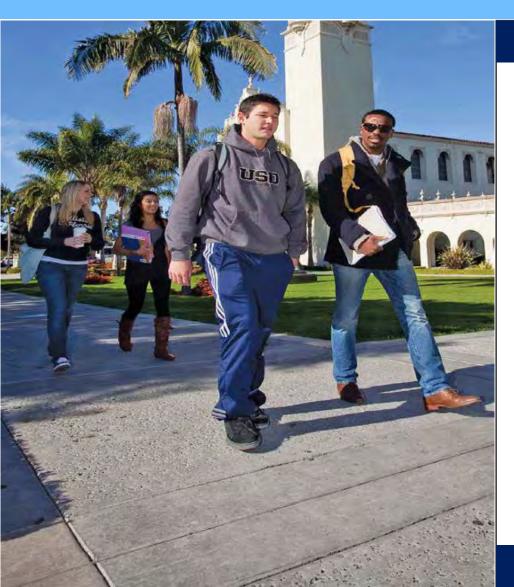

- Engagement with historical and contemporary issues of diversity, equity, and inclusion are educational objectives that can be productively incorporated into programs at any level.
- Seeking and valuing multiple dimensions of diversity within its various constituencies strengthens an institution's effectiveness."

The Center for Inclusion and Diversity (CID)

cultivates shared vision, coherence, and coordination of diversity and inclusion efforts across campus. The University of San Diego holds deep commitment to developing and sustaining a diverse campus community in the broadest sense, including differences in gender, race, ethnicity, generational history, culture, socioeconomic class, religion, sexual orientation, national origin, citizenship status, political perspectives, geographic origin, and physical ability.

The assessment plan for CID has six outcome areas: student diversity, student success, employee diversity, campus environment, curricular and co-curricular experiences, and community engagement. In the 2017-2018 academic year, we began identifying key performance indicators (KPIs) to track our success in these outcome areas. Data collected from the Campus Environment Surveys will help inform the work of CID.

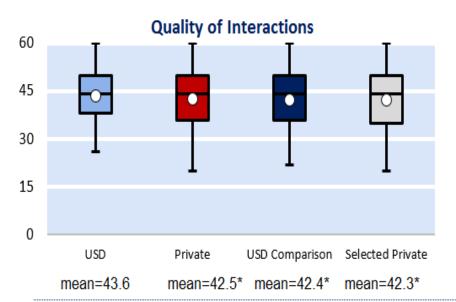


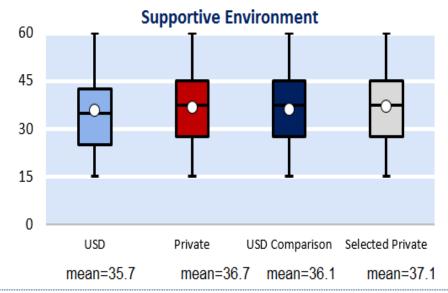

USD first year students compared with other institutions.



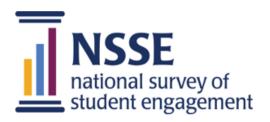

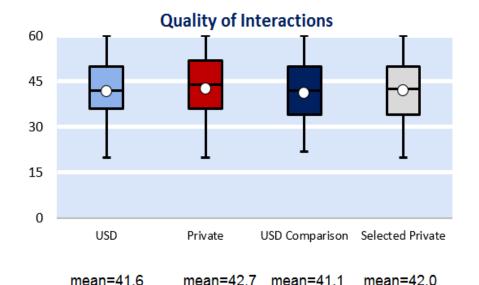

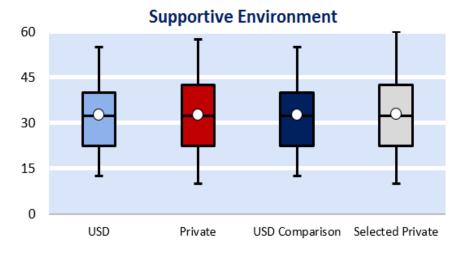

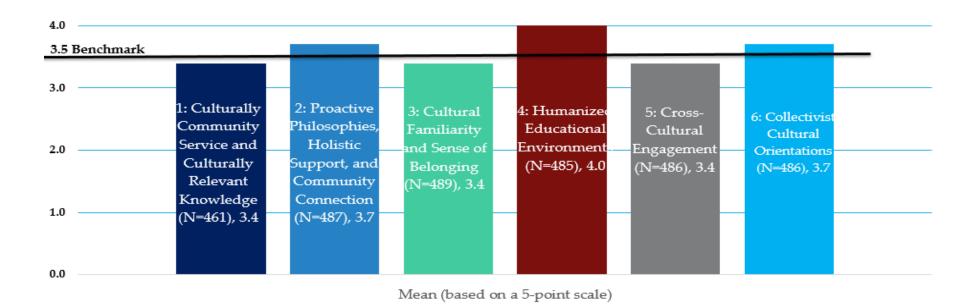

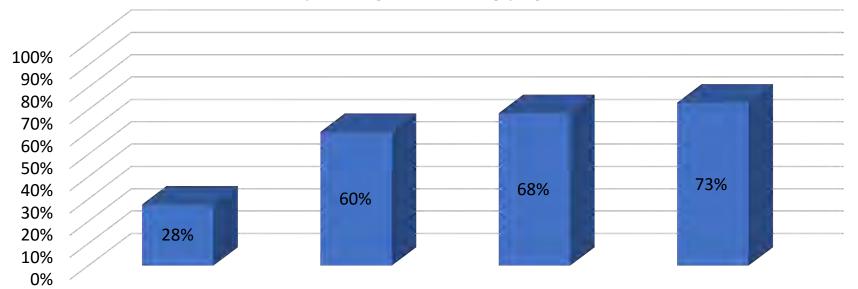

In this academic year, questions about diversity in the classroom were included on my course evaluations. (n=159)

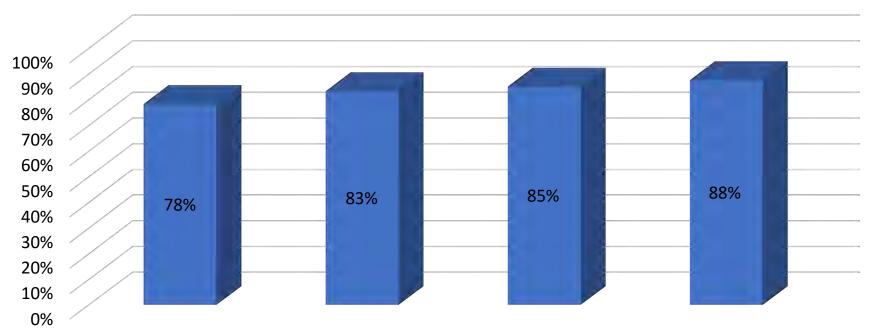
My courses include service-learning or community engagement projects that are relevant to students' communities. (n=150)

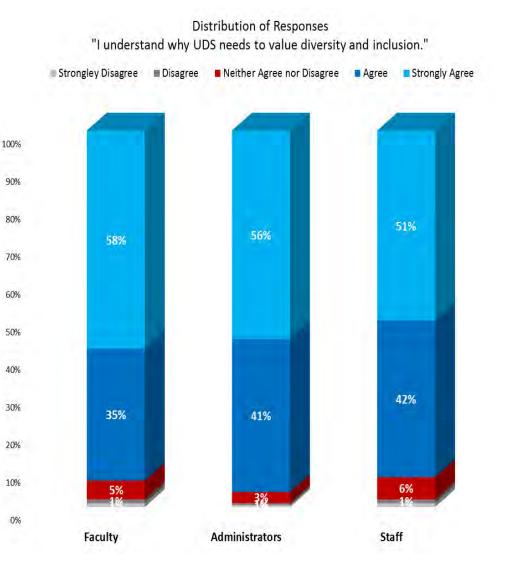

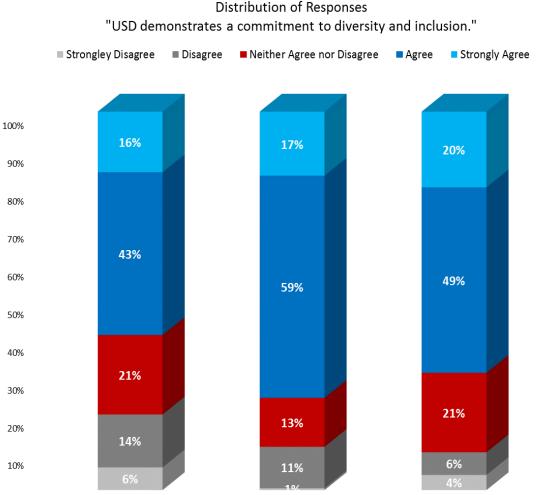
