Dear STARS Steering Committee:

We at the University of San Diego are pleased to submit for our third STARS rating. STARS has proven to be an influential tool to help us move toward becoming a more sustainable campus, and we have used the credit criteria to help construct our sustainability strategies. The university's Catholic identity, with its foundation in Catholic Social Thought and an emphasis on producing students who are global citizens, coupled with the STARS criteria, provide new opportunities to explore the social, economic, environmental, and moral aspects of sustainability.

USD demonstrates care for all creation through our teaching, scholarship, campus culture, and community partnerships. The concept of "Care for Our Common Home" elucidated by Pope Francis in his encyclical "Laudato si'," expresses the tenets of sustainability through the lens of the Catholic faith. To emphasize the importance of sustainability to USD, "Care for Our Common Home" was adopted at the University of San Diego as one of our six pathways to accomplish our vision to set "the standard for an engaged, contemporary Catholic university where innovative changemakers confront humanity's urgent challenges."
