


### 1. How do you usually commute to work?





## 2. Which of the following would make you more likely to try an alternative way of commuting?

358 Responses (NOTE: Question was select all that apply)




# 3. If you were provided with additional resources on alternative ways of commuting, would you be more likely to try a new way to commute?








### 4. What time do you usually arrive and leave work?
