

### Reuse and Recycling of C&D

Construction and demolition materials are heavy and can add up to high costs. At the transfer station you will spend up to \$150 per ton of garbage.

Alternatively, reuse, recycling and composting of construction and demolition material (wood, metals, masonry, concrete, etc.) saves money and supports local businesses. In fact, you can get paid for many of the materials you recycle.

### Tips for Recycling on the Job

- ✓ Before job start identify materials that can be re-used and recycled.
- ✓ Set up bins and dumpsters for collecting separate materials. Clearly label each bin with the names of the materials to be recycled.
- ✓ Hold a meeting with all workers prior to job start to educate them on the recycling process.
- ✓ Monitor recycling throughout the job. If you see recycling in the trash dumpsters, notify workers.
- ✓ Call Morgan King at 826-5889 if you have questions about what can or cannot be recycled.

### Save 35-50% on Disposal Fees!

Rather than demolishing, “deconstruct” by dismantling components and separating them for reuse or recycling.

Separating various materials to recycle at a deconstruction site reduces your disposal costs and supports the local economy. Plan ahead to reuse and recycle by using the C&D Reuse and Recycling Guide on the back.
