Info you need

Humboldt States encourages you to practice healthy and sustainable living habits while residing on campus. Choosing a greener lifestyle helps decrease your environmental impact while connecting you to your peers, to sustainably themed courses and to student organizations

Take Back the Tap: Single-use, disposable water bottles are no longer sold at HSU. Bring your own container to fill up at one of the many bottle filling stations across campus.

Kill the Cup: Single-use, disposable cups are highly discouraged at HSU.

Prompted by a student campaign called Kill the Cup, Dining Services now has a new incentive system to promote reusable cups for coffee and discourage consumption of disposable cups.

OZZI: Request reusable dining ware instead of taking single-use products.

When you visit any HSU eatery or market, use the token you were gifted at move-in to get a reusable food container rather than taking and throwing away single-use products. (If you lose your token, you'll have to buy in to the program for \$5.)

Rinse and return the container when you're finished, receive the token in exchange, and repeat.

CCAT: Founded in 1978, the Campus Center for Appropriate Technologies (CCAT) is a student-run demonstration home that offers workshops and tips for sustainable living.

Energy Independence Fund (HEIF) is created from student fees each semester. Each student pays just over \$13, which is used to implement energy and sustainability projects on campus. Projects are proposed and developed by students.

WRRAP: The Waste Reduction and Resource Awareness Program (WRRAP) encourages alternative perspectives on resource consumption and provides a means for landfill substitution at HSU.

Transportation

Bicycle Learning Center: Get help repairing and maintaining your bike, or borrow tools at the Bicycle Learning Center.

Homeward Bound Program (Charter Bus):

Discounted round-trip transportation from Arcata directly to San Francisco or Los Angeles during Fall, Winter, and Spring Breaks. Charter buses are for HSU students only.

Reduce

Lessen waste generation

Reuse

Further use products in their existing form for their original or similar purpose

Reprocess waste materials to produce new products

Recover

Extract materials or energy from waste for further use or processing, including, but not limited to making materials into compost

Ireat

Process the waste to change its volume or character so it can be disposed of with no, or reduced, adverse environmental impact

COMPOST

Food scraps, coffee grounds, tea bags, uncoated paper plates and napkins. Pizza boxes at HSU should also be composted!!!

► REUSE OFFICE SUPPLY EXCHANGE (ROSE)

Free office supplies @ the Warren House, run by the students of WRRAP. Open Monday-Friday, 8am-5pm.

CAMPUS WALL (New for Fall 2019!)

Buy, trade, or sell items via a secure website specific to only HSU stakeholders. (It's like an HSU-specific Craigslist!) humboldt.mycampuswall.com

MIXED RECYCLING

Paper, cardboard, bottles, cans, plastics #1-5, metals.

▶ OTHER REQUIRED RECYCLING

Batteries, CFL's, CD's, printer cartridges, electronics — use only special receptacles located at BSS, UC, Library and CC Mailroom

LANDFILL WASTE

Anything you can't donate, compost or recycle.

In 2018 HSU landfilled 900,000 pounds of trash.
