Denison University continues to make significant strides in addressing campus sustainability and we appreciate the value that the STARS tool brings to our efforts. Since our last STARS submission in 2016, we brought a 2.3 MW solar array online and have spent extensive time evaluating campus climate and the myriad of issues and challenges our students and faculty face on campus and beyond.

Our current strategic plan puts renewed emphasis on our sustainability efforts by focusing the college on building stronger relationships with the surrounding community and developing programs that address civic education, wellness, and diversity.

Our Campus Sustainability Plan continues to move us systematically towards our carbon neutral goal of 2030, while at the same time, laying out a pathway for expanding sustainability within the curriculum, creating more co-curricular opportunities for our students – including the development of sustainability-related internships and pushing for responsibly-sourced foods in our dining facilities.
