To Whom It May Concern:

I affirm that the Binghamton Move-Out Project is an innovative sustainability measure undertaken to reduce waste when students leave the Binghamton University Campus.

The project is innovative in three ways. First, it focuses on off-campus housing. Second, rather than have drop-off locations as most off-campus reuse programs do, the Move-Out Project picks up clothes, furniture, books and other reusable items yielding a much greater amount of material. Finally, the project was started by students, adopted as a town-gown partnership by the local chapter of the Sierra Club, and embraced by the university, which provides sorting and storage space. In this way, the student-university-community partnership has increased the long-term sustainability of the program.
