What is AG*IDEA

The Agricultural Education Division of AG*IDEA is a consortium of universities sharing courses in agriculture education, extension education, agricultural communications, and agricultural leadership. The College of Charleston joined the consortium to provide its students with access to the top professors in the field.

How does AG*IDEA work?

Students enrolled in AG*IDEA courses have a home academic institution, which will be College of Charleston. The member institution - College of Charleston - will award the degree, not the AG*IDEA. While the courses offered through the AG*IDEA may come from any of the participating institutions, students will always be enrolled through College of Charleston.

Every semester, each consortium member identifies a few courses they are willing to share with the other academic institutions. A full list of courses is developed. Students in degree-seeking programs may enroll in the courses. Students enrolled in the Sustainable Food Systems for-credit program will enroll in the classes using the course catalogue designation PRST 360. This allows the credits to transfer seamlessly to the College of Charleston.

It's important to note that each member of the consortium operates on its own semester calendar. Thus, some courses may start a few weeks earlier or later than the College of Charleston.
