The Ohio State University at Marion in partnership with the Marion County Recycling and Litter Prevention Program coordinated their largest volunteer effort for Earth Day on April 22, 2013. To kick off the event community dignitaries gathered in front of a crowd of faculty, staff, students, and community guests to celebrate and honor the efforts of the Marion campus receiving the Green Buckeye Certification. The Green Buckeye Certification aims at recognizing offices, departments, and faculty who incorporate sustainability into their daily actions. Aparna Dial, Director, The Ohio State University, Office of Energy Services and Sustainability presented the award to Ohio State Marion senior administrative staff. The Ohio State University at Marion is the only Ohio State regional campus to date to have received this award.
