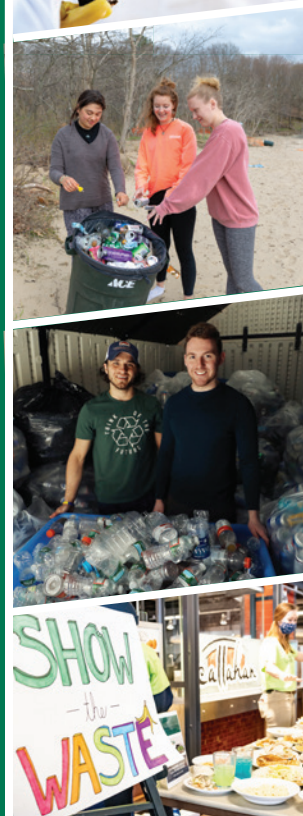

Healthy Options

Energize!

Lights

Endicott is working towards a high level of energy efficiency. You can help us achieve this goal by turning off lights and electronic devices when they are not in use. Additionally, using LED or high-efficiency light bulbs in your lamps can reduce energy consumption

Solar Cover

Park under cover in one of New England's largest solar parking canopies in Lot 25, or in the campus parking garage—both are great places to store your vehicle away from the sun and snow! Our Raymond J. Bourque Arena is also powered by solar, located on the roof of the building.

Recycle!

Over 50% of Endicott's waste is either recycled, composted, or donated. Our commitment to waste diversion resulted in Endicott placing in the top 40% of schools for waste diversion, and top 10% of schools for composting during the annual nationwide Campus Race to Zero Waste competition.

Where does it go?

Single Stream Containers

Clean paper, glass, metal, and plastic are placed into the blue single stream recycling containers and blue dumpsters, which are for recycling only.

Waste

Black/gray bins and gray dumpsters are designated for trash, which is transported to a local waste-to-energy facility.

Specialty Recycling

Endicott also offers several specialty recycling streams, such as plastic film, disposable masks, electronic waste, and textiles. These items are not recyclable in single stream containers—find designated locations by visiting our EcoMap!

Compost

Food waste from all campus eateries is composted, at approximately three tons per week. This compost is transported to an anaerobic digester, which converts emissions from the food waste into energy and also produces fertilizer!

Reducing Emissions

Endicott is a walking campus. It only takes ten minutes to get from one side of campus to the other. Bike racks are available throughout campus, at most residence halls, and at all academic buildings.



Zipcar is a shared vehicle program, offered at a discount for the Endicott community. Sign up at zipcar.com/endicott.

Shuttle

Endicott provides transportation, via a shuttle, to the mall and downtown Beverly. An MBTA station that can take you into Boston and beyond is easily accessible from downtown Beverly.

Go Electric

Physical Plant and Public Safety do their part to reduce emissions by driving electric golf carts around campus. Six EV charging stations are located around the parking garage and provide clean power to campus users with electric vehicles.
