PASCEP0303 - Living off the Land: Urban Farming: Growing Healthy

Offered through: Pan-African Studies Community Education Program (PASCEP)

This course will introduce you to techniques to create urban farms and grow your own organic food. Learn about the detriments of GMO's and the benefits of making and using compost to produce nutritious fruits and vegetables.

Aquaponics 101*

What is aquaponics? It's taking hydroponics (soilless farming) and adding in aquaculture (fish farming) to create a mutually beneficial cycle. Growing fish and plants together in a closed cycle creates a system that is organic and potentially self-replenishing for year round farming. Upon completion, you will have the knowledge to create your own aquaponics system and an understanding of the personal and social benefits of systems like this.

Rain Ready Workshop

Beautify your home with a rain garden or blossoming stormwater planter. Learn how you can create a rich plant basin to collect and filter storm-water runoff.

PASCEP0210 - Building Community: Building Promise
