








# Our SF State Organizational Structure


### Caring, by Aristides Demetrios

What can I do in the office to support our campus sustainability efforts?

- Don't print when possible. Print double-sided when needed  $\bullet$
- In general, don't waste paper or valuable resources (share if possible)  $\bullet$
- Conserve water: report leaking sinks or running toilets to Facilities •
- Place your food waste in the right place; sort it properly, reuse a mug, bring in your own utensils and • reusable food storage containers
- Turn off lights, heaters, fans, equipment, electrical off when you leave the office; save energy! •
- Close windows when you leave the office; it'll be warmer in the morning if heat doesn't escape  $\bullet$
- When possible, commute to campus via public transit or carpool  $\bullet$
- Participate in sustainability efforts
- Share your love of sustainability with your colleagues, our students, your family  $\bullet$

# **Outreach Services:**

Human Resources: The Office of Human Resources serves as the central office for coordinating all employment-related matters for the University. From recruitment to retirement and everything in between, HR impacts the personal and professional lives of faculty and staff in meaningful and significant ways. HR offers a range of services that support faculty and staff. These services also extend beyond the workplace with programs such as the Employee Assistance Program.

Faculty Affairs & Professional Development: The Office of Faculty Affairs & Professional Development is the primary resource on campus for matters related to the professional life and development of faculty. The team in Faculty Affairs is prepared to serve as a first-stop resource for questions ranging from day-to-day employment processes to more complex personnel issues.

Labor Unions: Most University employees are affiliated with one of the labor unions on campus and their employment is governed by a related collective bargaining agreement. Unions offer a range of resources to our employees.

Bias Incident Education Team: SF State fiercely believes in the value of education. Learning is at the core of all we do. With that, we want to reintroduce our community of the Bias Incident Education Team (BIET). This team is an important part of campus climate work at SF State, and they work tirelessly for every Gator to have a safe learning, living, and working environment. BIET's role is educational. Their goal is to provide educational awareness and assist campus community members with strategies that empower them to address bias incidents they encounter observe.

University Ombuds: The University Ombuds is an advocate for procedural fairness who supports the integrity of the campus policies and procedures and ensures the equity of their application. The Ombuds provides a neutral, confidential, and informal place to discuss a concern with the assurance that no action will be taken, nor will the visit be disclosed to anyone, without consent. The office is open to all members of the SF State community.

Title IX Reporting: SF State is committed to maintaining an inclusive and equitable community that values diversity and fosters mutual respect. All students and all employees have the right to participate fully in CSU programs, activities, and employment free from discrimination, harassment, sexual misconduct, sexual exploitation, dating violence, domestic violence, stalking, and retaliation. Are from all walks of life, all places, all ethnicities, all socioeconomic backgrounds, and are all pursuing their futures together








