As a charter participant in the Sustainability, Tracking, Assessment & Rating System (STARS), the University of Louisville is proud to resubmit more recent data for an updated rating. We remain excited about our collaborations with other AASHE member institutions to lead the sustainability transformation in higher education.

UofL continues to use the STARS framework as our primary tool for monitoring university-wide progress on sustainability for several reasons:

1. It is the only system of its kind that involves publicly reporting comprehensive information about a college or university's sustainability performance in all three areas that matter most: education & research, operations, and planning, administration & engagement;
2. The criteria that determine a STARS rating are transparent and accessible to anyone, yet flexible enough to fit the special circumstances of any institution; and
3. The STARS system of earned credits allows us to not only monitor our own progress over time and to plan strategically, but to compare our sustainability performance with similar institutions throughout North America.

Participation in STARS has helped keep UofL accountable for making continual progress on our commitment to sustainability, as reflected in our Strategic Plan. After a considerable amount of internal investigation, data-gathering, and analysis over the last year, the University of Louisville is delighted to submit our fourth STARS report in support of our increasingly strong rating.
