The incumbent will also be responsible for coordination and tracking of data related to the program; provide workshops and individual support to faculty seeking to integrate sustainability into course curriculum as well as provide outreach and guidance to academic programs, administrative units and Associated Students on integrating initiatives designed to fulfill the shared strategic commitment on sustainability.

Requires

A Master's degree, two years minimum experience working on sustainability issues in higher education. The ideal candidate must possess strong interpersonal skills and the ability to work with teams; strong oral and written communication skills; strong project management skills with experience coordinating, organizing and implement programs and events. Experience in resource conservation and sustainability practices. Experience in training, education outreach, and organizational change. Demonstrated ability to communicate effectively with diverse student, faculty, staff and community is essential.
