As President of the University of Texas Rio Grande Valley (UTRGV), I take pride affirming the accuracy of the information gathered for our sustainability self-assessment using the Sustainability Tracking, Assessment & Rating System (STARS).

UTRGV is the first major public university to be established in Texas in the 21st century. It was created by the Texas Legislature in 2013 and enrolled its first class in the fall of 2015. Since the establishment of our new university, UTRGV has committed to institutionalizing sustainability across all divisions of the university. We have made significant progress incorporating sustainability in everything we do as shown by our silver AASHE STARS rating in 2015 and being designated as a Center for Sustainability Across the Curriculum in 2016.

Since then, UTRGV has been recognized by CollegeNET as being among the top schools for social mobility offering economic advancement for low-income and minority students. We currently offer the third lowest tuition of all public universities in the state of Texas. These accomplishments derive from our university's commitment to sustainable development as expressed in our Mission and Strategic Plan. Through this established foundation, UTRGV is empowering students and the public through initiatives to connect them with sustainable concepts to improve our region and our world.

As we begin a new chapter in higher education in the Rio Grande Valley, I look forward to the significant and positive impact our institution will have on our community and throughout the country. I strongly believe UTRGV will achieve all that is needed to steward the environment, protect the health and safety of our people, and operate ethically and responsibly within the communities we serve.
