Dawson College is the largest College in the CEGEP network of Quebec and prides itself as a leader in sustainability. After receiving feedback from over 1000 staff and students in 2015 for the development of the next strategic plan, it was clear that sustainability was still a major topic on the community's mind. This was translated into bold statements within the revised College mission, vision and strategic plan.
