Face-to-Face (F2F)

Online

Payroll Compliance Practitioner

A career in payroll is very rewarding. Becoming a certified Payroll Compliance Practitioner (PCP) ensures you have the payroll compliance knowledge and skills you need to succeed! It also helps you command a higher starting salary according to national payroll recruiting firms and opens the doors for future advancement. St. Lawrence College is now offering the certification requirement courses:

Payroll Compliance Legislation

This is the first payroll course of the PCP program and a prerequisite to enrolling in Payroll Fundamentals 1 and Payroll Fundamentals 2. Upon completion of PCL, the student will have a thorough understanding of legislative compliance requirements and will be able to: describe payroll's objectives and stakeholders; identify an employee-employer relationship; communicate the payroll compliance requirements to various stakeholders; apply federal and provincial/territorial legislation, including the Canada Pension Plan Act, the Employment Insurance Act, the Income Tax Act, Employment Standards, Worker's Compensation Acts, and the Quebec-specific legislation. Available Spring 2019.

Pavroll Fundamentals 1

This is the second payroll course of the PCP program. Students must successfully complete the Payroll Compliance Legislation course prior to enrolling in this course. Upon completion of Payroll Fundamentals 1 (PF1), the student will be able to: calculate regular pay; calculate non-regular pay; calculate termination payments; complete a Record of Employment (ROE); and communicate all aspects of pay requirements to various stakeholders. Prerequisite: Payroll Compliance Legislation. Available Winter 2019.

Payroll Fundamentals 2

This course is the final payroll course of the PCP program. Upon completion of PF2, the student will be able to: calculate organizational remittances to federal, provincial and third-party stakeholders; prepare accounting documentation for payroll; complete year end documentation; and communicate all aspects of organizational remittances, accounting and year end requirements to internal, external and government stakeholders. Prerequisites: Payroll Fundamentals 1. We anticipate this course will be available in Fall 2019.

Leadership Development Skills

Aspiring to a supervisory/leadership position? Are you self-employed and looking to enhance your leadership skills? This program builds on existing skills and experience, applying them to workplace situations. Courses include communications, ethics, performance management, change management, team building, planning and project management, finance and team building.

Human Relations

This course will provide leaders with the appropriate skills and knowledge to be able to effectively recruit personnel, train them, and manage their performance in a professional manner. Leaders will use their knowledge of the concepts of statutory and common law to conduct interviews, handle performance problems, counsel and discipline as required, plan and direct training needs assessments, methods and program delivery.

FINANCIAL PLANNING

Investment and Financial Fundamentals Level 2

Take this course as a stand-alone course, or as a deeper continuation of Fundamentals I. Students develop their understanding and knowledge of investments and financial management looking at new and more detailed investment and financial planning analysis and strategies. This course is for students who either want to learn more about managing their own investments or plan on a career in financial services, and/or may plan on taking the Canadian Securities Course.

Secrets to Buying, Managing and Renovating Rental Property 1

This introductory workshop lets you in on some rental property secrets including how to avoid money pits, picking good tenants, good property locations, maintenance and repairs. Take your first steps in the direction of financial freedom with an instructor who purchased some of his real estate properties in 1990 (real estate high) and semi-retired at the age of 53 with the help of those real estate investment properties. This course is for beginners interested in single family and duplex rental properties. Get your feet wet with this 3-hour workshop to see if this is something you want to pursue. In Part 2 of this workshop series, Mike Collins, your instructor, will guide you on a more in-depth exploration of the secrets to buying, managing and renovating rental property.

Applied Suicide Intervention Skills (ASIST)

ASIST is a two-day skills building workshop that prepares caregivers of all kinds to provide suicide first aid interventions to help persons with thoughts of suicide in ways that increase their safety. Participants will develop the necessary attitudes, knowledge and skills to recognize persons at risk and to undertake appropriate management or referral of a person who is at risk of suicide. Fee includes two days of instruction, workshop materials, comprehensive book, and wallet card. Students will receive a certificate upon successful completion of the workshop.

Craving Change™ helps you improve your diet when you learn the strategies to curb your cravings and manage emotional eating habits. Understand why you eat the way you do. LANGUAGES

American Sign Language 1
