
Quality Assurance

FIE conducts a variety of internal reviews of our program provision in addition to voluntarily participating in reviews by industry colleagues such as the Forum on Education Abroad and Diversity Abroad. We also undergo mandatory external review by the British Accreditation Council and the Quality Assurance Agency to provide further focus our quality assurance efforts. We are committed to achieving the highest standards in our relevant industries including academics, health and safety, and facilities.

British Accreditation Council (BAC)

FIE has been fully accredited by the **BAC**, an independent accreditation body for educational quality, since 2006. The review process examines all aspects of FIE's UK provision including facilities, teaching, learning, management of quality assurance, staffing, and student support. The BAC accreditation review pays particular attention to health and safety standards in all environments, such as classroom, housing, and social spaces.

Quality Assurance Agency (QAA)

The **QAA** provides oversight for all higher education in the UK and FIE undergoes educational oversight monitoring visits by the QAA on an annual to biennial basis. Decisions are based on a thorough review of the quality of academic provision, learning opportunities, and public information. The QAA highlights examples of high-quality internship experiences, writing support for students, clear guidance for faculty, and the establishment of a faculty community.

Forum on Education Abroad

In addition to its UK quality assurances, FIE successfully completed the comprehensive **QUIP review** from the Forum on Education Abroad in 2008, making FIE one of the earliest UK-based international education organizations recognized by the Forum for meeting US Standards of Good Practice for Education Abroad. Most recently, FIE also completed an interim report in 2014.

Tier 4 Sponsor

FIE is recognized by UK Visas and Immigration (UKVI) as a Tier 4 Sponsor. A Tier 4 Sponsor is able to sponsor Tier 4 Student Visas for students from outside of Europe. This status gives FIE the ability to continue offering its academic service and internship programs via independent enrollment and partnership programs.

School of Record

The Accreditation Network UK (ANUK)

The **ANUK/Unipol** National Codes are voluntary schemes aimed at both University-owned accommodation and private residence halls. Members join ANUK to demonstrate commitment to providing students with a good housing service. Membership ensures that our FIEowned residences are accredited and have nationally recognized standards of service and facilities. FIE is the only study abroad provider in the UK to have this accreditation.



Study:

Our menu of available courses includes Arts, Literature and Theatre, Contemporary Britain, Global Business, Global Studies, History and Politics, Humanities and Social Sciences, Media and Communications, and Peace, Conflict, and Social Justice. FIE faculty bring the richness of London directly into the **classroom** via experiential co-curricular activities that are built into every course.

Intern:

Internships and Service Internships are a unique feature of FIE's provision and an element that takes a study abroad experience one step further. They are first and foremost an **academic and** cross-cultural workplace experience. Interning in an international environment is an excellent learning opportunity for students to expand the cross-cultural skills needed in an ever-changing global marketplace. An internship or service internship with FIE allows students to diversify their experience and have a résumé that stands out among their peers when they return to their home country.

Explore:

Foundation House is the heart of FIE London and home to classrooms, faculty, and administrative offices. Foundation House is located in South Kensington, an attractive area of southwest London surrounded by historically and culturally significant points of interest such as Royal Albert Hall, The Natural History Museum, and Kensington **Palace.** The London Underground and local buses link students to the rest of the city, while trains from central London link the city to the rest of the world. Although London offers a treasure trove of eventsincluding FIE's subsidized extra-curricular calendar and adventure weekendspopular weekend destinations for students include Paris, Amsterdam, and Berlin.

DUBLIN

Study:

FIE Dublin offers students the opportunity to enroll in their choice of Irish universities including Dublin Business School (DBS), Trinity College Dublin (TCD), and University College Dublin (UCD), while also taking FIE's unique Irish Life and Cultures course. Located in the heart of the city center, DBS offers a wide range of courses in all **Business** specialties as well as comprehensive offerings in **Communications, Journalism**, Psychology and Liberal Arts, featuring small class sizes with Irish students. TCD is one of the world's most prestigious universities and a leader in **Chemistry, Law, Politics, Social** Sciences, and Humanities. UCD is a popular choice with American students and offers the most comprehensive array of courses and majors in Ireland, including those in the **STEM fields** and a STEM research program. UCD offers a more American-style campus, a short bus ride away from the city center.

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Intern:

Students enrolled at DBS also have the opportunity to have an internship at a small to medium-sized Irish company in the vibrant capital city. Dublin has become a hotspot for entrepreneurial and startup tech companies as well as advertising, journalism, and tourism. Internships in Dublin have recently soared in popularity as students take advantage of the **'big village feel'** that is unique to Dublin.

Explore:

FIE Dublin offers sponsored co-curricular activities, volunteer activities, a packed extra-curricular calendar, and **study** weekends away to Northern Ireland and the western coast of Ireland. FIE students live within walking distance of the city center, allowing them easy access to the heart of Dublin and the wealth of museums, shops, historical sites, and cultural quarters in Temple Bar and many other areas.



AMMAN


Summer

Study Only, Study & Arabic Language

Study:

The summer **Peace & Conflict Resolution** program provides a unique opportunity to explore the process of peace and the sensitive cultural and societal roots of conflict. Students begin their studies in London, using Northern Ireland as a case study. As part of the London course, students travel to sites in Northern Ireland and the Republic of Ireland on a study tour to contextualize their coursework. Once in Amman, students use their new understanding of peace and conflict to examine how the Arab/ Israeli conflict, tribal conflicts, and regional conflicts such as those in Lebanon, Yemen or Iraq are being addressed.

BEGINNING IN LONDON AND ENDING IN AMMAN, THIS UNIQUE PROGRAM EXPLORES PEACE PROCESSES AND THE ROOTS OF SOCIETAL CONFLICT.

Converse:

Following the conclusion of the Peace & Conflict Resolution Program, students have the opportunity to extend their stay in Amman and pursue a course in intensive Arabic language, including instruction in both **Modern Standard Arabic and Jordanian Arabic** at all levels from beginner to advanced.

Explore:

The program includes several tours and excursions, which serve to reinforce concepts learned in class and to provide a break from the intensive coursework. The Amman City tour visits the ancient area of Amman with ruins from the Bronze and Stone Age, including the Roman Amphitheatre and The Citadel The Biblical Jordan excursion starts in the ancient city of Madaba, followed by Mount Nebo and the Baptism site in Bethany. Students also get to visit and swim in the **Dead Sea,** a site with cultural significance for thousands of years. The final excursion is to the south with stops in Wadi Rum desert and the ancient city of Petra, Jordan's most popular tourist destination.

Internships LONDON, DUBLIN

An international internship in London or Dublin offers students the opportunity to immerse themselves in a city in a way that other study abroad students don't get to experience. By becoming a 'local', commuting on public transportation, interacting with colleagues from around the city, and **developing intercultural** workplace skills, students who intern return to their home country with résumé-boosting knowledge from their time in the global marketplace. FIE primarily places students in small to medium sized companies in London and Dublin, allowing students the ability to dive right into projects and work more closely with all levels of management at their internship. The internship placement forms an integral part of FIE's signature International Internship

Course (IIC). The IIC includes a series of seminars which students take on their non-internship days. The course helps them contextualize their experience as it's happening through class discussion and personal reflection.

Students select three industry choices of interest and submit their résumé, personal statement, and coursework experience as part of their FIE application. Our London and Dublin teams review the information and hand match students to a company in their first, second, or in some cases third choice industry. Once the students arrive in London or Dublin, they are given information about their internship in a two-part orientation with tips on getting to the location, what to wear, and general intercultural workplace differences they may encounter. Service Internships LONDON

An international service internship in London is a unique opportunity for students from all majors to have an international work experience with the central theme of serving the community. Unlike a traditional internship, the primary focus is civic engagement, encouraging personal and professional growth. Students gain insight into possible careers, develop intercultural and professional skills, and cultivate increased personal awareness.

Service internship placements are an integral component of the **International Service Internship Course (ISIC)** which students have on their non-internship days.

The service internship placement process,mirrors the internship placement process,with students submitting their résumé,personal statements, and coursework forreview to our **Experiential Education**team. The information is carefullyevaluated and students are matched witha company based on the students' interestsand goals for the service internship.

Leadership

We are always striving for innovation in the way we teach to, connect to, and provide opportunities for the global leaders of tomorrow. Below are some of our special projects to reach out to all communities of students from around the world.

GreekConnect

New in 2012, GreekConnect is a London program designed for those actively **involved or interested in the Greek community** on their home campus. Through a series of extra-curricular activities as part of the 14-week semester Study or Study & Internship program, students have the opportunity to meet other likeminded students from different colleges and universities around the country and bond over a common interest.

While there is no direct UK equivalent to the fraternities and sororities seen on American campuses, students explore the wealth of resources about ancient Greece located in London as well as examples of ritual and living/learning communities in London and in Oxford. The aim of the program is to give those involved in the Greek community on their home campus context and background for their organizations through the vast resources in London during their study abroad program. Here are examples of past events for GreekConnect:

- Discussion on the ancient Greek foundations of fraternity and sorority life, followed by a facilitated tour of the British Museum ancient Greece exhibit and a group dinner
- Guided tour of the United Grand [Masonic] Lodge of England to explore the ritualistic foundations of fraternity and sorority life followed by a group lunch
- A day-long facilitated visit to Oxford to experience the collegiate residential learning community of Oxford University

Student Global Leadership Conference

Started in 2013, the biennial spring FIE **Student Global Leadership Conference** is an opportunity for FIE students and other local and international students to come together to discuss leadership through hands-on, interactive breakout sessions, engaging keynote speakers, and workshops. The conference was developed by FIE as a platform for students to build upon the aspects of leadership which form during and after a study abroad experience.

The conference is designed for:

- Anyone seeking inspiration and motivation from diverse leaders

Previous SGLC keynote and session leaders have included world leaders in business, education, and politics as well as professionals from a variety of industries. Students are also actively encouraged to submit proposals to present on topics they are passionate about. Historically, undergraduate and graduate students have made up about half of breakout session presenters.

Co-curricular Activities

LONDON, DUBLIN, AMMAN

Woven into the fabric of our study and internship programs, co-curricular activities are an essential part of student coursework in all of our locations. Our faculty utilize the historical and cultural aspects of the global cities we operate in and see the entire area as an extension of the classroom. Theaters, museums, eateries, galleries, parks, and local events are all possible venues for exploration to complement in-class learning. As much as possible, co-curricular activities are designed around the goals of the course as well as FIE values such as social justice and diversity and inclusivity.

In London, multiple courses have optional weekend study tours such as Shakespeare and Elizabethan Literature, which takes students to Stratford-Upon-Avon, the home of William Shakespeare. Students attend performances at the Royal Shakespeare Company and visit the homes of Shakespeare accompanied by faculty and FIE staff. Courses also have co-curricular components, for example visiting an Islamic Mosque as part of Understanding Civilizations: Islam and the West or guided tours of London's outdoor markets and food halls as part of Food, Society, and Culture in Britain.

In Dublin, students are taken to Northern Ireland and western Ireland on weekend study tours to explore the rich history of peace and conflict between the two countries through guided tours to Derry and Belfast as well as activities in Galway and the Aran Islands. FIE co-curricular activities in and around Dublin also get students out of their seats and into the city center campus of FIE Dublin.

In Amman, students visit culturally significant locations such as the Citadel in Amman, Bethany and the baptism site, and Petra in the south of Jordan on weekend study tours. As part of their course in Amman, faculty facilitate meetings and discussions with local tribal leaders and take advantage of Amman's vibrant souks and places of worship to illustrate the themes developed in the classroom.

Community Service LONDON, DUBLIN

In line with our values, FIE works with our partners to customize community service, service learning, and volunteer activities for students. Some past examples include soup kitchens, river cleanup, and donation drives. FIE London and Dublin students have also taken initiative and raised money for charity through half marathons and football tournaments during their own time. Students are encouraged to register to volunteer independently during their time abroad and to stay informed about any volunteering opportunities that may arise in the local community.



Since 1998, FIE has been partnering with study abroad offices, faculty members, and campus leaders at US colleges and universities to develop first-year, facultyled, and customized programs. In a time of decreasing resources and increasing demand for quality study abroad opportunities, FIE offers a variety of ways to build and deliver strong academic programs rich in experiential learning.

First-Year Programming LONDON. DUBLIN

In response to the growing interest in study abroad program options for freshmen, FIE began offering first-year programs in 2008. Since then, we have developed regular semester- and quarter-based programs with multiple US institutions. FIE staff are first-year experience experts, with academic and student services designed to support first-year students that have different needs than more experienced upper-classmen.

Why might your institution consider a first-year program abroad?

For freshman students, a fall or spring semester abroad offers an international perspective that will guide and inform the entirety of their undergraduate career. Many students will choose to study abroad again later in their degree program after participating in a first-year program.

For institutions, first-year programs can serve as an effective enrollment management tool or an enticement for the best and brightest applicants. Universities and colleges can offer a first-year fall option to spring-admitted students as a way for those students to make progress toward their degrees and to retain them for the springadmit pool. First-year programs can focus on a particular major or college within an institution, and others are open to all incoming freshmen. Some schools offer highly selective spring semester firstyear programs as an enrollment highlight for their top-tier applicants.

Whatever the motivation or focus, FIE can help build a comprehensive first-year program tailored to your institution.

What can students do academically on a first-year program?

FIE will help your institution develop and deliver freshman-specific courses, such as Writing and Composition, so first-year students come back to campus having met preliminary academic requirements. In London, students generally participate in courses developed for and delivered specifically to their first-year cohort. In Dublin, students often take one or two closed-cohort classes and integrate with Irish and international students at one of FIE's affiliated institutions for the rest of their academic work. In both locations, all of FIE's firstyear programs include a core course in either British or Irish Life and Cultures that has been adjusted to the first-year level.

Each FIE-taught course involves extensive co-curricular experiences in order to take advantage of the outstanding learning environments of London or Dublin. These academic experiences also serve to enhance the group dynamic and, with good branding, connect the students more deeply to their home-school culture, which can be threaded throughout the course topics.

How are these less-experienced students supported?

FIE has in place extensive academic feedback structures and student support services to monitor the students' academic achievements and create social experiences suitable for the first-year audience. FIE's Student Life team has extensive experience with the first-year demographic and FIE recognizes the need to engage more frequently with this young population than with our more independent upperclassmen. As such, first-year students are involved in a rigorous and nurturing schedule in and out of the classroom.

FIE also welcomes home institution staff if a campus wishes to send them to support the program. Some partners hire their own Resident Directors to work in concert with FIE's Student Life team, while others appoint one or two upperclassmen to accompany the group as Resident Advisors.

Student Safety & Emergency Support

Student safety is paramount while students are in London, Dublin, or Amman. Students are informed of our regular safety and emergency safety procedures from their initial application and again in their pre-departure and on-site orientations. London and Dublin each have Emergency Incident Response Plans with protocols in place to keep students safe. Our partner in Jordan, AMIDEAST, also has its own specific health and safety protocols for students while they are on the ground during the Amman portion of their program. All three locations have 24-hour emergency numbers, which are provided to students and available on our website.

FIE residences and Foundation House are equipped with CCTV and safety checks such as fire drills are made throughout the program. Students are required to submit a travel form including their destination, intended return, and contact information when they leave London or Dublin during their time with FIE.

All FIE students are offered international travel insurance with health coverage as part of their program which covers basic medial visits, though the institution or family may opt to provide their own in replacement of or in addition to the FIE policy .

Our Student Life team in London and our Resident and Assistant Resident Directors in Dublin are the first point of contact for day-to-day concerns of illness or issues and are trained to advise students on situations at any level of severity.

All FIE buildings, offices, and events are Safe Spaces and we operate with a strict Zero Tolerance policy on bullying, harassment, or intimidation.



Facilities

Foundation House

A 19th century townhouse, **Foundation House** serves as the administrative hub for FIE staff and classroom space for our students. The building features nine classrooms, a student common room, our faculty work stations, and staff offices.

Student Housing

Our students usually live in converted townhouses similar to Foundation House in South Kensington. Rooms range from singles to quads in floor or apartment style flats. Kitchens and bathrooms have been renovated in FIE housing and safety features such as CCTV and a 24-hour reception desk provide comfortable and safe residences for our students. All rooms are fully furnished and our housekeeping staff has a rotating schedule for linens and cleaning.

External Teaching and Living Space

Depending on enrollment, FIE occasionally reaches out to other academic entities and student residences in the community to provide additional facilities for our students and faculty. Our Student Life, Senior Management, and Facilities teams carefully vet new locations for classes and housing to ensure FIE standards are upheld.







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
