Q7 - What is your current classification?






Q10 - Do you lease or own your own personal vehicle (a car, van, truck, or motorcycle)?

Q12 - When you travel to campus at the beginning of the semester, what type of transportation do you use? Select all that apply.



I am one of the few without reliable transportation and walk to campus everyday and without Richmond public transportation.

Totally electric cars pollute more unless the electricity is generated by non-carbon sources, because the 2nd law of thermodynamics (entropy) says that you will loose energy as heat when the energy is transported through the wires. When electricity is generated without carbon fuels i will consider electric cars. Presently i drive a hybrid which translates mechanical energy from stopping to electrical energy for running the car. I am a transfer student, so I have not had the opportunity to really experience EKU's transportation programs, but as an environmentalist, I am for sustainability. I do not think, however, that decreasing parking availability, increasing the pricing of parking passes, etc. will be beneficial. Doing so will only anger many students, including myself. I do think, though, that increasing solar power, etc. will help if EKU does not change its transportation. DO NOT TAKE MORE PARKING AWAY, as a resident student, who works in Lexington, reducing parking has become a large struggle on my work schedule making it harder for me to work

More Recycling around parking lots- so much plastic in trash. More water bottle refill stations. Have Compost bins.

Offer more options for Big E Transit on the weekends, and to the outer parking lots. If you all want us to use the far out parking lots, give us better options to get to and from them. Also, if there was a safe way to walk/bike to a major grocery store it would be very helfpul.

The EKU bus shuttles are very convenient but seem to always be gone when I need them. Also, the routes are strange to me. There is one bus with an old man driver that literally will chill in Ashland lot for minutes doing nothing but keeps the bus running. All I need the shuttle for is to get from Ashland/Stratton, back to main campus around Wallace.

If there were a set schedule for the Big E Shuttle I think it would help. You could color code the Shuttles and give them a given area where they travel back and forth to and from.

EKU does not endorse skateboarding; but this is a viable method of transportation. Most of the sidewalks suck and can't be boarded on at all! It is too dangerous to skateboard on roads. There are no ways to secure boards during class.

Most of the bike lanes are no longer visibly painted on roadsides across campus.

Make more roads one-way, and use the other lane as sidewalk space for biking, walking and skateboarding. I hope you are joking. I pay enough for classes. Paying for carbon credits is a stupid idea and I am surprised a EKU is looking at paying for carbon credits when it makes no difference to the student. Make the university safe, make the university a healthier place by offering walking and biking opportunities but who ever came up with the students paying for carbon credits is going to drive away students. Furthermore, raising the parking rates for carbon credits is counter productive.

I would greatly prefer seeing active efforts made in reducing our REAL carbon footprint instead of participating in the shell game of RECs. How about actively encouraging telecommuting for employees twice a month, moving to a permanent four day week over summer, or turn off some of the ridiculous amount of outdoor lighting when it is not in use (I'm looking at you, Football Stadium) that is costing a fortune and probably doubling the light pollution output of Richmond? With all of our new construction, have we used the opportunity to install geothermal since we have clear ground to do so? What about rooftop solar on our acres and acres of available rooftop? Maybe even just supplemental water heating would have an impact. Also, just as an aside, the new recycling containers are great and attractive but make no mention of glass recyclables. Are glass bottles to go into the landfill side? We have made good strides in recent days, but there is much more we can do, and most of it could have positive effects on morale if implemented properly.

The Big-E shuttle does not run to Grand Campus, which does not encourage students who live there to use it rather than driving to class in their personal vehicle. Parking options in Grand Campus lot are minimal for the students who live there, due to the spots being taken by people who reside in Martin Hall, which increases carbon emissions from residents of GC constantly searching for a better spot. I have spent 45-minutes to 1-hour idling in the parking lot of Grand Campus searching for a parking spot.

Sometimes the buses are in such a hurry that they dont wait long enough at the stops to make sure everyone who is near by and is getting on the bus is able to. I wish there was a way we could send a text or something to the bus we were closest to and request them to wait an additional 60 seconds for us or something like that. It would also

make campus much safer I think if students could request a ride from anywhere on campus to any other point on campus without having to pay for i, kind of like free Ubers,

It is unlikely that any plan EKU integrates will have any effect on reducing carbon emissions to any significant degree, but it's understandable that you guys want grant money.

Additionally, this semester, I have a wide gap in time between classes. It's the first time it's happened, so I drive to class and back home, then back to class again, on Mondays and Wednesdays, though, I'm not sure anything could be done about this. I personally would prefer if more of my classes had been offered in the afternoon. if parking was prioritized and not going up ever semester where it would be affordable for students and staff... we pay alot of money to attend eastern yet have to pay between \$100-\$400 just for a parking permit depending whether you are a student or staff and there's no parking to begin with.

I would be much more willing to use these services (like biking or shuttle service) if I lived in Richmond; however, due to scheduling, location of office and classrooms, and not living near others teaching at EKU at similar times/days, I don't have a choice but to drive solo, park as close to classrooms/office as possible, and walk (and I certainly don't mind walking).

Although EKU offers multiple transportation options, I am unable to utilize them because I am a commuter. As of now, I have two back-to-back classes in Stratton Building with the rest of my classes being across campus; this allows me only 15 minutes to drive from Stratton to the library area. I must first, get to my car, face late morning traffic, and find a parking spot that is somewhat close to my class in combs, if I am fortunate I am able to parallel park in front of the Main Library, this typically allows me 2-4 mins to walk to class. That being said, I do not have time to dig for quarters to put in the meters which obviously results in a ticket that costs \$15.

As an investment suggestion, meters that allow cards to swiped as payment would be much more convenient as well as many more parking spots.

The campus and Richmond community needs more pedestrian access - especially the Richmond community. There needs to be a sidewalk/bike path installed along the Eastern Bypass that connects the campus to the Walmart/Kroger/Lowes part of the city. It seems like it is possible to put one in that is offset from the bypass. The path would need to go up and over the railroad tracks (through the hospital parking lot and out Aldi's parking lot) for it to work.
