



The University of New Brunswick (UNB) has been actively engaged in sustainability for several years. In 2010, the institution established a Strategic Plan as a guiding document for decision making processes within the university. The plan includes a goal to *Build a Better University* supporting and encouraging active living and environmental sustainability. The UNB Fredericton campus established a sustainability program three years ago and committed to making strides to “green the campus” in multiple different focus areas.

In order to assess and provide recommendations regarding UNB’s current commitment to sustainability, the Sustainability Tracking and Rating Systems (STARS) framework provided by the Association for the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE) was completed. This framework will also act as a baseline in the development of an Institutional Sustainability Plan (ISP), which will help inform sustainability related decisions on the campus moving forward.

Please find attached the Sustainability Tracking Assessment and Rating System (STARS) report for the University of New Brunswick’s Fredericton campus. All data contained has been provided by the institutional unit that is responsible for tracking data in each category and has been thoroughly vetted by many individuals from the UNB Fredericton campus to ensure its accuracy.
