The university is the largest private, not-for-profit institution of higher education in Florida.

NSU's 314-acre Fort Lauderdale/Davie Campus provides a complete university experience, including undergraduate academic opportunities like a health care clinical shadowing program, travel study, and internships, as well as on-campus housing, NCAA Division II athletics, fraternities and sororities, and more.

Additional locations include the East Campus in Fort Lauderdale; the North Miami Beach Campus; and the Oceanographic Campus in Hollywood, Florida.

NSU offers a wide range of online undergraduate, master's, doctoral, and graduate certificate programs. To support the enrollment of out-of-state students, the university has obtained approval by Florida to participate in the National Council for State Authorization Reciprocity Agreements (NC-SARA).

Eight regional campuses are located throughout Florida and in Puerto Rico. Field-based locations are available throughout Florida, across the nation, and internationally. NSU research is supported by external agencies, including the National Science Foundation, the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, National Institutes of Health, U.S. Department of Education, National Oceanic and Atmospheric Association, and the Department of Defense.

External research funding increased percent during the past decade, from \$48 million in FY 2009 to \$107.7 million in FY 2018.

NSU is one of 50 universities in the nation recognized by the Carnegie Foundation for both High Research Activity and Community Engagement.

More than sponsored projects are currently underway. They address such critical areas as anticancer therapies, cardiovascular disease, chronic fatigue syndrome, autism, coral reef restoration, stem cells, and shark DNA forensics.





Master's degrees awarded to Hispanic students
