

# Commission votes to lift Greenbrier County mask mandate

The Greenbrier County Commission met on the morning of Tuesday, Oct. 12 to discuss, among other things, the Greenbrier County Health Department’s mask mandate.

The mandate was issued by the Health Department on Sept. 17, but in accordance with new state laws, the county commission took it up for discussion at their most recent meeting. Commission President Lowell Rose, who acts as the commission’s liaison to the Greenbrier County Health Department, explained the Department’s mandate decision.

“At that time [mid-September], cases in the county were on the rise, up to 403 at the top. As of yesterday [Oct. 11] we have 146 active cases and seven hospitalized.”

That number represents a more than 50 percent decrease in active cases in less than a month, prompting Rose to conclude his opening remark in saying that cases have “come down considerably.” He added that during the Health Department meeting he was a voting member, but abstained from voting on the mandate deci-

sion, knowing that the issue would be brought before the commission.

The formal motion to end the mandate was then made by Commissioner Mike McClung, who added that he was “pleased” to make the motion. Commissioner McClung showed an attention to public opinion when he explained the reasoning behind his vote, “Wearing of the masks is hugely unpopular with the people of Greenbrier County, so I would be happy to make that motion to lift the mandate.”

Before moving to a final vote, Commissioner Rose further explained the procedures and addressed some concerns involved in the mask mandate.

“The Health Department was within its rights in declaring the mandate. If there is a health emergency they [the Greenbrier County Health Dept.] can both mandate and put into effect a mask mandate for thirty days. The Commission then has 30 days in which to take up [lift or continue] the mandate. In the case that there is not a health emergency, the [Health] Department makes a request for a mask mandate and the Commission makes the determination as to whether or not that goes into effect.”

This is pursuant to new state laws which aim to bring more accountability and community involvement to public health decisions.

The final vote was a unanimous one to lift the mandate, with Commissioner Tammy Tincer voting via text, thus lifting the mandate immediately. That afternoon, the Commission reaffirmed the right of any individual to wear a mask if they so choose through a social media post:

“We continue to encourage everyone to wear their masks in indoor settings and in large groups in addition to social distancing as we know this does have a direct impact on limiting the spread of this virus,” reads the post. “We respectfully ask that everyone continue to do your part in keeping our families safe and our communities healthy as our healthcare community continues to feel the strain from this pandemic and this most recent surge. Remember, we are also entering into flu season, and masking helps prevent the spread of this virus as well. Please contact your local provider for the COVID-19 and flu vaccine. We are stronger together.”

# CVB provides update on state and local tourism

Kara Dense, executive director of the Greenbrier Valley Convention and Visitors Bureau (CVB), has been making the rounds in the county to let local leaders know how the hospitality and tourism industry is doing in the Greenbrier Valley. Lewisburg, White Sulphur Springs, Ronceverte, and Alderson all fall under the coverage area for the CVB, which spearheads advertising campaigns for all the amenities the area has to offer.

Last year marked the twentieth anniversary of the CVB, and Director Dense pointed out some accomplishments from their history: the opening of the Visitor’s Center, promoting Lewisburg’s bid for “Coolest Small Town in America,” implementing the Tourism Recovery Marketing Plan after the 1,000-year flood, and winning the Southern Tourism Society’s award for Best CVB of the year in both 2006 and 2018.

Dense also addressed what lies ahead for the CVB. The pandemic has created both opportunities and challenges for her bureau. “Studies from all over the country are finding that people are keen to go to places with small


towns, outdoor recreation, not crowded, places that are safe; we have all that here in the Greenbrier Valley,” said Dense.

While this has brought an influx of tourists, it has also highlighted some problems. According to Dense, “People are flying here, but don’t have a way of getting around when they land here.” To address this issue, a new committee was created, and is chaired by CVB board members as well as Greenbrier Valley Airport Director Brian Belcher.

Collaboration is also underway between New River Community and Technical College and the CVB to address a work shortage in the hospitality industry. Dense explained that the industry nationwide is “struggling for workers.” So in response, the CVB has “started a conversation with Dr. Bonnie Copenhaver at NRCTC, and we are going to be partnering with them to look at their hospitality program and develop some training so that they aren’t walking onto the job cold.”

Dense went on to say the CVB is interested in advertising for these jobs and educating the public about the nature of a career in hospitality. She made special mention of Ron MaGruder, who she said, “is such a community leader in this area and a volunteer. Though he used to run Olive Garden and Cracker Barrel, he began his career by washing dishes.”

Dense further explained that marketing efforts have resumed in earnest in the 2020/21 fiscal year. The marketing plan occurred in phases, beginning with local marketing before branching to successively farther markets. She



happily said that work had begun on the 2022 Visitor’s Guide and that “advertisers were excited to get back to the guide,” and that “advertising dollars are good.”

She also recounted the visit of a group of 43 writers from the Society of American Travel Writers Freelance Council to The Greenbrier Valley on a trip to southern West Virginia. Though rescheduled from its original date last year due to COVID, the group was treated to an opening reception at The Greenbrier and provided with a night’s stay before continuing their tour. Since that initial group visit in May, 18 writers have returned to the area and have visited 14 local tourism businesses. Dense noted that the area “will continue to benefit from the earned media generated” from the content generated by these writers.

Getting down to brass tacks, the numbers for the 2020/21 fiscal year come out as follows:

- 37 million ads were displayed in print and online
- 143k clicks were made to the website from a Greenbrier Valley digital ad
- 293k unique visitors to the website (up by 42%)
- 1.2 million people reached on social media platforms
- 16,390 actions showing travel intent to the Greenbrier Valley (up 76%)

## County Commission makes progress with multiple projects

The Greenbrier County Commission opened bids for the ongoing FEMA repair work on the Meadow River Rail Trail, as well as bids for the Church Street Stormwater System Project and the Big Draft Road Water Line Extension Project. Also up for discussion was the selection of an Internet Service Provider (ISP) for the Quinwood Broadband Project.

The Commission opened two bids from SQP Construction Group Inc. at just over \$497,000, and another from Court Street Construction coming in at roughly \$460,000. The bids presented at this week’s meeting are now awaiting approval pending an in-depth review by both the Commission and Meadow River Rail Trail Coordinator Matt Ford.

Next up, the Commission addressed the Church Street Stormwater System project. One project bid was made by Haul’s Contracting Inc. for the construction work and E.L. Robinson Engineering of Charleston for the technical services, at \$135,527.40 and \$18,155.66, respectively, for a total of \$153,683.06.

According to WSS City Manager Lloyd Haynes, “The old drain system that comes from the tunnel down Church Street had collapsed, so

we are putting in all new drainage down to the creek. It’s just about ready to wrap up, hopefully in the next few weeks.”

The Commission then moved to the Big Draft Road Water Line Extension project. Much as with the Church Street project, one bid was submitted which was split between construction and technical services. The bid came from Pro Contracting Inc. on the construction end of things and E.L. Robinson Engineering for technical and engineering services. The two companies value their labor at \$301,059.35 and \$14,070.62, respectively, for a total of \$315,129.97. Haynes explains, “This water line extension will be going all the way up Big Draft, and go all the way around Montague so that everyone who lives up that way can have city water.” As of now, that area gets their water from wells.

The Commission then discussed the ongoing process of choosing an Internet Service Provider for the Quinwood Broadband Project, but tabled the item as interviews of potential providers are still ongoing.

The next Greenbrier County Commission meeting will be held on Tuesday, Oct. 26, at 10 a.m. in the Greenbrier County Courthouse. The public is invited to attend.

# WSS City Council holds October meeting

White Sulphur Springs City Council convened on Tuesday, Oct. 12, for their regularly scheduled meeting. Agenda items included considering an ordinance for the construction of a cable system, stormwater and sewer projects on Schoolhouse Way and Nell’s Way, and local concerns regarding loose dogs.

The city of White Sulphur approved and signed an ordinance with Cable Systems Inc, doing business as Suddenlink Communications, so that they can continue to provide services to the area. This is a non-exclusive agreement, which means that other providers can operate in the same service region. With Suddenlink recently landing in hot water with the Public Service Commission over long maintenance times, ineffective help lines, and more, city councils across the Greenbrier Valley have grappled with the decision to keep Suddenlink on as an internet provider. However, providing a nonexclusive clause keeps the option open for residents who which to change providers if they so wish.

The city also approved a stormwater and sewer project for School House Way and Nell’s Way in town. There were two bids, as this is being bid out as two different projects.

“With using CARES Act money means we have to pay prevailing wage,” said Mayor Bruce Bowling. The bids did not include prevailing wage, but Bowling explained, “We can pass it, pending that they resubmit the bid with prevailing wage.” He estimates that after the needed adjustments, the bid will be 30 percent more, and things will take “twice as long to do.”

Area resident Sandy Circosta, an avid walker, approached the council to report her personal experience with a dog that has displayed aggressive behavior towards her while she is out on her walks. She states that the German shepherd in question has approached her numerous times in a threatening manner and that while law enforcement has issued citations to the owners and subpoenaed them to appear in “doggy court,” the dog continues to run loose every so often, causing her to be afraid to go outside.

“The only thing I want them to do is to control their dog. I don’t want animal control to take it, I don’t want to see anything to happen to that dog, but I just want that dog controlled,” she said. “Animal control has been marvelous, he has said, ‘You shouldn’t be scared to walk.’”

Local law enforcement is following up with the matter.

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## WVSOM professor named one of 50 ‘West Virginia Wonder Women’

Before she became an osteopathic physician, Deborah Schmidt, D.O., wore many hats. She worked at various times as a heavy-equipment operator, a shrimp factory employee, an asparagus sorter, a waitress and an exercise instructor, among other jobs.

Now, Schmidt, who chairs the Department of Osteopathic Principles and Practice (OPP) at the West Virginia School of Osteopathic Medicine (WVSOM), can add one more title to her long resume. She was listed as one of the year’s “West Virginia Wonder Women” by WV Living magazine.

Schmidt is one of 50 women profiled in the publication’s fall 2021 issue for “raising the bar in their communities, serving as beacons of light in their industries and forcing change for the greater good.” She said she is pleased to be among those the magazine chose to highlight in its annual special issue.

“It’s quite an honor to be recognized among the many wonderful women who are changing the face of West Virginia,” Schmidt said. “It’s great to be in the company of such a variety of unique people, and it’s especially important because our state has a lot of natural talent that has been unrecognized. We need to be proud of who we are.”

Schmidt, the daughter of a U.S. Air Force pilot and a Greenbrier County teacher, realized she was interested in medicine while seeing a military physician in the early 1960s, when career opportunities for women were limited.

“I was 8 years old and sick with pneumonia, and the doctor was doing a chest X-ray and drawing blood,” she said. “I’d always been a curious person who enjoyed taking things apart and investigating, and I said, ‘I think I might like to do this someday.’ He said, ‘You can’t. You’re a girl.’ I looked at him and said, ‘I’m as smart as you are, and I think I can.’”

That curiosity powered much of Schmidt’s subsequent life. She graduated from Ohio State University with a pre-medicine degree at age 20, two years ahead of her peers, and spent three years hitchhiking across the United States to learn about the country and its people, working a variety of jobs along the way.

It was that same curiosity that brought her to osteopathic medicine, where physicians learn to supplement standard medical care with the use of osteopathic manipulative treatment to diagnose, treat and prevent illness. She was accepted at both the West Virginia University School of Medicine and WVSOM, and chose the osteopathic medical school because she wanted to continue to work with her hands.

Schmidt earned her medical degree in 1988. After completing a family medicine residency at Community Hospital in Lancaster, PA, and working at community health centers in Colorado, South Carolina and Virginia, she returned to Lewisburg and began teaching at WVSOM as a part-time clinical instructor in 1999. The following year, she co-founded a medical practice with her husband and

another partner in downtown Lewisburg that later moved to Covington, VA. She became a full-time WVSOM faculty member in 2010.

As a professor and chair of WVSOM’s OPP department, Schmidt is responsible for developing the school’s osteopathic principles and practice curriculum and ensuring the faculty has the resources to deliver it. She also continues to teach not only first- and second-year students on the school’s Lewisburg campus, but third- and fourth-year students in the school’s Statewide Campus system.

Schmidt is a member of the West Virginia Board of Acupuncture and has been involved in training members of approved health professions to perform the National Acupuncture Detoxification Association (NADA) protocol, a form of acupuncture in which needles are placed into specific areas on the exterior of the ear. The protocol, in conjunction with other treatments, can reduce drug cravings and minimize withdrawal symptoms. Schmidt said ear acupuncture also can be used in non-addicted patients to improve sleep, decrease anxiety and ease symptoms of post-traumatic stress disorder.

Since 2019, a total of 102 West Virginia health care

professionals have been trained in the protocol, largely due to Schmidt’s efforts.

WVSOM President James W. Nemitz, Ph.D., praised Schmidt for being named a West Virginia Wonder Woman.

“Dr. Schmidt has played a tremendous role in educating our students about the value of osteopathic manipulative treatment and in training them to properly perform it,” he said. “She’s an integral member of WVSOM’s osteopathic faculty, and I’m thrilled that WV Living has taken note of her achievements and is celebrating her along with so many accomplished women from around our great state.”

Schmidt is one of four Greenbrier County women selected for this lineup of West Virginia Wonder Women. Others include Lynn Benedict, a member of the American Dairy Goat Association’s board of directors; the Rev. Betsy Walker, priest of St. Thomas Episcopal Church in White Sulphur Springs and Church of the Incarnation in Ronceverte; and Beverly White, mayor of Lewisburg.

WV Living will honor the recipients at an in-person West Virginia Wonder Women event on Nov. 30 in South Charleston, WV.

## WV House of Delegates passes historic single-member district bill

For the first time in West Virginia’s 158-year history, members of the Republican-led West Virginia House of Delegates adopted a measure that would establish 100 single-member Delegate districts through the process of decennial redistricting.

House Bill 301 was adopted Oct. 13 by a bipartisan vote of 79 to 20 with one Delegate absent. The measure now goes to the Senate for debate.

“The Joint Committee on Redistricting worked very hard all summer and fall to craft a plan that will give every West Virginian an equal voice in the House of Delegates,” said House Speaker Roger Hanshaw, R-Clay. “For the first time in decades, West Virginia will have 100 single-member House Districts.

“This plan will result in representation in the House that is both more uniform and more equitable for every citizen of the state.”

Members of the Joint Committee on Redistricting spent the summer months conducting 16 public hearings throughout the state, both in-person and virtually, collecting public feedback about how the 100 single-member districts should be drawn.

A 2018 law requires single-member districts be established this year, a change from the current 67 districts. Lawmakers continue to work on adopting a bill that would create two Congressional districts.

“We are dealing with population loss, but we’ve also had population shifts, and those facts are both reflected in the maps you saw today,” House Redistricting Committee Chairman Gary Howell, R-Mineral, said in describing the bill on the floor. “We’ve taken great care to keep counties and municipalities whole as much as possible where it’s been requested, and you’ll see a few instances when the opposite was asked of us.

“We’ve also tried to be mindful of communities of interest as much as possible, and those are considered to be groups of any size with similar interests, concerns and values.”

The current 100 Delegates come from 67 districts, with 22 members elected from 11 two-member districts; 18 legislators elected from six three-member districts; eight legislators elected from two four-member districts; and five legislators elected from a five-member district.

## Nature’s Way By Karen Cohen Master Gardener/Photojournalist/Artist A few of my favorites

With the weather turning cooler by ten to fifteen degrees, cool-loving veggies kale, arugula, and beets grow like weeds! These three items can be plucked continuously throughout the fall. Simply snip off the outer leaves and toss those into your salads. Beet greens can be used, too, cooked or raw, just like any green. Baby beets are a gourmet delicacy in many high end restaurants packed full of nutrients.

Plant these three aforementioned from seed late September until mid October. If we have an Indian summer, usually we do here in Greenbrier County, the warm temps return sometimes in November and that extends our growing season. Plant plenty of seed and when they have at least four leaves or more on them, thin out gently to have one plant every 4-6 inches. I NEVER toss away the thinned plants; I use them like any transplant and plop them back into the soil in a new row, careful not to break the thin strands of roots. Water after covering the roots with soil.

Buy some remay or use an old sheet and plan to cover your veggies at night when the temps dip down below 36 degrees. Prop up the fabric with sticks so the tender plants don’t break with the weight on top of them. Remember to remove the fabric to let in sunshine during the day if it goes above freezing and give them a bit of water every few days if there is no rain. You will be amazed to find these cold hardy vegetables will grow even with snow falling. In December through March, we cover our plants with thick clear plastic bought at a local gardening store and always prop it up to keep the plants free to grow. I have crawled into my plastic “tunnel” in the deep snow to harvest greens; it is wonderful to eat fresh food mid-winter. The best part is that starch in plants converts to sugar when temperatures go below 40 degrees. So kale tastes especially delicious after a light freeze!

Kale salad is a big craze in the big cities all around the USA. Businesses specializing in mixed salads only are a popular trend with lines at lunchtime going way outside the front door. Most offer ordering and payment online by credit card. Just pop in and grab your salad with your name on the bag, it’s known as pick up and go. Some of these shops don’t accept cash, can you imagine that! Credit card by payment online, no cash to collect, count and time to give change, no gabbing with the customer or co-workers, it’s all about convenience and quick service. It works if you have 30-45 minutes to gobble down a healthy lunch rather than a fat laden burger at a fast food joint.

Massaging the kale - have you done that yet? - is easy. It helps to break down the fibers in the big leaves and is done by scrunching up the leaves in your hands a few times after removing the hard stems. Then wrap the bruised leaves in a long cigar shape and chop up with your kitchen knife into small bite size pieces. If you have goat cheese, walnuts, pine nuts or sunflower seeds, toss those in and add raw carrots, raw grated beets, chopped onions, celery, whatever you have on hand. Build your salad just like they do in these salad shops. Add dressing of your choice, oil and vinegar is the easiest, a sprinkle of feta cheese and a handful of dried cranberries and you will be coming back for more, I promise. You may think you will still be hungry after this but that’s a false notion. Research tells us that eating for twenty minutes is the

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amount of time that is required to tell your brain to stop eating and you do feel satiated. Yes, believe it and try it. My absolute favorite beet recipe is also quick, healthy, and so delicious. Cut up the beets, no need to peel the thin skin, just wash off dirt. Bake them at 400 degrees until fork tender in a glass pan. Whole walnuts are cooked quickly on the stove top in a dry pan, just shaken a bit to get all the edges cooked till slightly brown and fragrant. Careful not to burn the nuts; they cook quickly. The beet greens can be chopped raw or quickly cooked. Add everything together in a big bowl. In a jar mix up 2 tsp Dijon mustard, 2 tbsp red wine vinegar, ¼ olive oil, 1 tbsp minced shallot (or sweet onion or chives), pour that over the beets and walnuts to lightly toss and coat them. Top with 4 ounces of goat cheese or feta cheese, mix up as you do with any salad and serve. Pepper as needed, the cheese will add a salt flavor.

Arugula salad is just as easy with adding a dressing of 1/4 olive oil, preferably extra virgin olive oil is lighter in flavor (chefs never use canola oil for salads), a squeeze of ½ lemon (remove the seeds), rip up two bunches of arugula that’s been washed and spun dried, salt and pepper to taste, toss it all and then top with grated Parmigiano-Reggiano flakes. ## Commentary BBB Report: Online purchase scams up; BBB warns holiday shopping at risk

Online purchase scams now account for more than a third of all scam reports filed with the Better Business Bureau (BBB), and four out of five consumers who report such scams lose money, making it the #1 riskiest scam type. BBB is warning consumers ahead of the holiday shopping season to be aware of how scammers deceive consumers, whether they are actively shopping or passively browsing. The 2021 BBB Online Purchase Scams Report examines more than 55,000 online purchase scam reports submitted to BBB Scam Tracker between 2015 and 2021; as well as new survey research conducted in 2021 to get insights from those who reported online purchase scams in 2020 and 2021. Online purchase scams consistently rank among the top three riskiest since 2017, and a significant number of people continue to lose money when targeted by online purchase scams (74.8% in 2021). The median dollar loss for this scam type has risen in recent years, up from \$76 in 2019 to \$102 so far in 2021. Experts are predicting an earlier start to the 2021 holiday shopping season because of supply chain concerns, microchip shortages, and holiday hiring. BBB warns scammers will find ways to take advantage of the situation by varying the product categories, capitalizing on

what people are looking for online and focusing on the most sought-after gifts such as electronics, toys, and other trendy gift items. “These critical findings can help guide our scam prevention outreach to those most vulnerable to these scam types,” said Melissa Trumpower, executive director of the BBB Institute for Marketplace Trust, BBB’s foundation. “Online purchase scams don’t just affect those who lose money. For every victim who lost money, that meant less income to buy groceries, gifts, pay the utility bill, or the loss of personal information that could lead to identity theft.” Each year, the BBB Institute issues a BBB Scam Tracker Risk Report, which analyzes the previous year’s data. Since the advent of the COVID-19 pandemic, online purchase scams have jumped along with an increase in online shopping. BBB took a deeper dive into the data by surveying people who had reported scams to ask them more about their situation. Whether a consumer was actively shopping for a product or passively browsing, it appears this activity had an impact on susceptibility. Sixty-four percent of survey respondents were actively searching for a product when they lost money to an online purchase scam. Thirty-six

percent of those who lost money were passively looking or not searching. When it came time to placing an order and expecting the item to be shipped, 32% surveyed reported receiving shipment tracking information that seemed authentic, 30% received fake shipping information, 2% received shipping information they didn’t verify, and 36% didn’t receive shipping information. Several survey respondents noted that they didn’t suspect a scam at first because they expected shipping delays due to the pandemic. The analysis of online purchase scam reports submitted to BBB Scam Tracker found that more than 400 different types of products were used by scammers to perpetrate scams. Pets and pet supplies were the riskiest sales category in 2020. Almost 35% of online purchase scam reports were pet-related, with 70% of people losing money, and a median dollar loss of \$750. ## Commentary AG Morrisey urges financial aid seekers to protect information

West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrisey urges college-bound students to protect personal information when preparing to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid in light of this month’s opening of the application window. Students are encouraged not to overlook the word “free” as they prepare to submit the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), a necessary part of qualifying for financial assistance. However, it is important for students to protect their personal, identifiable information during the application process to avoid potential scams or identity theft. The Attorney General reminds students and parents that FAFSA administrators do not charge a fee associated with the student’s application. That means anyone considering the use of a fee-based entity should carefully review the benefits and services offered, including data security. “In our office we always use caution with the word ‘free,’ but there are federal forms that actually put you in

a good position to get access to scholarship money or to college expenses - and it’s free of charge,” Attorney General Morrisey said. “At the same time, you also need to be wary of some third-party sites or entities that may ask for money or personal information during the application process. It may be a scam.” The FAFSA application period for the 2022-2023 school year opened Oct. 1. Students should file their application as soon as possible as some financial aid is awarded on a first-come, first-served basis. Applicants choosing to work with a third-party entity should verify the validity of any recipient to avoid compromising sensitive information, such as Social Security or Federal Student Aid identification numbers and other personally identifiable data. This will guard against scammers who may use a fake seal and other tools to pose as a government official. For instance, the FSA ID gives students access to online services and can serve as a legal signature. Every student, even those who think they may not

qualify for federal grants, should apply. Many colleges and states use FAFSA forms to award other grants and scholarships. great-grandchildren; sister, Hilda Bates of Covington, VA; and several nieces and nephews.

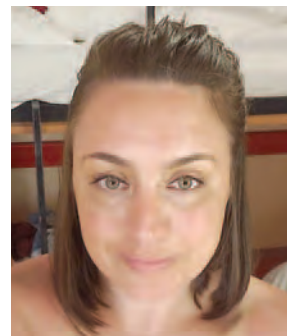

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## Dear Recycle Lady,

**Dear Recycle Lady,**

Thanks so much for the recycling advice! We both read your column every week. Sorry to be a nuisance, but we can't agree (partly due to memory problems) on several things. Is there still a category just for black and white computer paper, or does it include other colors not shiny. Are envelopes included despite the glue? What tops on cans can be recycled?

**Curious Reader**

**Dear Curious Reader,**

Thanks for being a faithful reader. I greatly appreciate both of you and your questions. There are three answers to your first question. If the computer paper is white, it recycles with office paper. If the computer paper is white, but is printed on with black ink, it also recycles with office paper. If the computer paper is shiny, black, red, chartreuse, or any dark color, it recycles with magazines.

The second question has a simpler answer. Envelopes will recycle with office paper, regardless of the glue on it as the glue will melt during processing. The answer to the third question depends on what kind of metal the tops of the cans are made of - steel or aluminum. Use a magnet to determine if the can top is steel. There is a large magnet available outside the steel bin at the Recycling Center, if you need one. If the magnet sticks to the cap, the cap is made of steel and recycles with steel cans. Flat tops and rings from canning jars are recycled with steel

cans. If the magnet does not stick to the cap, the cap is aluminum and recycles with the aluminum cans. No plastic tops can be recycled locally.

According to <https://abcnews.go.com/US/ticking-time-bomb-pfas/> PFAS (Per-and Polyfluorinated Alkyl substances!) are a group of colorless, tasteless man-made chemicals largely unregulated by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, and there is beginning to be a growing concern for the safety in drinking water of American communities. PFAS are called "forever chemicals" because they don't break down in the environment. Fortunately, PFAS found in most drinking water are EPA-compliant. Consumer watchdog organizations are looking out for all of us by working to "limit exposure to chemicals in water, food, and household products."

Built in 1930 and located at the west end of Main Street, the Hotel West Virginian was a prominent White Sulphur Springs landmark. The hotel and restaurant were built by Theodore and Maria Soures. Theodore immigrated from Chios, Greece in 1907 and arrived in New York with \$24. By 1920,

he lived in a White Sulphur Springs rooming house and was employed as a hotel pantry steward. Maria Argyrakis immigrated from Chios in 1922 and joined her brother, Nicholas, in White Sulphur Springs. Theodore and Maria married in 1923, and the following year they purchased the property where the hotel was later built. After the hotel

was completed, Theodore and Maria lived there and raised two daughters, Nicha and Fifi. Theodore died in 1953, and Maria died in 1979.

In 2003, The Greenbrier Resort purchased the hotel and adjacent buildings and razed them.

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## Learn How to Write a Song or Paint at Carnegie Hall

October is start of fall fire season, West Virginia residents urged to follow burning guidelines

CHARLESTON, WV — Fall fire season started Friday, Oct. 1, and continues through Dec. 31. The West Virginia Division of Forestry (WVDOF) reminds residents to confine their outdoor burning to the hours of 5 p.m. to 7 a.m. Fires set during that time must be put out before 7 a.m.

“The fall season is typically marked by a fall in humidity levels,” said Deputy State Fire Supervisor Jeremy Jones, WVDOF. “The daytime burning ban is there to protect you, your property, your neighbors and our state forests.”

Debris burning is the single most common cause of wildfires in West Virginia, averaging more than 35% of all wildfires over the past 10 years.


As the crisp, dry fall season replaces the humid summer, the air offers less moisture for grasses and leaf litter to absorb. Dry leaves and forest floor debris become more flammable. Burning is banned during the day because even in fall, relative humidity typically increases in the evening.

A summary of forest fire laws and safe fire practices can be found on the WVDOF.



The fire safe law includes:

- No outdoor burning from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.
- Any fire set between 5 p.m. and 7 a.m. must be extinguished before 7 a.m.
- Fires must be attended at all times.
- Before leaving any fire for any length of time, the fire must be completely extinguished.
- Clear at least a 10-foot area (safety strip) around the fire and make sure all burnable material has been removed.
- Any equipment that can throw sparks and operating on land subject to fire by any cause must be provided with an adequate spark arrestor.
- If your fire escapes, you are liable for the costs of fighting the fire and any damage the fire may cause.
- Violation of the burning law is punishable by a fine up to \$1,000.
- The WVDOF can issue commercial permits to burn during the prohibited periods.
