## Elk's Club pool suffers major structural damage, cause still unknown

The Community Pool at Elk Lodge 1758 is in a state of severe disrepair for yet unknown reasons this summer.

"We drained the pool on Monday [May 23] to do our routine maintenance like we do every year around this time, repair any cracks, stuff like that, and then after we got done we left it dry just like normal," explained Elk Lodge President Don Alts. "Well, by the next day it was starting to heave up slowly inch by inch and didn't stop until Wednesday."

The pool now appears to have lifted out of its frame, deep end first, cracking the concrete around it and causing major damage.

A contractor from Affinity Pools of Beckley has come out to examine the pool, and give a visual examination report to Alts and the lodge for insurance purposes. The insurance for the elk lodge property, including the pool, is provided through the Benevolent and Protective Order of the Elks and their insurance provider. Upon getting the report from the contractor, the insurance agency for the Elk's requested a more thorough diagnostic

## Missing man found deceased on Howard's Creek embankment

On Monday, June 6, at approximately 11:43 a.m., Sergeant B. W. Mitchell and Corporal Brandon McCormick of the Greenbrier County Sheriff's Office were dispatched to a report of a body being found on the embankment of Howard's Creek along Camp Ann Bailey Road in the Caldwell area.

Upon arrival the officers requested the Greenbrier County Sheriff's Office Crime Scene Team to process the scene. The body was subsequently transported to the State Medical Examiner's Office in Charleston for identification and cause of death.

The White Sulphur Springs Police Department later confirmed that the body had been identified to be a missing man from White Sulphur Springs, John H. Deaver, age 65. He had been reported missing by his family on the weekend of May 28.

Members of the West Virginia State Police, White Sulphur Springs Police Department and the Lewisburg Fire Department provided on scene assistance.

Corporal Brandon McCormick of the Greenbrier County Sheriff's office is the lead investigator.

## County Commission prepares the way for remodel of West Virginia Building

The Greenbrier County Commission met Wednesday, June 8, and discussed the initial steps of a remodel of the West Virginia Building on the State Fairgrounds.

A request had been made to the commission prior to

meeting by the State Fairgrounds to have the permit fee waived. This was requested due to the use of the West Virginia building as a public commodity on several occasions and on a continual basis. At 20,000 square feet, the building is the largest on the fairgrounds, and has been used as a staging ground for the equipment and staff for emergency electrical workers during natural disasters, most notably during the Derecho storm of 2012. More recently, the building was used as a vaccination clinic for Greenbrier County, as Commissioner Tincher explained.

"We had 16,000 individuals come out and receive their COVID shot during the pandemic, and so we do recognize this is a facility that is utilized for more than just the West Virginia State Fair."

Furthermore, on an ongoing basis, the West Virginia Building is the emergency rendezvous point for students fleeing both Greenbrier East High School and the middle school in the case of an evacuation. All these services are offered free of charge.

After signing the request and approving the waiving of the permit fee, members of the commission explained that the remodel will be very extensive, including

## Linda Dotson Vaughan awarded First Place, Best of Show in annual quilting competition

The West Virginia Department of Arts, Culture and History (WVDACH) unveiled the annual exhibition, Quilts and Wall Hangings 2022, in the Great Hall of the Culture Center, State Capitol Complex, and announced the winners of the juried exhibition at the opening concert of the annual Vandalia Gathering.

This year, the popular juried exhibition features 62 creative quilts and wall hangings representing the talents of West Virginians from 19 counties. There are 43 quilts and 19 wall hangings in the exhibition, which will remain on display through Sept. 13.

First place winners in this year's exhibition include Linda Dotson Vaughan of Caldwell, Greenbrier County, for Love to Embroider in the Mixed/Other Quilt category (Best of Show); Nancy Swisher of Fairmont, Monongalia County, for Dinner Plate Dahlia, in the Pieced Quilt category; Carol Miller of Bruceton Mills, Preston County, for Flowers Bloom in the Applique category, and Amy Pabst of LeRoy, Roane County, for Patriot in the Wall Hanging category. "Quilt making is one of West Virginia's oldest and most treasured art forms,"

said Charles Morris, museums director. "This annual display is a favorite for many West Virginians and for quilters and quilt lovers from around the country. It is one of our most popular displays."

The exhibition features the work of 58 quilters. Winners were selected by Linda Luggen, a quilter for over 30 years, teacher, lecturer and NQA Certified Judge from Cincinnati, Ohio. Luggen selected winners in four categories: pieced quilts, applique quilts, mixed/other quilts and wall hangings. Quilt awards are \$750 for first place, \$400 for second place and \$300 for third place. The wall hanging awards are \$400 for first place, \$300 for second place and \$200 for third place. The department made one purchase, and the juror designated a Best of Show prize of \$100. In addition, three nonmonetary honorable mention distinctions were made.

For the seventh consecutive year, the department's Quilt and Wall Hanging Exhibition will feature a National Association of Certified Quilt Judges (NACQJ) Award of Merit. This year's winner is Nancy Swisher for Dinner Plate Dahlia. As an NACQJ certified judge,

Luggen had the option of awarding this special ribbon. The award goes to a quilter whose work shows creativity and who has achieved recognized standards of quilt making excellence.

The Culture Center is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday.

inspection to determine the cause of the damage before they can decide to what extent, if any, the damages are covered.

"It's really devastating to us," Alts said of himself and his wife Teresa. "We've been volunteering here at the lodge for nine years and this pool has been a part of the community for decades. It's the only thing of its kind in town, a free pool for families to enjoy. We're really heartbroken about this."

Alts said that the timeframe for hearing a verdict from the insurance agency is currently "hurry up and wait."

"plumbing in new bathrooms, new rooms, HVAC, fire suppression, and a kitchen." according to Commissioner Lowell Rose. The remodel is estimated to cost close to \$1,000,000. The motion to waive the permit fee was unanimously approved. The Commission made it clear that though the permit fee has been waived, all work must still be up to code and inspected.

In other news, the county considered signing a resubmission application for the CDBG-Mitigation grant to map critical infrastructure within the county. The infrastructure would include the water and sewer lines in the county, and the commission approved the re-submission unanimously, allowing work to go forward.

The commission also dedicated June 15 as Greenbrier County Elder Abuse Awareness Day.

The Greenbrier County Commission meets again on June 21 at 10 a.m. The public is encouraged to attend.

## Ronceverte City Council plans for greenspace and splashpad

The Ronceverte City Council met Monday, June 6 at 7 p.m. at the Clifford Armory to discuss the developments on the Ronceverte greenspace and splashpad, and updates on the ongoing water and sewer line projects.

Representatives on hand with the water line project told council that the project is nearing completion. An engineer was also present to discuss ongoing preparations for sewer line work. First however, it was relayed to the council that the sewer plant work is nearing the one year mark since its completion and is ready to close out and complete.

The mapping and design process has been finished for the next step of the sewer line project. Engineers have been aerially mapping the city after doing rough mock-ups of the city's sewage infrastructure on Google Earth. This project plans to make existing lines more robust through retrofitting and repairing lines in place. This will improve the lifespan of the current infrastructure, and make it more resilient to damage from flooding.

The city passed several resolutions to pay for work done on these projects, totaling \$61,250 and \$6,765.

In other news, the city council updated the public on the current state of the Ronceverte Greenspace and splashpad. Unfortunately, the landscaping company has been unable to dig and lay the concrete pad for the splashpad as recent heavy rains have caused all holes dug to fill with water. This may be a long wait, as more rain in the forecast will delay digging further. However, outdoor structures and furniture are "coming along nicely" according to the council. These features will include benches, tables, and overhead structures like shelters. The council also proclaimed June 15 Elder Abuse Awareness Day in Ronceverte, and encouraged the public to attend the Ronceverte River Festival on Saturday, June 11.

The Ronceverte City Council meets the first Monday of every month in the Clifford Armory Gymnasium at 7 p.m. The public is encouraged to attend.

## DMV issues expiration extension on mobility impaired placards to August 31

Due to a supply issue, the West Virginia Division of Motor Vehicles has announced this week that they will extend the expiration dates of all mobility impaired placards to Aug. 31, 2022.

Renewal of a permanent mobility impaired placard occurs every five years, and the new cycle historically begins on July 1. However, with supply chain issues, and in an effort to provide seamless, convenient customer service, DMV Commissioner Everett Frazier announced the extension to Aug. 31 to make sure new placards are ready for customers.

"I believe in making sure our customers are taken care of. Unfortunately, due to COVID and other supply chain issues, some of our materials are not available. We don't want our customers to be inconvenienced, so extending the expiration date, on my authority, makes the best sense," he said.

## Nature's Way

Stay Off the Grass

Many gardeners have backyard gardens. Mine is “outfront” of my home only because we don’t have much area for growing in the back of the house and it is too shady.

We opted to plant veggies in a big open space in front of our house where we can watch out for deer and other critters, remember to water when rain is lacking, and weed daily. We live in the woods so no one complains about how it “looks.”

Over the decades I found out by living in other states, North and South Carolina being two of them, that certain “upscale” housing developments which have homeowners associations do not allow gardens to be planted anywhere except in the back of your home or not at all. Residents pay homeowners fees and have a whole set of rules and regulations. This is all by choice because they know about these rules when they purchase their home. Here are some of the restrictions that I became aware of over time as I volunteered to be on my former homeowners association committee.

Outdoor clothes lines are not permitted on anyone’s premises. You might ask WHY? Well, some county regulators live with the belief that using the sun’s heat to dry your clothes is a waste of time and no one profits from it. Electric and gas propane dryers are mandatory for your washed clothes. I think the real reason is because hanging your under clothes and such is an eye sore. Hmmm... there’s nothing like the smell of freshly sun dried clothing. There is even an aerosol named Clean White Linen! And frankly, everyone wears underwear, so why should that be an embarrassment? I have an outdoor clothesline.

Only plants that are approved of by the homeowners association can be planted at the home owner’s residence. Things such as vegetables and herbs are not permitted in the front of the home or on the side fences but must go in the backyard. Some places only allow veggies in containers and not directly planted in the ground.

So here’s my solution for the front garden regulations. I’d like to propose that we add an amendment to our constitution that says everyone has the right to grow food anywhere on our own property. Not weeds, but food! Self sufficiency should be applauded rather than discouraged. We argue for other rights with the reasoning that these rights go back to our earliest days as settlers. It doesn’t take any research to acknowledge that people have been growing their own food since, well really, since the beginning of time practically!

These green spaces on everyone’s front lawns (which are mandatory in some developments), can go back from whence they came - wherever that is! Why is America obsessed with green lawns? Yes, they are pretty and neat, especially on golf courses, but why must we all keep feeding, seeding, and watering green blades of grass? Turf has no purpose other than to cover the dirt and use up precious water and gasoline. We all feel the pinch of gasoline prices now, too.

Can I diversify; maybe throw in some clover seeds? Clover produces flowers and the bees love it and feed on it. Clover stays low to the ground, holds the soil and keeps moisture intact under its leaves and looks lovely. When I lived elsewhere, I was told “no,” clover is considered a weed. I don’t want to grow weeds; weeds can be invasive like quack grass or crabgrass.

How about digging up the front lawn and converting a good size of land, usually in full sun, to plant a vegetable garden. Something useful, pretty, and earth friendly. Gardening gives us exercise, fresh air, relief



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from that cell screen, and connects us to the land. We become caretakers of something worth the time and effort rather than this big green plot that requires mowing every week or so. I am amazed when I see how much time we all spend sitting on or pushing our mowers around, or hiring a crew to do it for us.

As individuals, can’t we have something different, flowers, pumpkins maybe, climbing beans, fresh tomatoes? Think of how we could save the expense of transporting produce long distances by growing our own! We have all run into some sorry states of fruits and vegetables at our local stores. Fresh is always best.

Well, I’ll climb down now from my soapbox, friends, but one more question: can we fight this addiction and stay off the grass? Let me remind you, I am not advocating turning front lawns into a messy, unkempt tangle of weeds. Some of what I say can be taken as tongue in cheek, just my opinion, and a bit of kvetching. I, for one, am not addicted to grass! That’s all folks.

## West Virginia Folklife seeks applications for 2022-2023 statewide program

The West Virginia Folklife Program, a project of the West Virginia Humanities Council, is now accepting applications for its statewide Folklife Apprenticeship Program. The program supports West Virginia master traditional artists or tradition bearers working with qualified apprentices on a year-long in-depth apprenticeship in their cultural expression or traditional art form. These apprenticeships of traditional music, dance, craft, foodways, storytelling, and more - in any cultural community in the Mountain State - facilitate the transmission of techniques and artistry of the forms as well as their histories and traditions. The award amount totals to \$3,500; \$3,000 to support the master artist and \$500 to cover the costs of tools and materials for the apprentice. Artists and their proposed apprentice must apply together. Applications and guidelines are available at [wvhumanities.org/folklifeapprenticeships](http://wvhumanities.org/folklifeapprenticeships) or by calling state folklorist Jennie Williams at 304-346-8500. Applications are due Aug. 1, 2022.

The West Virginia Folklife Apprenticeship Program will support up to nine pairs of master traditional artists and their apprentices, culminating in a final public showcase in 2023. Folklife apprenticeship pairs will also hold a public presentation in their home communities. “After witnessing several exciting partnerships develop between the previous folklife apprenticeship pairs, we look forward to working with the next cohort who will carry on their cultural traditions and traditional art forms in their communities for generations to come,” says state folklorist Jennie Williams. This year marks the third round of the biennial program. The 2020-2021 Folklife Apprenticeship Program awarded seven apprenticeship pairs who practiced a range of traditional art forms including old-time banjo of central West Virginia, heirloom seed saving, and storytelling in midwifery.

The West Virginia Folklife Apprenticeship Program is administered by the West Virginia Folklife Program at the West Virginia Humanities Council in Charleston and is supported in part by the National Endowment for the Arts. West Virginia Folklife is dedicated to the documentation, preservation, presentation, and support of West Virginia’s vibrant cultural heritage and living traditions.

## The Back Pew

Life is...busy...in the back pew. But as always, it’s a priority for me to keep you updated on important things happening in our state! Here’s the latest rundown.

**BUDGET SURPLUS:** With one month to go in the fiscal year, our state has a \$1.1 billion surplus. (Many states are experiencing surpluses, largely due to an influx of federal dollars. For example, Virginia has a \$14 billion surplus currently.) What will we do with our surplus? That is the billion-dollar question. I support a mix of infrastructure investments and immediate tax relief for citizens suffering from sky-high inflation. The supermajority has yet to unveil their plans.

**SCHOOL CONSTRUCTION:** Speaking of inflation, school construction costs are going through the roof right now. Nowhere is this seen more clearly than Nicholas County. Two proposed flood rebuilds in Richwood and Summersville are way over budget. But they are not alone. All of the other counties I represent (Fayette, Greenbrier, Monroe, and Summers) are dealing with this problem also. After numerous meetings with architects, contractors, and state government offices, I don’t see school construction prices coming back down much even when inflation settles. This is the new normal. The state and county school systems will need to work together to fully fund our school buildings. Making major cuts to the buildings in order to save pennies on the dollar right now is unwise in the long-term.

**SPECIAL SESSION:** Expect another special session of the legislature in July or possibly as late as September. It will deal with the budget surplus, infrastructure project funding, more rehashes of bills from the last session, and abortion laws. With the US Supreme Court expected to rule on Roe vs Wade this summer, we are hearing that the supermajority plans to add it to the special session since a rollback of Roe would leave abortion policy exclusively to states. Stay tuned.

**COLLINS AEROSPACE:** The largest private employer in Monroe County is the Collins Aerospace plant outside Union, WV. They make commercial and military aerospace components. It’s technical, sometimes dangerous, and vitally important work done by the local residents. Over the years, the relationship between the plant and the community has been mutually beneficial. The jobs pay well and the workers provide an excellent product for the international market. Both parties are at a critical stage now after workers were locked out last week by Collins due to a labor dispute. The workers deserve a fair contract. The plant is critical to our local economy. The products made at Collins protect national security. It’s in everyone’s best interest to arrive at a fair agreement as soon as possible. I was honored to visit with the workers last week and put their leadership in touch with state resources to assist their families while they cannot draw a paycheck.

**FOSTER CARE DASHBOARD:** On June 1, the DHHR debuted an online foster care dashboard. For the first time, it contains public information about how many children are in foster care, what type of placement they have, in-state versus out-of-state placements, vacancy rates in county Child Protective Services offices, and more. This may seem like a small thing, but it’s a huge step forward that’s taken years of work. It was in the foster care bill that died this past legislative session, but we finally got it done. It will allow us to have solid information for the very first time on the foster care situation, which will allow us the opportunity to make better policy to serve children in foster care. It can be found on the WV DHHR website.

**CALENDAR:** Several folks suggested recently that I make my calendar of public events available. With five counties, I spend a lot of time on the road traveling across the state and district. This way, folks would know when I’ll be in their neck of the woods. I’ll start making that available on my Facebook page. Look forward to seeing you in your neighborhood!

That’s the view from the back pew, where it is my privilege to serve you.

## Over \$5.4M in Community Corrections Grants awarded

Gov. Jim Justice announced that he has awarded \$5,417,061 in West Virginia Community Corrections Grant Program funds to 30 projects. These funds will be used to assist local communities in the establishment and continued operation of community corrections programs.

The West Virginia Community Corrections Grant Program is intended to provide a means for communities to develop, establish, and maintain community-based corrections programs to provide the judicial system with sentencing alternatives for those offenders who may require less than institutional custody. These funds are administered by the Justice and Community Services section of the West Virginia Division of Administrative Services.

Local projects receiving funding include:

- Greenbrier County Commission: \$260,000. These funds will be utilized for the continued operation of a community corrections program in Greenbrier County.
- Pocahontas County Commission: \$51,000. These funds will be utilized for the continued operation of a community corrections program in Pocahontas County.
- Summers County Commission: \$115,000. These funds will be utilized for the continued operation of a community corrections program in Summers and Monroe Counties.

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## Former GVT associate artistic director becomes Dolly in new production

Former Lewisburg City Council member and Associate Artistic Director at Greenbrier Valley Theater (GVT), Kim Morgan-Dean, will be working a hard shift in her newest role as she takes on Dolly Parton's role in the stage adaptation of the classic film "9 to 5," at the Barter Theatre in Abingdon, VA.

That respect also contributed to the difficulty of this role. "People in this region are so familiar with her and love her so much, so it's been a very invigorating challenge to try and study her and learn her and pay homage to her without doing just a bad impression of her."

Dean also gives credit to the backstage staff at the Barter. "Perhaps no one looks less like Dolly than me, but we have such a great makeup and wardrobe department here at the Barter and they've really pulled it off brilliantly."

About the Barter Theatre:

The Barter Theatre, the oldest continuously used stage theater in the United States, was opened in 1933 as a response by Appalachian transplant and Broadway actor Robert Porterfield. Porterfield saw the economic hardship around him in New York and knew that things were even worse in his home among the south western Virginia hills. He moved home to give access to arts and theater to his hometown. However, circumstances being as they were in The Great Depression, the theater accepted the foodstuffs and goods from local farms as payment. Their first tagline read, "Ham for Hamlet," after all. This payment proved successful, and the theater has been known as the Barter as a result ever since.

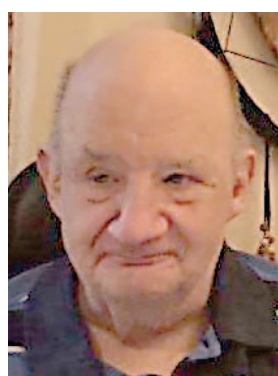

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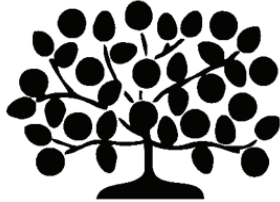

## Bluegrass Festival returns to Ronceverte

New Skyline Productions, Inc. is excited to announce it will present "Skyline on the River," a tribute to the original Skyline Bluegrass Festival on Saturday, July 16, from 5 to 10 p.m. in the Amphitheatre located in Island Park, Ronceverte.

The original festival took place on the Blake Family mountaintop farm overlooking the Greenbrier River above the town of Ronceverte from 1976 - 1985. Bill Blake and Bill Simms, both of Ronceverte, were the promoters. Records show that between 10,000-15,000 individuals (many camping out) from across the United States gathered on this mountaintop farm to enjoy this three-day event.

The festival's lineup over the years included the likes of the legendary Bill Monroe and The Bluegrass Boys, John Hartford, Doc and Merle Watson, Ralph Stanley and The Clinch Mountain Boys, Seldom Scene, J.D. Crowe and The New South, Norman and Nancy Blake, The Doug Dillard Band, The Osborne Brothers, John Prine, Elmer Bird, Billy Bowden and The Bluegrass Connection, The Buffalo Gals (all females and unique in bluegrass music history), along with a host of other stellar local and national artists.

The original Skyline Bluegrass Festival was formed to preserve and advance the tradition of Bluegrass and Newgrass music in WV. It was the first and largest in the state. Admission was only \$12! New Skyline Productions, Inc. is committed to embracing and continuing this purpose. This new 501(c)3 has been formed to bring this widely popular event back to the River City in its outdoor Amphitheatre situated on the beautiful Greenbrier River. The stage is covered, but there is a nearby rain location (Clifford Armory in Ronceverte) secured in case of inclement weather. For this first year, there will be no admission charge.

Unfortunately, several of the bluegrass greats that appeared at the original festival have gone up to the big bluegrass stage in the sky. 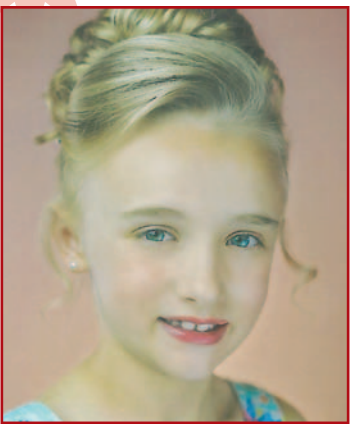

- Small, enclosed spaces, such as airport jetways
- Public transportation during periods when the ventilation system is off and windows are closed (e.g., when the engine is turned off on an airplane)

#### When should I wear a mask in travel and public transportation settings?

# DHHR Urges Residents to Take Steps to Prevent Tickborne Diseases



The West Virginia Department of Health and Human Resources, Bureau for Public Health urges residents to take preventive measures against tickborne diseases. Tickborne diseases are spread through the bite of an infected tick and many of these diseases can also infect pets.

According to the Office of Epidemiology and Prevention Services in DHHR's Bureau for Public Health, Lyme disease is the most common tickborne disease reported in West Virginia. Preliminary numbers indicate in 2021, there were 1,542 Lyme disease cases across the state with others still being investigated. In comparison, there were 1,062 confirmed Lyme disease cases in 2020.

From 2015-2020, there were more than 3,939 Lyme disease cases reported across the state

representing a 271% increase. Historically limited to the Eastern Panhandle, Lyme disease has progressively become more common in northern, eastern, and central West Virginia. In 2017, West Virginia was designated a high incidence Lyme disease state.

Anaplasmosis, ehrlichiosis, and Rocky Mountain Spotted Fever have also been reported in West Virginia, with about 1-10 cases of each per year. Tickborne infections can cause a variety of symptoms including fever, headache, chills, myalgia, and rash. Most infections occur from late spring through early fall when ticks are most active.

"Tick exposure can happen any time of the year, but is most common during summer months," said Dr. Ayne Amjad, State Health Officer and Commissioner for DHHR's Bureau

for Public Health. "The most effective way to prevent tickborne diseases is to use tick repellent when you are in wooded and brushy areas."

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention provides the following tips when coming indoors: check your clothing for ticks, examine gear and pets, shower soon after being outdoors, and check your body for ticks.

When seeking medical assistance, it's important to save any ticks that may have been involved with a bite which may help medical staff identify the tick. Medical treatments are effective in treating tickborne diseases and can prevent severe complications when given early in the course of infection.

### Canning and Preserving Your Garden Goodies

Canning is a great way to be able to enjoy local fruits and vegetables all year round. However, it is important that canning equipment is kept in peak condition to get the most out of

your canning efforts. West Virginia University Extension's Greenbrier County office offers free dial gauge pressure canner testing and information on canning all your garden goodies.

"Having a pressure canner tested at a local WVU Extension office allows individuals to help safeguard their canned foods, as well

as the hard work and time involved with the canning process," says Extension Agent Andi Hoover. A pressure canner that is working correctly not only seals in food flavor, but using high heat exposure along with pressure, makes certain that air has escaped, and kills bacteria enzymes.

Taking the necessary steps, like having canners tested, making sure you know what to pressure can and what to process in a boiling water bath—helps reduce the chance of food spoilage. All low acid foods such as green beans and other vegetables as

well as meat must be processed in a pressure canner; while high acid foods like tomatoes and fruits can be processed in a boiling water bath.

If you did not use the correct processing procedure (pressure can or water bath), your jars may be sealed, but they may have also sealed in unwanted bacteria as well. New strains of bacteria are being discovered every day that can cause serious illness. The canning process using heat and/or pressure is what kills bacteria. Make sure you are following recipes from the USDA, Ball Blue

Book or an Extension Service.

Don't waste your time or your fruits and vegetables. Make sure to follow the rules with canning and get your dial gauge pressure canner tested for free at the WVU Extension Service Greenbrier County office, located on Maplewood Ave across from the State Fair entrance. On April 12, 2022, Appalachian Power Company (APCO) and Wheeling Power Company (WPCo) (together, the Companies) filed an Amended Application, duly verified, for approval of a written plan to construct utility infrastructure at a West Virginia business ready site (the "Project") and associated cost recovery, pursuant to W.Va. Code § 24-2-1n. The total net cost of the Project is expected to be \$35.6 million.

The Project will involve the construction of transmission and distribution facilities within and into the Raleigh County Memorial Airport Industrial Park, located within APCO's service territory, which facilities will be capable of serving initial customer load up to 30MW and potentially up to 60MW with additional investment. The goal of the Project is to retain existing industrial customers and attract new industrial customers to the benefit of the local and state economies.

The Companies' application is on file with and available for public inspection at the Public Service Commission, 201 Brooks Street, Charleston, WV 25301.
