The 69th Buchanan Carnival begins on June 29 at the town fairgrounds.

The kickoff for this year's carnival is Thursday, June 29 with activities continuing through Saturday, July 8. (The carnival is closed on Sunday, July 3.) Food stands open by 6 p.m. each evening with rides opening at 6:30 p.m.

For more than six decades, seventy-five plus volunteers gather each evening during Carnival to welcome visitors to the Buchanan Town Park. Discover a colorful midway filled with family oriented games and rides provided by Coles Amusements, and, great food prepared and served by the volunteers including ice cream, "Carnival Burgers," Petros, hot dogs, and Buchanan's famous Carnival Fries.

The Second Annual BOCO Wild took place Saturday, June 10 at Buchanan Town Park and was an amazing event for the Botetourt community

BOCO Wild is a partnership between Botetourt Parks and Recreation and the Department of Wildlife Resources. Formerly known as the Botetourt Fishing Carnival, which began in 2001, BOCO Wild encompasses a diverse array of outdoor activities. Some highlights from the event included:

- 650 participants enjoyed a variety of outdoor activities including rock climbing, trout fishing, kayaking, archery, air rifle target shooting, hunting education, boating education, casting lessons, and more. The attendees in 2023 doubled last year's attendance.
- The first 300 children received a T-shirt, backpack, and lunch.





This is a close up of one corner of a large 45" by 65" map that is now displayed at the Botetourt Museum. It was donated by Ed Holt, the new president of Botetourt County Historical Society, Inc.

The map was authorized by an 1816 act of the Virginia General Assembly. Maps were to show all Virginia counties with their physical features, roads, ferries, towns, houses of worship and public houses (taverns). John Wood was recommended by Thomas Jefferson to be the chief surveyor. In 1821 Botetourt was one of the last

Two copies of every map were made. One was kept in Richmond and the other was given to the Clerk of the Court of each county. Come to see what Botetourt included and learn more at 26 East Main Street in Fincastle.



First Bank recently announced the recipients of their annual First Bank Fall Run scholarships. Each year two senior high school students are selected to receive a \$1000 scholarship based upon their exceptional academic achievement, involvement in school running sports, and participation in the race.

Michael Jorgensen of James River High School has taken part in the run since first grade, placing 3rd in the men's 5K in 2022. Michael placed 5th in regional cross country in 2022, 3rd in the regional 3200m outdoor track and 7th in state the same year. In 2023 he placed 1st in regional cross country and placed 7th in state. During high school, he was a member of the cross country and indoor and outdoor track teams, actively involved with golf, wrestling and cheerleading activities for James River high school. His leadership and community volunteer activities are numerous, including designing and building the LOVE sign for display in honor of veterans at the New Freedom Farm in Buchanan,. Michael highlights his plans for running after high school, "Running helps me to process things going on in my life. It gives me a chance to clear my head and focus on the run, my breath, and being outside." Michael has been accepted into the Electrical and Computer Engineering Department at VMI. He is in communication with the team to possibly run as a first year VMI

Lord Botetourt graduate Tymothy Fitzgerald has participated in the First Bank Fall Run since 2018. While in high school he was involved in the 100m, 200m, long jump, wrestling and earned a varsity letter in 2020 for track. He is a member of FOR Club, Botetourt Buddies, Coding Club, BTEC and is an A/B Honor Roll student. His community and volunteer activities are many. "Running has always been a way for me to release. Stress is one of the biggest killers for someone. When I run and work myself, I release that stress and emotion into something better and better myself for the greater good," said Tymothy. He plans to attend Randolph

College in the fall and continue running







"They are very easy to work with," Hayfield said. "My job is to give council all the options they need to make

informed decisions. There is quite a bit going on here at the time."

At last Monday's Town Council meeting, council voted to get a few much-needed maintenance projects underway that include a backup water generator at Carson Hill as well as paving projects in alleyways connecting Main and Lowe Streets and the firehouse. Most of these projects will utilize the ARPA funds (approximately \$490,214) the town still needs to spend before the

Hayfield is also involved in the ongoing revitalization of two properties in town: the Factory Flats project and the renovation of the old high

school being redeveloped into a dozen "In just the time I've been here, a

number of buildings have been totally redone and renovated and started up again," Hayfield added. "And a lot of buildings are also seeing major improvements in the downtown area."

Some of the key issues in any town are water and sewer, which Hayfield is already working to improve the town's infrastructure to make sure the well system is receiving enough power. In the last two months, Hayfield put together a plan so that all wells in town are covered with two permanent generators and one that is portable.

Hayfield's main advantage to his work within the town is that he's an experienced administrator. He is an ICMA Credentialed Manager and has 15 years' experience as a planner. Hayfield arrived in Buchanan after working in Glasgow, and he served as town manager in Scott County and the Town of Louisa. He also previously served as city manager in Johnstown, Pa., and worked in administration in North Carolina, Tennessee, and Colorado. He holds a bachelor's degree in Geography and Cartography from Loch Haven and a graduate's degree in Urban Planning from Indiana University.

I watched the coronation of King Charles in May and was amazed at the gold and jewelry on display in the crowns, crosses and anywhere you might stick a diamond, ruby or sapphire. Then I saw the Chiefs'

championship ring. The Chiefs unveiled their championship rings last week and they're a sight to behold. It seems like every year the current champion tries to out-do the previous one, and I'm pretty certain the Chiefs have accomplished that.

First off, the ring includes 609 round diamonds, 16 baguette diamonds, whatever a baguette is, and four marquise diamonds. That's 629 diamonds on one ring!! If I didn't know better I wouldn't think you could get 100 diamonds on a ring, much less 629.

I'm wondering who all gets those rings. Certainly everyone on the 45-man roster and let's say another five or six on the practice squad. Let's round it off to 50 players.

Along diamonds each Super Bowl ring also has 35 custom cut rubies, since the Chiefs' color scheme is red. And, get this, the top of the ring comes off and inside Arrowhead Stadium is revealed with a pair of Lombardi Trophies on the

"Winning a Super Bowl is the crowning achievement for NFL club, and championship ring is the ultimate symbol of the hard work, dedication and sacrifice that it takes from everyone in the organization to reach this pinnacle," Chiefs President Mark Donovan said, via a press release.

Okay, that's great, but over 700 rings were given I'd be scared to wear the thing. It would be like standing outside the casino counting 100 dollar bills. You're just asking for someone to hit you over the head and take off with the ring.

And, in a more practical vein, how are you going to get something out of your pocket? With 664 stones, counting diamonds and rubies, that has be a pretty good sized ring. If you feel a sneeze coming on that would be a challenge to get your handkerchief out of your pocket in time.
