## Town of Fincastle makes plan to spend remaining ARPA funds

Fincastle Town Council met at the Fincastle Volunteer Fire Department training room for its August meeting last Thursday night.

Mayor Mary Bess Smith gave her monthly report following the approval of the monthly bills and treasurer's report. In it, Smith said that during an infrastructure committee meeting two weeks ago, the committee made note that the town currently has \$270,000 in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding that still needs to be spent by 2026 on infrastructure work that is outside of the town's normal maintenance and repair activities.

ARPA is a federal stimulus bill to aid public health and economic recovery from the COVID-19 pandemic signed by President Joe Biden on March 11, 2021. Recipients must obligate ARPA funds by Dec. 31, 2024, and spend them by Dec. 31, 2026.



The Botetourt County School Board held the regular meeting for August on Monday night in Fincastle just as the students and teachers returned to their classrooms for day one of the 2024-2025 school year. This meeting was postponed from last Thursday's scheduled meeting due to weather conditions.



to volunteer to serve and frequently takes







### Lord Botetourt graduate selected for State Department Fellowship

These projects are challenging and the teachers selected represent the best of the U.S. TESOL community. In return, the program provides professional development opportunities to help participants experience different cultures and build skills that can greatly enhance their TESOL careers back home.

English Language Fellows are counted among the more than 50,000 individuals participating in U.S. Department of State exchange programs each year. The Fellow Program is administered by the Center for Intercultural Education and Development at Georgetown University.



Artificial Intelligence (AI) has captured the world's attention, but it has also captured the attention of criminal scammers. One area where AI scams are particularly dangerous is celebrity impostor scams.

For many years, criminals have impersonated celebrities online to steal from fans. Fake celebrity profiles offer fans personal connection, investment opportunities, or the chance to support favorite charities.

AI has allowed criminals to make these scams more realistic than ever with "deepfake" videos. With this technology, criminals can create videos where it looks and sounds like the celebrity is speaking, but it is in fact completely computer generated. Criminal scammers have used this technology for anything from fake product endorsements to promotions for bogus VIP ticket sales.

Posting on a celebrity's social media account might be exciting, but it could put you at risk of this impostor scam. In whatever way you choose to enjoy your favorite celebs, do so recognizing that an opportunity to connect with them personally is likely a scam.
