Board receives courthouse build update

Recent progress on the eventual renovations to the Botetourt County Courthouse brought forth an update at last week's Botetourt County Board of Supervisors meeting.

Botetourt County Capital Projects Manager Rich Evans gave the board report about the ongoing negotiations and recent agreements involving the renovation project. Most notably, the project will finally see some movement at the turn of the year following another set of bid negotiations that will continue until sometime in November.

Over the last two years, progress on the renovations has slowed. The county removed the project's original contractor (KNA Contracting) last year. The original project was set to be completed in two phases. The first phase was moving the historical files out of the courthouse, setting an infrastructure to tear down

Datapath and county reach land lease agreement for communications tower construction

Botetourt County continues work on replacing the aging public safety emergency communications system. At last Tuesday's meeting of the Botetourt County Board of Supervisors, the board unanimously approved a land lease agreement with Datapath Wireless Group, LLC for the build of a new communications tower on county-owned land at the landfill on Catawba Road.

begin in early 2025.

Emergency Systems Communications Manager Matthew Hinkle noted during his presentation to the board last week that this agreement is "step one of many steps" brought to the board for approval.

The board approved a contract with Motorola Solutions Inc. to replace the aging emergency communications system last December. As a part of the contract with Motorola, the county is responsible for constructing a communications tower at the landfill property owned by the county, according to the meeting's agenda

County staff negotiated agreement with with Wireless Datapath Group to construct the communications

with no capital outlay from the county. Datapath will lease approximately one acre of land from the county for the construction of the new tower. The county will lease space from Datapath on the tower for the new emergency communications system. In addition, Datapath will lease space on the tower to third-party wireless carriers.

Datapath will lease the approximately one acre of land for \$1,000 per month. The initial term of the lease is for 20 years with an option for four five-year extensions.

will lease tower and ground space from Datapath on the parcel, for the emergency communications system, at a rate of \$3,250 per month. The initial term is for 20 years with an option for four five-year extensions.

Benefits of arrangement with Datapath

The county will be able to lease space on a tower that is strategically located for the maximum effect of the emergency communications system without a large capital outlay from taxpayers.

area, to include portions of the Appalachian Trail, will receive greater cell phone coverage as wireless carriers co-locate on the tower. The expanded cell phone coverage will

increase public safety by allowing callers to reach E-911 during emergencies.



Unlike Senior Social events no presentation will be given at the Senior Services Day event. A free lunch of hot dogs, chips and slaw will be provided. No prior registration is





This traditional rectangular wooden washboard has galvanized steel ridges for scrubbing clothes. It is a "Standard Family Size No. 25" manufactured by Carolina Washboard Co., Raleigh, N.C. It was donated to the Botetourt Museum of History & Culture by Patty King. Before the invention of the washing machine in the early 1900s, the washboard was an essential tool. The exact date washboards were invented is unknown, but in 1797 American James King received the first known patent. Recently, washboards have been used to make music. Educational tours will be given to all Botetourt fifth grade students in late September through early October. This artifact, along with others, is often discussed by the Education Committee.

Plane crashes in Botetourt Sunday morning

Fincastle Volunteer Fire Department Company 4 was dispatched for a possible airplane crash on Sunday morning. As shared by the department in a social media post on Sunday, the station's rescue engine responded to the 400 block of Shawnee Trail where it located a small passenger aircraft that had crash-landed in a field. Crews located two patients still

inside the aircraft and assisted with their removal. One patient was flown by Carilion Clinic Lifeguard 10 to Roanoke Memorial Hospital; the other patient was transported by ambulance.

After hazards were mitigated, the scene was turned over to Virginia State Police for investigation.

Personal property tax relief act for 2024 approved by Board of Supervisors

The Botetourt County Board of Supervisors unanimously approved the Personal Property Tax Relief Act (PPTRA) read by County Finance Director Tony Zerrilla at last week's meeting that establishes the percentage reduction for personal property tax relief at 42% for Botetourt County for the 2024 tax year.

According to the meeting's agenda notes, in December 2005, the board adopted ordinance amendments regarding the PPTRA. amendments addressed the new reimbursement method for car tax relief for vehicle values from \$1,001 to \$20,000, with no taxing of vehicles having a value of \$1,000 or less. A state block grant (\$3,418,137.01) has been received annually each year since 2006; this amount will remain unchanged in future years unless General Assembly legislation is enacted. This fixed amount has served to reduce the state's subsidy from a targeted 70% (prior to 2006 under the Car Tax Program) to a smaller percentage.

In determining how to distribute relief among county taxpayers, the board adopted the Specific Relief Method in December 2005. This method gives localities the option to apply state relief on a per-vehicle basis and show the specific amount of relief on each tax bill. This method is reflected in the

county's current billing format.

This year, based upon projected vehicle values and the amount of tax relief to be provided by the state, the county's reimbursement is projected to be 42% based upon providing county citizens with the \$3.4 million state block grant. For 2023, the approved relief percentage was 41%, with the taxpayer portion set at 59% of the full

Therefore, the tax burden to Botetourt County citizens based on this year's recommended relief percentage versus last year's recommended percentage decreases from 59% to 58%. The 2024 relief (42%) and taxpayer portion (58%) percentages take into consideration the impact of changes in used car values, an increase in the number of qualifying vehicles, and a decrease in the assessed values base.

This calculation is mandated by the Virginia General Assembly. Team members involved in this task were the Treasurer and Commissioner of Revenue. As required by the state, the Board of Supervisors is required to annually adopt a resolution setting the percentage reduction in personal property for that year.

Botetourt County receives state recognition VACo Award for BOCO Facts4U initiative

The Virginia Association of Counties (VACo) has announced the 45 recipients of the 2024 Achievement Awards, which recognizes excellence in local government programs. Botetourt County is being recognized for the BOCO Facts4U initiative (www.botetourtva.gov/817/ BOCO-Facts-4-U).

The BOCO Facts 4U page was created in March 2024 to correct misinformation spread through the grapevine and via social media in the county. The county appreciates its residents who seek truth over false information shared throughout our community and believe that great discussions of county issues must be based on facts and not assumptions, innuendo, or false

The Botetourt County Office of Communications led this initiative to control rumors and false claims. They began by researching what other localities were doing and reached out to counterparts in Salisbury, N.C., who had launched a rumor control website. After discussing

their successes and potential pitfalls, Communications Director Tiffany Bradbury recommended launching a similar site for Botetourt County to county administration and elected officials.

The goal of the page is not to address every rumor but to focus on issues brought up by numerous individuals. Recognizing the importance of effective public engagement, especially in an era where misinformation is easily accessible and spreads at the click of a button, the

Local collection services awarded 'franchise areas,' board raises rate

The Botetourt County Board of Supervisors recently awarded five waste collection services "franchise areas" to provide services beginning January 1, 2025. Deputy County Administrator David Moorman provided information regarding the recent decision during last Tuesday's meeting in Daleville.

Moorman explained that local curbside waste collection services are provided for and regulated through a competitive franchise system. Every seven years, the county issues a Request for Proposals (RFP) from private collection companies to provide curbside waste collection services to residents and businesses.

Based on the proposals received and interviews, the committee recommended the award of franchises as follows:

- Area 1 (Blue Ridge) GFL Environmental Area 2 (Troutville) - Kesslers
- Garbage Service
- Area 3 (Fincastle) Kelley's
- Garbage Collection Service Area 4 (Buchanan) - C&S
- Disposal
- Area 5 (Eagle Rock/Oriskany) -WasteCo

In addition to awarding franchises, the county regulates how much collection companies may charge customers. The current maximum allowable monthly charge is \$22. Based on company proposals and inflationary increases over the past seven years, the committee recommended that the board establish a maximum monthly

collection rate of \$24 for the new franchise term. The county is divided into five

franchise areas and collection companies were invited to apply to serve one or more franchise areas. Botetourt's current collection franchises terminate December 31, 2024.

Six companies submitted proposals. Proposals were evaluated by an evaluation committee consisting of Moorman, Supervisors Walter Michael (Blue Ridge), and Brandon Nicely (Fincastle) with assistance from Solid Waste Manager Greg Hannah and support from Purchasing Manager Kim Hartman. The committee interviewed representatives of all six companies. The companies were: C&S Disposal, GFL Environmental, Kelley's Garbage Collection Service, Kesslers Garbage, Service Meridian Waste Virginia, and WasteCo.

Additionally, these haulers will also collect recyclable materials at no additional charge to residents. The county will continue to encourage participation in this service, as shared by Moorman. Fincastle Supervisor Brandon

Nicely added, "It went really well. Very professional. It's amazing that we have private contractors and very little complaints. Hats off to them."

Blue Ridge Supervisor Walter Michael noted the "seamless process" when making the decision of which franchises to award the private collection companies.

DAR: Our Patriot Ancestors

Roger Gregory

In recognition of the upcoming 250th celebration of the adoption of the Declaration of Independence, the DAR America 250! Committee of the Botetourt County Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution is placing a spotlight on members' Patriot ancestors who helped the country achieve American Independence. Roger Gregory is the Patriot ancestor of associate member Alice Sue Hodge. Roger Gregory was born on May 1,

1729 in King and Queen County, Va., to Richard Gregory and Agnes West Gregory. He was first married to Mary Cole Claiborne in 1756 and had six children. Mary died in 1771. In 1776, he married Frances Garland Lowry of Lunenburg County, Va., and had three more children.

Roger Gregory was a magistrate in

King William County in 1764, 1766, and 1771. He moved to Lunenburg about 1775 and supplied beef to the army. He moved to Mecklenburg County prior to 1784 where he served as justice of the peace in 1784, was a member of the House of Delegates in 1786, and sheriff of Mecklenburg from 1799-1801.

Roger died on October 2, 1803 in



James River falls to Buffalo Gap in football season opener

The James River football team got the season off to a rough start with a 41-3 loss to the Bison in Buffalo Gap last Friday. The Knights couldn't solve the single-wing offense the home team employed.

"Rough night in Swoope," said River coach Tim Jennings. "They run that single wing and they ran it much better than what we saw on film. And they were so much more physical than we were. We're going to have to play much more physical football."

The Bison led 25-3 at the half as the only points River put on the board was a field goal by sophomore Knox Taylor. That came after the Knights recovered a fumble on the Buffalo Gap three with a little over half the first quarter gone. River failed to punch it in but Taylor kicked a 20-yard field goal to cut the lead to 6-3 at the time.

That would be River's last points of the game, although Gavin Binns had two long touchdowns called back by penalties, a 64-yard run and a 55-yard reception. Binns ended up rushing for 37 yards on 11

"We just didn't execute our game plan," said Jennings. Whatever we did, they had an answer for. They were substantially better than last year."


