Fincastle Town Council receives audit results, discusses RVTPO boundary fitting

Fincastle Town Council heard an audit presentation from Corbin Stone, CPA of Robinson Farmer Cox Associates, during council's regular monthly meeting in Fincastle last Thursday night.

According to Stone, the audit "went well" with the town receiving "an unqualified/unmodified opinion." The audit was completed this past spring with the town's financial statements being "materially correct" and in good order. Stone's firm performs an audit of the town's General Fund and Water and Sewer funds annually.

Stone went over some of the numbers and nuances in the town's financial statements. The town's general fund balance at the end of the year was \$335,000 with assets and liabilities increased over prior years. Stone explained to council that the impact of the Big Spring Park grants causes these balances to increase until the funds can be spent for approved projects. In addition, the Water and Sewer Fund has also increased due to ARPA funds that were not expended as of the end of the accounting period.

Stone recommended that the town

Captain Dillow graduates from the FBI National Academy

The Botetourt County Sheriff's Office (BCSO) has announced that Captain David Dillow has successfully graduated from the 291st session of the prestigious FBI National Academy in Quantico, Va. The 291st session of the National Academy consisted of men and women from 47 states, the District of Columbia, and Guam. The class included members of law enforcement agencies from 26 countries, seven military organizations, and seven federal civilian organizations. Captain Dillow joins a group of law enforcement professionals who have undergone one of the most rigorous and respected training programs in the

The FBI National Academy, internationally known for its academic excellence, offers 10 weeks of advanced communication, leadership, and fitness training. Participants must have proven records as professionals within their agencies to attend. On average, these officers have 21 years of law enforcement experience and usually return to their agencies to serve in executive-level positions.

Captain Dillow's participation in the 10-week program exemplifies his



Weekday Religious Education (WRE) has been active in Botetourt County since 1936. That year, the Botetourt County Council of WRE began offering a weekly Bible Class to elementary students in the classroom during the school day.

When WRE was no longer allowed in the public school classrooms sometime during the 1970s, WRE converted a school bus into a portable classroom which traveled from school to school offering the Bible Class to students who (with parental consent) were permitted




