# Buchanan voters make history on Election Day

For the first time in the town's history, Town Hall will have a female majority in leadership

The Town of Buchanan residents made history during the November 5 elections making their choice for Sue Way as the town's next mayor. The former educator received 62% of the vote with Marine veteran and former Town Council member Chris Witt receiving 36%. Way will become the first-ever female mayor of Buchanan.

That isn't all in terms of Buchanan's historic Election Day. Edith "Sissy" Austin (27%) and James Manspile (27%) were voted onto Town Council after receiving half the votes over candidates Brenda Noszek (19%), Daniel Bratcher (18%), and Brent Witt (7%). This is a re-election for Manspile, while Austin will serve on council for the first time.

Why is this historic? Now, the town has a female majority of leadership with Way and Austin joining current council member Rose Jeter and Buchanan Town Manager Angela Lawrence, along with returning councilmen Marty Rickman and Manspile. Way's and Austin's professional experience and familiarity with Buchanan, along with Jeter and Lawrence's collective leadership experience, have the town's future looking bright.

Jeter joined Buchanan Town Council in 2023.

# Botetourt County celebrates its proud, local veterans

Botetourt County veterans were honored during programs over the last week. Members of the community expressed their thanks and gratitude celebrating veterans and active military in assemblies at local elementary schools, churches, and municipalities.

Elementary Buchanan School presented a Veterans Day assembly last Friday where music teacher Beth Radford conducted students from each grade level performing patriotic songs. A "wall of honor" in the school's cafeteria commemorated the names of local veterans, some of whom were in attendance for the program.

Buchanan Elementary students helped in providing the list of names for the wall that included "Thank You" cards to each veteran. Radford read off the list of names prior to the musical performances.

"Our goal is to teach our students to love our country and the value of service to it," Radford said when asked about last Friday's assembly. "We should be thankful to the men and women who have sacrificed so much to help ensure our freedom and future growth. We hope our program will express our love and gratitude to all who have served the United States of America."

Additionally, a "field of flags" was installed outside of the elementary school for the local veterans honored during last Friday's ceremony.

On Veterans Day, the Troutville Sunshine Girls hosted their 15th annual

The Botetourt YMCA is offering after school care services at Eagle Rock Elementary School. Due to this year being the first year the Botetourt Y providing after school care to Eagle Rock, the non-profit organization is waiving the registration fee to all applicants during the 2024-2025 school year.

Currently, the YMCA of Virginia's Blue Ridge offers Y After School experiences in select Botetourt, Roanoke City, Salem, Roanoke County, and Rockbridge

The Botetourt YMCA believes the values and skills learned early on are vital building blocks for life. Its enrichment curriculum provides children with opportunity to explore their unique talents and interests, helping them realize their potential.

"When people think about the YMCA, they think about 'the swim and the gym,'" Botetourt YMCA Executive Director Rob Lough said

in a recent interview. "The Y is also a large provider of childcare in Botetourt County. That comes through summer camp and our 'Y After School' program at our Early Learning Center."

Y After School is gap care for families providing child care after school until parents can pick up their kids. The three major components of the program are: homework help, recreational activities,

# Election Day notes from around Botetourt

Botetourt County voters shared their want for change during the November 5 elections. Polling places throughout the county saw an uptick in participation during the 2024 presidential election cycle. Locally, 21,716 voters filed their ballots out

of the county's 27,222 registered voters, according to the Department of Elections. The 2020 presidential election saw 21,063 voters (over 600 less) turn out in the county.

It started at the top as Republican nominee Donald Trump will become the 47th President of the United





America 250! Committee of the Botetourt County Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution is placing a spotlight on memners ancestors who helped the country achieve Âmerican Independence. Captain David McNabb is the Patriot ancestor of member Joy McNabb.

Captain David McNabb, a Revolutionary War officer, was born February 22, 1757. The Rev. John Craig married David and Elizabeth Taylor in 1778 in the Augusta Stone Church which, at that time, was a "pole" or log building located on land east of what is now Route 11. The building came to be known as Fort Defiance and offered protection during raids by Indians. This church has been Presbyterian from the inception in 1740 and exists today as the Old Stone Meeting House in Staunton.

inhabitants west of the Blue Ridge were

David McNabb had an 11-year war record, the first being against the Indians and then against the British which lasted from 1770 until 1781. David McNabb raised his own Company against Major Patrick Ferguson, a Scottish officer in the British Army; Captain McNabb his company helped defeat Ferguson in the Battle of King's Mountain on October 7, 1780. He served the state of North Carolina with General McDowell and General Marion and led a company in the Battle of Moncks Corner. Captain McNabb served under Brigadier General James Robertson, who was a companion of Daniel Boone and was a co-founder of Nashville, Tenn.

David and Landon Carter were members of a committee appointed by the Tennessee General Assembly in 1796 to locate and name the site for the county seat of Carter County, Tenn. The

committee named the county seat Elizabethton, as David McNabb's wife and Landon Carter's wife were both named Elizabeth. David McNabb died May 13, 1826 in Carter County,

Elizabeth McNabb was born in 1757. She had two brothers, Andrew Taylor, who married Isabella McNabb, sister of David McNabb and Nathaniel Taylor, who became a Brigadier General in the Revolutionary Army. In 1838 she applied for and received a Revolutionary War Pension for her husband's service; Elizabeth died June 20, 1849.

# Historical 'Ginger Gungus' event will offer a tasty treat

Buchanan will be the site of both a historical story-telling and dessert tasting to kick-off the holiday season Saturday, November 16, 10:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. at the Wilson Warehouse, 421 Lowe Street. The event is a joint effort of the Botetourt County Libraries and the Buchanan Town Improvement Society, owner of the Wilson Warehouse.

In 19th century Buchanan, next to the historic 1839 Wilson Warehouse, was a small log cabin in which a local woman baked and sold a ginger dessert, referred to as "Ginger Gungus." The dessert was sold to locals and to people who arrived on James River & Kanawha Canal boats that docked in Buchanan. The cabin was still standing in the 1950s.

The popularity of Ginger Gungus was so great, that the recipe has endured into the 21st century. The recipe was part of the "Ginger Gungus Cookbook," now out of print, and later became part of the "Simply Love Buchanan" cookbook. At the November 16 event, attendees may taste this old-time recipe and enjoy other desserts from the

cookbook (bring your own dessert treats to share, if you like).

Special guest is artist Bonnie Williams from Cape Charles, Va., who illustrated the line drawings in the original "Ginger Gungus Cookbook." She will be available to sign the "Simply Love Buchanan" cookbook, whether you bring your own or acquire one at the event. If you own a "Ginger Gungus Cookbook," bring it to be signed.





He and his best friend, Rhudy Scaggs, would continue their love of the outdoors by hiking in the Grand Canyon, the Peaks of Otter in Bedford County, and other trails. Rhudy and Bob would travel to many places in the U.S. with their wives and enjoy the sites, scenes, and camaraderie of these trips.

One of Bob's early pastimes was Scouting. He attained Life Scout during his time as a Scout. His son, Mark, attained Eagle Scout, his grandson, Adam Woodie, achieved Eagle Scout, and his grandson, Keith Cook, reached Life Scout in the same childhood troop Bobbie had joined in the 1940s. States with Botetourt County providing 72% of the county's vote over the 27% who voted for Democrat Kamala Harris. This will be Trump's second term as President and the first time the office saw a candidate elected in two non-consecutive terms since Grover Cleveland was elected as the 24th President in 1892 (previously serving as the 22nd in the 1884 election).

Senator Tim Kaine (D) was re-elected to his U.S. Senate seat last week despite the majority of Botetourt voting for Republican nominee Hung Cao (69%). Kaine and the other current

Senator Mark Warner have maintained Virginia's Democratic representation in the U.S. Senate since 2013. In other Virginia elections, Ben Čline (R-6th District) retained his seat in U.S. House Representatives, earning 74% of the county's vote over Democrat Ken Mitchell. This is Cline's fourth 6th District victory following previous terms in Virginia's House of Delegates. County Botetourt

localities also saw new members to their elected bodies of local government. In Fincastle, Jim Reynolds, Clay Fitzgerald, and

Barry Rakes will join Town Council. They will soon replace outgoing members John Thomas and Bill Gaul.

In a special election for Troutville Town Council, Jonathan Simmons won uncontested election, joining re-elected members Henry John Cook Jr., Granville Grant, and Spurgeon Vaughan. Mayor Mike Mansfield was re-elected as mayor, also in an uncontested race.

Buchanan voted Sue Way as its first female mayor, and also added Edith "Sissy" Austin to Town Council, with James Manspile winning re-election to council.

"Buchanan Elementary is one of two elementary schools in the county that offer free lunch and breakfast. I think when we talk about businesses that residents can support as a majority, that becomes challenging.' Jeter referred to the

Community Eligibility Provision (CEP) which is a program offering non-pricing meal service option for schools and school districts in lowincome areas. According to the USDA, CEP allows the nation's types that once called the highest poverty schools and districts to serve "I want to see a breakfast and lunch at pharmacy, or a laundry no cost to all enrolled students without collecting household applications. Instead, schools that adopt CEP are reimbursed using a formula based on the percentage of students categorically eligible for free meals based on their participation in other specific means-tested programs.
