Blacksburg to establish new community garden at Heritage Park

BLACKSBURG - The Town of Blacksburg, along with local nonprofit, Live Work Eat Grow (LWEG) plans to establish a new community garden near the lower parking lot of Heritage Park and Natural Area on Glade Road.

Area on Glade Road.

"The success of the Blacksburg garden program has increased community interest," said Kim Thurlow, Housing and Community Development Initiatives Manager. "Due to the demand for new community garden plots, in 2022, the town allocated a portion of its American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funding to LWEG to collaborate with the town and establish two more community gardens."

Live Work Eat Grow provides the dayto-day management of the community gardens in the Town of Blacksburg and offers diverse programming open to all

Town residents focused on growing and preparing healthy food.

In recent months, LWEG in partnership with town staff has explored prospective community garden locations, on either town-owned land or in partnership with a private landowner. The goal over the next three years is to establish approximately 40 additional community garden plots at new locations for use by town residents.

In early November, the forthcoming Heritage Park garden site will be cleared of invasive plants and brush. The first phase of this project will involve suppressing invasive plants, ameliorating the soil, and installing garden beds and fencing. In total, the first phase is expected to take about a year and a half to complete, with an anticipated public opening in the spring of 2025.

"This site will help meet the growing demand for garden space in Blacksburg and will allow us to serve a new community in Tom's Creek Basin. Lower Heritage is becoming a hub for outdoor recreation with the trail systems, terrain park, pavilion, and the new Brush Mountain properties close by. A garden will make a great addition," said Steve Kruger, Garden Coordinator for LWEG.

The garden at Heritage Park will join three existing community gardens in town: The Garrison Garden (2021), the Wong Park Garden (2020), and the Hale Garden (2009). The Town's Community Garden program was the subject of a recently published article in Virginia Town and City Magazine, and the recipient of the 2024 Virginia

Municipal League (VML) Innovation Award in the Community Health Category. The category focused on localities that are building healthy community environments through active lifestyle programs, nutrition education, and improving access to healthier food choices. In addition to receiving the Innovation Award for Community Health, the Town of Blacksburg also received the VML President's Award for Innovation, the top honor in the competition.

Stay tuned for more details on the garden's progress, volunteer opportunities, or how to sign up for a garden plot.

A candlelight vigil was held at Blacksburg High School (BHS) on Saturday, Nov. 11 in support of the community suffering from the loss of two BHS students found dead inside a vehicle on Nov. 7, 2023. Blacksburg Town Council member

Lauren Colliver and Mayor Leslie Hager-Smith remarked on the event during the council meeting on Nov. 14.

positively impacting the commerce in the area.

The CAC has come a long way in 13 years since opening," Destree said. "Most recently, with your support and our partnership with Virginia Tech, we were able to secure two new scoreboards...one that will be used predominantly for diving and as a secondary board in our larger championship meets, and then the other one...which is more centrally located to our competition and championship course." Destree said Virginia Tech has

promoted their swim athletes through increased signage. Virginia Tech has produced a total of ten Olympian swimmers with eight men's top-25 NCAA championship finishes. Additionally, nine local high schools use the pool for practices, as well as youth club teams that utilize the services provided by the Center.

Lighting changes from fluorescent bulbs to LEDs have greatly improved visibility in the Center as well. Caldwell expressed a need to continue seeing improvements to the Center on a bi-annual basis so that the Aquatic Center can continue to maintain the interest they are currently receiving. 
members consented to an agenda item that awards a contract in the amount of \$2,184,941.00 to E.C. Pace Company, Inc. for construction of the Silver Lake

Radford University and the Military Resource Center honors service members on Veterans Day

Radford University welcomed military service members from every branch of the United States Armed Forces during their annual Veteran's Day Celebration on Nov. 10, 2023.

Students, faculty, staff, and special guests, and especially veterans and military members currently serving, were among the many that attended the event in the Bonnie auditorium on RU's

Special guests were welcomed by Marine Corps Veteran Shaun Landry, who began the ceremony by thanking everyone for their attendance and support. Special Radford University administration included Mayor David Horton, President Dr. Bret Danilowicz, Provost and Senior Vice Present Dr. Bethany Usher, Vice President for Enrollment Management and Strategic Communication, Dr. Danette Gomez Beane, members of the RU Board of Directors, and Radford City Council members.

Landry, from Tazewell, Virginia, served as an infantry rifleman and a Joint Fires Observer in the 3rd Battalion 5th Marine Regiment from 2015-2020, reaching the E5 Sergeant ranking.

"From the coast of Australia to Southeast Asia and even the Middle East, my Marine Corps journey has brought me all over the world," Landry said. "I conducted two deployments while I was in the service and attended various leadership schools. I am a current student veteran and co-President of the Student Veterans Organization here on the main campus at Radford University. I am studying business management and plan to graduate in 2024."

Air Force Guardsman Justin Jones also addressed the audience, welcoming veteran supporters that partner with the military students in assisting with bringing important programs and resources to the University. Some of those in attendance were

Barrett Bass, Radford University Alumni and Veteran of the US Navy serves as the Veterans Outreach Coordinator in Salem, Virginia. Allison Patrick is the Resource Specialist with the Virginia Department of Veterans Services. Danielle Rock is an RU alumni and veteran of the US Army and is also the Suicide Prevention Coordinator with the Virginia Department of Veterans Services. Additional organizations that were recognized by Jones were the Radford VFW Post 776, the New River Valley Marine Corps League, and the members of the New River Valley Veterans Council.

Originally from Baltimore, Maryland, Jones earned his associate degree in Humanities at Valley Forge Military College in 2012 and is currently serving in the U.S. Air Force Air National Guard as a 2G051 Logistics Planner, beginning his enlistment in 2020. He is a psychology major at RU and will be graduating in December of 2023.

"I am Scribe of the Student Veterans Organization here at Radford University main campus. My plans after I graduate is to attend grad school studying neuroscience," Jones said.

Radford University has a welcoming

atmosphere and supportive resources that have garnered much attention and some impressive awards of recognition. RU was recently given the honor of a Military Friendly Silver Status college and has been increasing their rankings every year for the previous seven years. The Military Times also has named the University as a "Best for Vets" institution.

"And for the first time," Landry said. "We have added the designations of being a Military Friendly Spouse School, and a Guard Friendly School. In January of this past year, we were excited to be featured on national television on the Lifetime Network. Montel Williams and his tv show Military Makeover spotlighted Radford University in a segment called Operation Career.'

Senior Criminal Justice student, Amanda Bishop, served in the US Army from 2012 to 2016 and is a resident of nearby Dublin. Radford University's Military Resource Center is not only a place where past and present service members and their dependents can find camaraderie and community, but also provides support for military dependents as well. One military dependent, Garrett Armstrong has not one, but two parents in the service. Armstrong found support through the Military Resource Center at RU during his sophomore year and said his time at the University has improved

"At first, I was a little nervous about fitting in being a military dependent and expected the office to be full of old army dudes telling war stories and fartin' all the time, and to be fair, there probably is a majority of veterans and active-duty students in there," Armstrong said. "But the MRC was not what I had pictured. It is not just an office on campus that just does business, it is a place to be with people who I have a lot in common

Record number of mussels salvaged during 2023 event

Each year during the Claytor Lake drawdown to allow landowners to clean up debris from the shoreline, a dedicated group of volunteers gathers to save freshwater mussels and return them to

According to Friends of Claytor Lake (FOCL) Executive Director Ciara Harris, this year's effort was very successful.

We had 115 participants and salvaged a record 8,045 mussels, 1,500 more than in 2021," she said.

Harris said "mussels from four species were salvaged, with Paper Pondshell being the most numerous at 63%.,

up from 57% in 2021. Elliptio came in third after Giant Floater in total numbers, but had the biggest percent increase since 2021, 14% up from 5%. Three Purple Warty Back were again salvaged this year, but no Pocketbook (eight in 2021) or Pistolgrip (three in 2021)."

"Mussel Salvage is a community/ state-wide event made possible by large participation each year," Harris added. "We are thankful to all of our participants/volunteer groups. It's important to save mussels during drawdown because they're essential to keeping the water clean." Friends of Claytor Lake Board

Secretary Laura Bullard organizes the

event and volunteers, checking them in and prepping them with team

information and salvage locations. FOCL reminds anyone who utilized the drawdown to please report their use of the drawdown and record any mussels salvaged.

"Reporting your use of drawdown is important for continuing drawdown every other year," according to FOCL. "If you did not receive a drawdown card in the mail from AEP, we have you covered on our website. Please record any uses of drawdown along with total mussels you saved! You can record easily (and anonymously) at https://www.focl.org/mussel-salvagereporting."






