



## Shinnston Girl Scouts troop plans pet-adoption service project

The members of Shinnston Girls Scout Troop 31558 recently came up with their own service idea: preparing bags of pet supplies for people who adopt from the Harrison County Humane Society.

The girls put together 25 bags for cat adoptions and 25 for dog adoptions.

“We wanted to offer a sample pack of items,” said Troop Leader Lynn Williams Vance. “Each bag was filled with items such as small bags of pet food, cat or dog treats, a toy for the new pet, as well as a collar.”

The girls wanted to give people who were adopting a pet the goody bag to take home with them that day.

The troop had originally planned to deliver these items on Martin Luther King Jr. Day, but with the poor weather conditions, organizers rescheduled for Jan. 25. The older girls in the club made the venture to the Humane Society to drop off the goody bags.

While there, the girls noticed that the facility was short-staffed, so they graciously offered to bathe one of the dogs while they were there.

Vance stated that she believed that it may have been the first time the dog had ever had a bath.

The girls also spent a couple of hours that day playing and interacting with the animals. Humane Society workers said they were welcome to return anytime because the shelter is always in need of help.

“Since I have older girls, they don’t like doing patchwork and prefer the more hands-on projects,” Vance said. “So we have been doing a bunch of community service projects.”

With money earned from cookie sales, they adopted Angels from the Salvation Army, as well as adopted residents at a nursing home and bought items for them as well. The Salvation Army Angel Tree program helps provide Christmas gifts for hundreds of thousands of children around the country each year, according to the Salvation Army website.

Vance told me that this will be the last year for the troop, so they are trying to use the money that they have earned to give back to the community as much as

possible. Her daughter Raelynn Vance is graduating from Girl Scouts, and she has been working on her Gold Award for the past two years.

Gold Awards are presented to high-school students in Girl Scouts who research and conduct long-term projects. The Gold Award is a “Take Action project that must include five elements: a root

cause of an issue that you feel passionate about that has a national or global link. Through your actions, you must demonstrate leadership while also creating a sustainable and measurable impact,” the Girl Scouts website states. Due to COVID though, her progress has been slowed, her mother said.

## United Way opens cold shelter

Volunteers also assess extent of Harrison County homelessness

For the first time this year, the United Way has opened a cold-weather shelter for people in need.

The shelter is located at the First United Methodist Church in Clarksburg and will be active until the end of March, according to Marisa Rexroad, the United Way of Harrison and Doddridge Counties director of homeless services.

It operates from 8 p.m. to 8 a.m. every night so that the

homeless can get out of the elements. Since the Mission in Clarksburg has transitioned to a recovery-focused program, the emergency shelter is no longer available.

The Mission’s focus now is to help those individuals who are working towards recovery or maintaining recovery.

So without the active emergency shelter available, the cold weather shelter is a blessing for those who need somewhere warm to sleep during these harsh months. The shelter on average sees

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## State reports six kids on ventilators WV hits record number of COVID-19 hospitalizations

West Virginia hit a new record number of COVID-19 hospitalizations, 1,080, last week and reported six kids on ventilators, the most since the state began reporting child hospitalization data. On Thursday, Jan. 27, 1,080 West Virginians were hospitalized with the virus. On the previous day, Wednesday, COVID-19

hospitalizations hit 1,043, breaking the previous record of 1,012 on Sept. 24.

West Virginia also recently began reporting child hospitalization numbers. On Thursday, 14 kids were hospitalized with the virus, including five on ventilators. Friday, six kids were on ventilators, according to the state’s COVID-19 dashboard.

### Jim Kaufman: Proposed bill would hurt rural hospitals

West Virginia hospitals set a new record for COVID-19 hospitalizations this week. Now, some have questioned whether our hospitals have the capacity to care for more patients, and they've erroneously linked the state's Certificate of Need (CON) program as a contributing problem.

(Editor's note: some lawmakers and the conservative Cardinal Institute have proposed repealing the state's Certificate of Need requirements for healthcare providers. All health care providers, unless otherwise exempt, must obtain a CON before (1) adding or expanding health care services, (2) exceeding the capital

expenditure threshold of \$5,803,788, (3) obtaining major medical equipment valued at \$5,803,788 or more, or (4) developing or acquiring new health care facilities.)

The CON program was created to ensure West Virginians have access to high-quality, low-cost care. Today, more than 30 states use CON to ensure quality care and avoid duplication of health care services that would result in higher costs for everyone.

We know the political sentiment surrounding the CON program is divisive, but the reality is that for West Virginia communities, hospitals are not only their largest employers, but also the

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## This week in West Virginia history

The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history.

**Feb. 3, 1825:** Confederate General William Lowther Jackson was born in Clarksburg. He was one of at least three Southern officers to bear the nickname, "Mudwall."

**Feb. 3, 1845:** Gilmer County, located in the heart of West Virginia, was established from parts of Kanawha and Lewis counties. It was named for Thomas W. Gilmer, a governor of Virginia.

**Feb. 3, 1923:** Broadcast announcer Jack Fleming was born in Morgantown. He was the long-time "Voice of the Mountaineers."

**Feb. 3, 1961:** The West Virginia Legislature passed a resolution to officially adopt "The West Virginia Hills" as an official state song. "The West Virginia Hills" is the best-known of four official state songs.

**Feb. 4, 1845:** Doddridge County was formed from parts of Harrison, Lewis, Ritchie, and Tyler counties. It was named for Philip Doddridge, a Western Virginia congressman, state legislator, and member of the Virginia Constitutional Convention of 1829-30.

**Feb. 4, 1945:** The hotel at Minnehaha Springs was destroyed by fire. Built in 1914, it was the first facility in Pocahontas County built strictly for the tourist business and was a forerunner of today's local tourism economy.

**Feb. 5, 1889:** Fiddler and self-taught physician James Franklin "Doc" White was born near Ivydale. White served the community as doctor, dentist, and midwife, delivering more than 1,800 babies.

**Feb. 5, 1890:** Coach Eli Camden "Cam" Henderson was born in Joetown, Marion County. He is a revered figure in Marshall University sports history.

**Feb. 5, 1941:** Actor David Lynn Selby was born in Morgantown. His stage and screen credits include the outdoor drama *Honey in the Rock*, and the television shows *Falcon Crest* and *Dark Shadows*.

**Feb. 6, 1882:** Poet Anne Spencer was born in Annie Bethel Bannister in Henry County, Virginia. In 1886, she and her mother moved to [Bramwell](#), where she spent most of her childhood and adolescent years.

**Feb. 6, 2007:** Selva Lewis "Lew" Burdette, a native of Nitro, died in Florida. Burdette was an outstanding major league baseball player who spent most of his career with the Milwaukee Braves. In 18 major league seasons, he won 203 games and lost 144.

**Feb. 7, 1867:** West Virginia University was established by an act of the West Virginia Legislature. The college, originally called the Agricultural College of West Virginia, opened its doors in September 1867.

**Feb. 7, 1889:** Nell Elizabeth "Pistol Nell" Walker was born at Sewell Mountain. Known as the "First Lady" of Fayette County, she served 12 terms as a member of the House of Delegates.

**Feb. 8, 1892:** Cartoonist Irvin Dugan was born in Huntington. For many years, his "Adam" cartoon character was a feature on the editorial pages of *The Herald-Dispatch*.

**Feb. 8, 1915:** Photographer Volkmar Kurt Wentzel was born

in Dresden, Germany. He emigrated with his family to the United States at age 11. As a teenager in West Virginia, Wentzel took up with an eclectic group of people who had retreated to Youghiogheny Forest, a Preston County artists' colony.

**Feb. 8, 1918:** Medal of Honor recipient Herbert Joseph Thomas Jr. was born. He excelled in football as a halfback for South Charleston High School, and Herbert J. Thomas Memorial Hospital in South Charleston is named for him.

**Feb. 9, 1843:** e-WV: The West Republican Party leader Nathan Goff Jr. was born in Clarksburg. In 1888, Goff lost West Virginia's most controversial gubernatorial election to Aretas Brooks Fleming. Goff's initial 106-vote majority was challenged by Fleming, and both men were sworn in on inauguration day.

**Feb. 9, 1900:** "Aunt Jennie" Wilson was born near Henlawson. Wilson was a Logan County traditional musician, considered a master of clawhammer-style banjo playing.

**Feb. 9, 1950:** U.S. Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy's speech to a group of Wheeling Republicans launched the 1950s red scare. McCarthy, a Wisconsin Republican, claimed in his speech to have a list of 205 communists who worked in the U.S. State Department.

knew it was probably an impossible achievement for someone from a small town, with a worn-out basketball and an old rusty hoop in my backyard.

I checked out books on basketball from the library and listened to a small brown radio, as Jack Fleming did the play-by-play for the Mountaineers. I missed the Jerry West era, but Rod Thorn, Ron “Fritz” Williams, Bill Maphis, and Gale Catlett were familiar names that came alive when they ran out onto the floor of the old Field House. I attended one game at the Field House when my dad surprised me one night and said we were going to see the Mountaineers. I can remember walking up the long ramp to the ticket counter and climbing the steps to the deck of the aging Field House. The opponent that night was the Furman University Purple Paladins, who

ran out on the court to a chorus of boos from the home crowd. Shortly after, the lights went out and the blast of the Mountaineer’s musket shocked me as I looked down on the court to see the spotlight focus on each player as they were introduced. I was hooked! I knew my goal and I would do anything to achieve it.

Reality started to creep in as my high school career was winding down. Our team at Notre Dame High School was ranked in the state and I was having the time of my life, but the chance of playing at WVU seemed out of reach for a lanky player that was just learning his left foot from his right. I played in an All-Star game after the season was over and attracted the attention of a couple of teams in the WVIAC conference. One of the coaches who watched me play was the legendary

Glenville State College basketball coach, Jesse Lilly. Coach Lilly asked if I would like to visit the Glenville campus and work out with some of his players. Glenville had one of the best players in the conference, Jackie Joe Robinson, and I was excited to get the opportunity to meet him and get to scrimmage with the team. I loved my recruiting trip to Glenville State, and they did a good job of convincing me that I was just the type of player that could play for the Pioneers. As I drove home, I was trying to figure out how to tell my parents that I was thinking about signing to play for Coach Lilly.

I can remember talking to my mother and she said that it would be a good idea to weigh the cost of college between Glenville and West Virginia University. I had applied for loans and work-study at

WVU, and with my sister already there, the numbers seemed to favor me heading to Morgantown in the fall. I was crushed! My basketball career was over, and I was left to play pickup games at the park or intramural games at college. There would be no cheering crowds or spotlights when I stepped onto the court.

The summer after graduation, I continued to play in summer leagues and get together with my teammates as often as possible. It was a little sad to not have basketball to look forward to, but my education was now my priority, and I prepared to head to Morgantown and start my college career.

around twenty to thirty individuals each night, according to Rexroad.

The United Way also operate “a solution-focused street outreach team,” Rexroad said.

“We work throughout Harrison and Doddridge Counties to connect with folks who are experiencing outdoor homelessness and to connect them back to permanent stable housing, behavioral health care, medical health care, document readiness,” she said.

In addition, the United Way is among several organizations involved in an effort every January called the Point-In-Time Count, which aims to assess the extent of homelessness in an area by counting the population each year. The West Virginia Coalition to End

Homelessness, the Clarksburg-Harrison Regional Housing Authority, and the United Way of Harrison and Doddridge Counties participate.

The count was set to last for approximately 24 hours, from 4 p.m. Jan. 26 to 3:59 p.m. Jan 27. Participants collected as much information as possible from the homeless population. The goal was to calculate an estimate of the homeless population and determine what their needs are, according to Mary-Kate Bostick from the WV Coalition to End Homelessness.

The West Virginia Coalition to End Homelessness helps lead the count and provide the resources needed for each county lead to gather the

information. The count is requested by HUD to be done every other year, but Bostick said, “We feel like it’s best to do it every year because it’s a little bit easier to gauge trends.”

Since the coalition is also responsible for 43 other counties, they work with each individual county to identify one individual to help gather volunteers and train those volunteers on how to use an app that will collect the information. The volunteers collect their information on their cellular devices.

“The app is just like a survey,” Bostick said. “It collects in real time and automatically sends it to the one of the databases.” says Bostick.

This helps to make

a visual for them to see trends in needs for the homeless. This information offers an overall count, as well as information on the number of veterans, families, and whether the person is chronically homeless. This will give the organizations a better direction on what services they should offer in the future.

As of press time, organizers hadn’t determined the final count.

on the ice from Oak Point to Peora on our leather shoes and sleds. We didn't have ice skates; couldn't afford them. Naturally, since I was the youngest and lightest, my brothers would use me as a gauge to check the thickness of the ice, if you know what I mean. What a sickening feeling when the ice would start cracking under your feet. If I fell through, they'd pull me out and then run like heck! I would start running for the house, hoping to get there before my pants legs would freeze up and start chafing my legs.

When I was around 10 years old, my oldest brother John traded a bolt action .22 cal. rifle for a 10' homemade flat bottom boat. It had

a wooden frame with tin nailed to it and roofing tar used to seal the tin; it also had two makeshift paddles. We had visions of John Paul Jones, Admiral Perry, and George Washington crossing the Delaware; maybe even float it down to the West Fork River and maybe even on to Pittsburgh.

We found the deepest place in the creek to stick the boat in and had a little pre-launch ceremony. Then John, Jack, and I, along with Don Cecil, very painstakingly boarded the craft trying to keep it balanced without upsetting it. This was in December. My brothers paddled us out into the middle of the creek, once they figured out how to maneuver without going in circles. About the time we got to the middle, the boat started springing leaks; I mean big leaks! My brothers started paddling like heck trying to get us back to shore. Donny

and I took off our hats and started bailing... we didn't make it. That thing sank faster than the Titanic. Talk about being cold. Thank God, the creek was only three feet deep in that area. It sure put a damper on the festivities for the rest of the day.

A few days later we learned another lesson, how to retrieve a sunken boat. We finally got it floating again and re-tarred the seams and added a couple of big empty coffee cans for emergencies (bailing water). We kept it tied up to a tree along the creek. In the spring, we had a big flood and it swept the boat away. John said the boat was later found somewhere near Worthington. Years later, we all four joined the Army. We found out at a young age that the Navy wasn't our calling.

Association sends the state's pandemic leadership team a daily report of hospitalizations. According to records supplied following several months of seeking the data under the Freedom of Information Act, at least 22 of 54 hospitals, were already at more than 90 percent inpatient occupation rates as of early January, when there were 744 people hospitalized with COVID. Ruby Memorial reported a 99 percent inpatient occupancy rate on Jan. 5, while United Hospital Center reported 83 percent.

Dr. Kathryn S. Moffett, pediatric infectious disease specialist at WVU Medicine Children's Hospital in Morgantown, said

that since the Delta variant emerged in the summer, WVU has seen on average one to two severely ill kids in their ICU or pediatric intensive care unit at a time.

One three-year-old with an underlying condition was ill for nearly a month, she said, while other severe cases have mainly been among older kids who are obese.

She also said they are seeing some kids come in with other problems and get diagnosed with COVID-19 as part of routine testing.

With the newest strand of covid, doctors are seeing more of an upper respiratory infection as opposed to previous variants.

She said most children seem to recover well from this virus, and Omicron variant symptoms may include fever and gastrointestinal distress.

Moffett went on to stress the importance of vaccinations and boosters to reduce the severity of COVID-19 infections. It is possible to still contract the disease even after vaccinations and boosters, but the data seems to show that those individuals that contract the virus after receiving a vaccination or booster seem to recover faster and have less severe infections.

"If you're five and over, you absolutely need to be vaccinated and if you're 12 and over

you can be boosted," Moffett said.

All but one of the kids admitted to WVU's pediatric ICU had not been fully vaccinated.

"And that's frustrating for us as care providers because they still may have gotten COVID," Moffett said. "They may have had the Delta variant. They may have had Omicron, but they probably would not have even ended up in the hospital."

She also referenced a CDC study that found an unvaccinated person is five times more likely to become re-infected than a person who is immunized.

## Local businesses bound by supply chains

As the ongoing pandemic and economic challenges continue to cause breakdowns in the supply chain, small business owners in the Shinnston area say they too have struggled.

According to Shannon Kellar, owner of B3 Boutique, suppliers have begun to require pre-orders. With her suppliers not sure when they will be able to receive their inventory from overseas, some require pre-orders months in advance.

This proves to be difficult for her family-owned business because it often causes her to have several weeks' worth of merchandise that is delivered and must be paid for, all at one time.

As Kellar stated, "I count on my week-to-week sales to pay for

new inventory." The other area that B3 is finding a struggle is with the timing of merchandise delivery. As a clothing boutique, B3 can only sell certain items during the correct season. Kellar related a time that she ordered shorts in February to be sold over the summer, but, because of supply chain issues, these shorts were not delivered until September. This delay made the pieces basically unable to be sold.

It is also a challenge for the boutique to store all of the merchandise coming in as a bulk delivery.

Another small business in the Shinnston area struggling with their own supply chain problems is Management Systems and Consultants, owned and operated by Doug Moore and

# National Guard sent to UHC

Governor Jim Justice has deployed the West Virginia National Guard to hospitals throughout the state due to the ongoing surge of COVID-19. That includes United Hospital Center in Bridgeport, according to a news release.

Eight members of the National Guard were scheduled to begin greeting visitors and patients to UHC on Jan. 25 at hospital entrances. Guard members will also assist with the COVID-19 testing drive-thru on the Bridgeport campus.

"We welcome the National Guard to

UHC," said Michael C. Tillman president and CEO at UHC, in a statement. "With Guard members in place, it will free up hospital staff to care for patients."

In late December, the West Virginia Hospital Association said patients at state hospitals were "operating at contingency and crisis levels of care, which means waiting times are longer and staffing shortages are now the norm, impacting the availability of timely care." They said some patients were being treated in hallways and waiting

rooms, and some were diverted to other medical providers.

"This situation is a result of our ongoing pandemic response, the serious illness of non-COVID-19 patients, national supply chain issues limiting access to effective treatments, the increased length of stay of all patients, and the resulting high number of patients in West Virginia hospitals," the hospital association said, in a statement urging West Virginians to get vaccinated and schedule booster shot appointments.

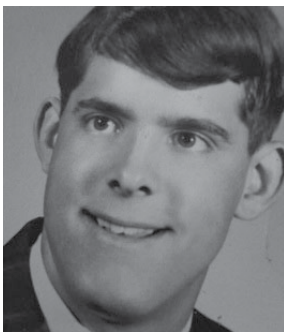

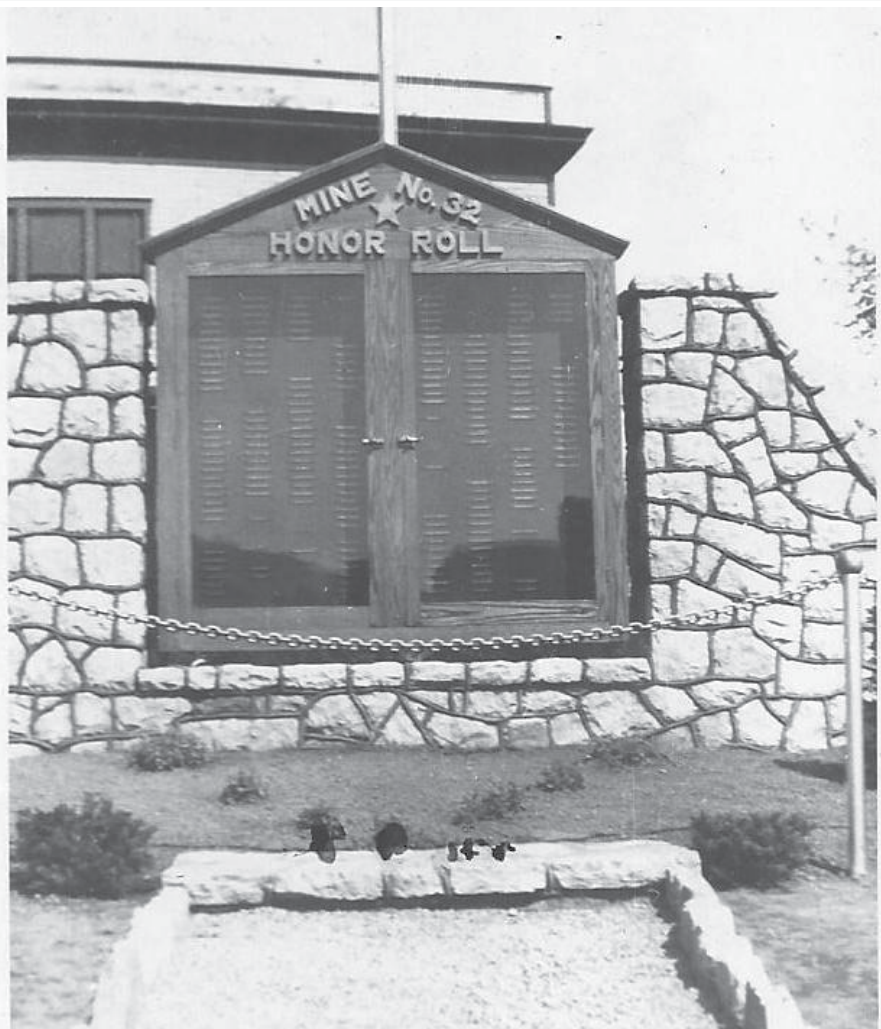

chief economic driver. They are a critical piece of the economic infrastructure that potential employers consider when deciding where to locate their next manufacturing facility or distribution center. Given the state’s recent and outstanding economic development news, shouldn’t we all be working together to support our hospitals and our 49,000 employees who continue to battle on the frontlines of the COVID-19 pandemic?

Instead, the hospital and health care community each legislative session is left to repeatedly defend a state process that simply provides an outlet through which all stakeholders can provide input – from affected persons to other health care organizations like our remarkable hospice community and senior centers – so

that health care delivery in our communities is offered in a rational and reasonable way.

Without the planning process of CON for hospitals, specialty health care facilities could simply establish a new facility next to a community hospital and siphon off commercially insured patients leaving hospitals to care for the sickest and most vulnerable members of our community. If hospitals lose profitable service lines and commercially insured patients to specialty facilities, they will be unable to continue offering valuable services and programs that patients rely on, and this translates into a loss of jobs for West Virginians. Also impacted is the ability of hospitals to train our next generation of physicians and health care professionals at a

time when we’re facing a shortage of our most precious resource – our workforce. This will impact care for the entire state.

One of the main arguments against CON is focused on the free market. First and foremost, the health care system in West Virginia is *not* a free market and taking care of people is not a commodity. Hospitals in West Virginia are not free to serve only the people who can pay, nor can they set their own rates for the services they provide. These rates are set by federal and state agencies for patients covered by Medicare, Medicaid, and PEIA, which accounts for 75 percent of the patients treated in West Virginia hospitals, an astounding statistic when compared to other states. That’s a long way from a free market. We should

continue to focus on economic development opportunities in our state that help increase our population and expand our employer-based health insurance so that there is less reliance on government payors.

We’ve stated one goal of CON is about cost-containment and the national data shows that West Virginia’s CON program is delivering on its goal of low-cost, accessible health care. For example, information from the Kaiser Family Foundation’s State Health Facts 2019, shows West Virginia is in the bottom quartile of states for cost per inpatient day with the national average of \$2,607 per day compared to West Virginia’s \$1,831 cost per day, which is 42% below the national average.

It’s been incorrectly stated that West Virginia’s CON program has resulted in 2,424 fewer hospital beds. Adding these beds would represent a 40% increase to the total capacity and would drive down occupancy rates statewide to approximately 40%. It would be economically irresponsible to add 2,424 licensed beds statewide when the current trend in health care is for the provision of services to be provided in outpatient settings and at home. Further, based on industry estimates used in health care planning, each additional new hospital bed requires an expenditure of approximately \$1 million per bed. Therefore, to create the 2,424 beds cited in reports would require an estimated \$2.42 billion in additional health care

dollars, when existing licensed beds are unable to be staffed due to a nationwide health care shortage.

Not only is CON working but it has provided a level of predictability and stability for West Virginia hospitals, especially in these unprecedented times. If COVID taught us anything, it’s that health care is not a luxury item people can choose to live without like other goods and services. We are proud of serving the residents of West Virginia in their time of need and our hope is that policymakers continue to support and recognize us as pillars of our communities offering services 24/7/365.

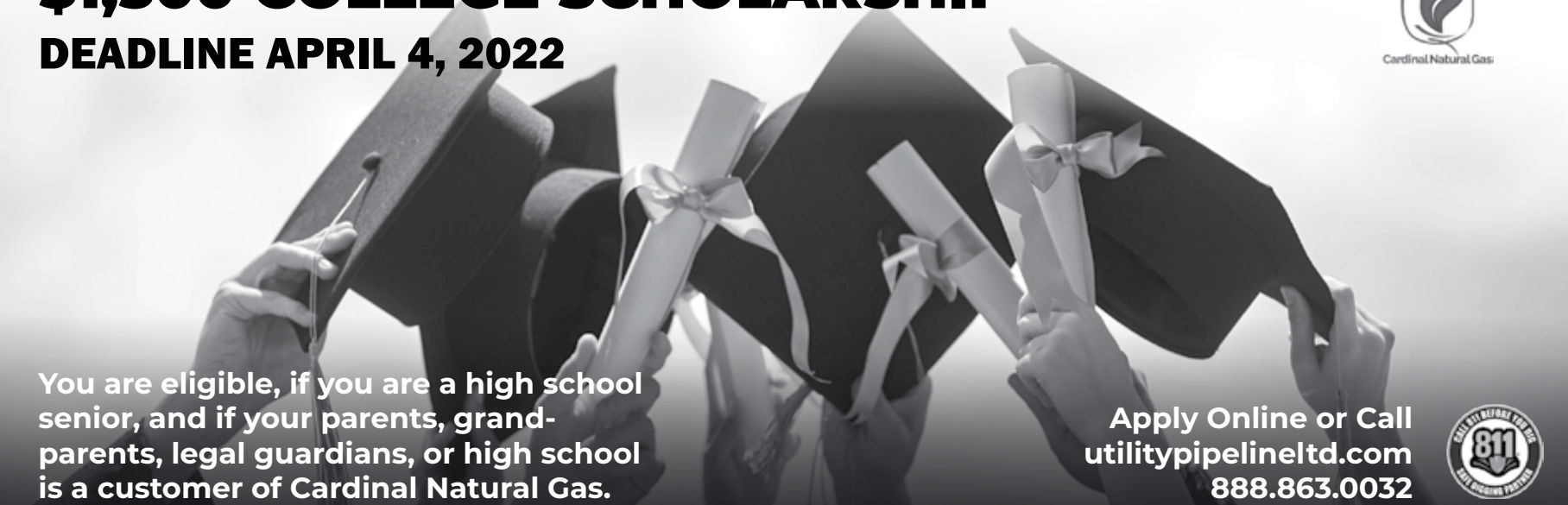

family. Management Systems deals in sportswear and outdoor gear. Moore shared that he has struggled to keep the items he generally receives from businesses overseas in stock. Many of these overseas businesses are being forced to shut down due to illness among their employees or because of governmental mandates, he said. This has made it difficult for Moore’s business to provide all

of the equipment to his constituents. Moore also explained how a problem in one area of the world can cause a widespread disturbance. He sells a headlamp used for climbing. There is a small plastic piece on the lamp which is manufactured in China. The company in Europe which manufactures the lamp is unable to get the plastic piece from China, and, therefore,

Moore is unable to purchase enough of the lamps to meet the demands of his store. China is attempting a “zero-COVID” strategy, with strict quarantine rules and travel restrictions. Moore also said that he has also had trouble getting merchandise delivered in a timely manner, often waiting weeks longer than the originally assigned delivery date. One aspect of

the supply chain which is plaguing larger businesses is a lack of employees. Neither Moore nor Kellar has expressed any struggle in this area. Both attribute their strength in this category to being family-owned and operated businesses. According to ABC News, the reasons for this supply chain slump are multifaceted. Businesses are struggling to keep up with demand after

being required to slow, and, in some cases, stop production of goods during the early portion of the pandemic. Companies are also finding themselves with a mass exodus of employees from those lower-paying, labor-intensive jobs which are necessary to keep the supply chain moving. The country is also struggling with a shortfall of truck drivers. In 2018, pre-pandemic forecasts

were calling for a deficit of around 60,000 truck drivers. With the addition of the pandemic struggles, the lack of drivers is over 80,000. As we go through our daily lives, we need to keep in mind that our local business owners are working hard to overcome this impediment, which is out of their control.

Most recently, Brady has founded the songwriter show called Music City Pickers LIVE! featuring artists such as Ricky Skaggs, Larry Stewart (Restless Heart), Richie McDonald (Lonestar), Peter Frampton, and many other hitmakers. Talented and soulful

vocalist Lua Crofts comes from 70’s era rock royalty. The daughter of Dash Crofts of the hugely popular 70’s duo Seals & Crofts, she grew up in Los Angeles, California right smack dab in the middle of the ‘70s and ‘80s music industry.
