

Salem to demolish historic “treasure”

Salem City Council plans to demolish the historic Red Barn to create room for recreational activities. But the plan has upset some area residents, including those who point to the role the barn played in the town’s past.

For many years the Red Barn in Salem, located on the west end of Salem within the city park, was an integral part of the community. It was host to classes, community dances, and other functions. Now vacant, the barn has been subject to vandalism in recent years.

Salem City Manager Ronnie Davis said the city plans to build restrooms and picnic

pavilions.

“We’re hoping for peewee football fields and soccer fields, and we’re making all that area more ball fields and spreading a few little parks through our town,” he said.

The city plans to put one of the parks where the former Van Horn Elementary school was located.

“We’re starting on this park, and hopefully within two months or three months it’ll be done,” said Davis.

Davis said he has been working with Harrison County Parks and Recreation on the plans, and they have also been applying for grants to help pay for projects.

There are only two public-use parks within the city, and they both need an update of equipment.

But not all residents of Salem, including Geoffrey Steele, are happy with the City’s proposal.

Steele said the barn was originally used for the Salem Industrial Home for Girls’ gardening. The Salem Industrial Home for Girls, an early juvenile detention center, was built in 1899.

“This building has played an important and significant role in our community for over a century,” Steele said.

Steele said the barn was dedicated by the Daughters of the American Revolution and the Salem Bicentennial Committee

Donation made toward Harrison teen court

Harrison County Prosecutor Rachel Romano said last week that \$5,000 had been contributed toward the development of a teen court in the county. It’s unclear as of now though whether the program will come to fruition, according to Romano.

“There’s nothing saying it will and there’s nothing saying it won’t,” she said, during a Harrison County mayors meeting, held Feb. 9 in Clarksburg City Council chambers.

Mayors from Nutter Fort, Stonewood, Anmoore, West Milford, Lost Creek, and a councilman from Salem attended the meeting.

One of the mayors asked about possibly starting a Teen Court in Harrison County.

“Teen court is an alternative, if you will, to being in our court system,” Romano said.

Rent aid unspent

Gov. Jim Justice is urging West Virginians in need of rental assistance to contact the Mountaineer Rental Assistance Program.


The program provides financial assistance to renters who have lost their job, lost income, or suffered significant financial hardship because of the COVID-19 pandemic, according to a news release. During a COVID-19 briefing last week, Erica Boggess, director of the West Virginia Housing Development Fund, noted that the U.S. Treasury has begun to recapture unused funds.

Landlords with tenants who are struggling with rent or utility payments due to COVID-19 may be eligible for rental assistance as well.

“To date, we’ve distributed \$53.7 million, helping almost

Feb. 17, 1735: Morgan Morgan was commissioned a captain of militia in the 201st Field Artillery, which is considered the oldest military unit in the United States.

Feb. 18, 1890: Ellison Mounts, a cousin to the Hatfield family, was hanged for murder, ending the Hatfield-McCoy Feud.

Feb. 18, 1969: Hundreds of miners in Raleigh County went on strike over the issue of black lung. Within days, the walkout spread throughout southern West Virginia.

Feb. 19, 1872: The Glenville Branch of the State Normal School was established by an act of the legislature. The first session of the college opened on January 14, 1873, in the old Gilmer County courthouse.

Feb. 19, 1908: Orval Elijah Brown was born near Lizemores in Clay County. Brown, a free-spirited individual, gained notoriety as the “Clay County Wild Man” during the Great Depression for his untamed physical appearance that included a flowing beard and the wearing of little more than a self-made loincloth.

Feb. 19, 1943: Author Homer Hickam was born in Coalwood, McDowell County. Hickam’s second book, *Rocket Boys: A Memoir*, was published in 1998 and became a runaway bestseller.

Feb. 20, 1875: The West Virginia Legislature approved a bill to move the state capital back to Wheeling.

Feb. 20, 1995: The West Virginia Legislature voted to make the Golden Delicious apple the official state fruit.

Feb. 21, 1895: Bluefield Colored

Dispelling a rumor from snow days

One of the places my brothers and I loved to sled ride was the old steel bridge in the middle of Pine Bluff. It has since been replaced by a new concrete bridge built back in the 90s. The upper approach road to the bridge has a hill with a turn at the top. Coming off the bridge on the lower end, there’s a 90-degree turn in the road. When the roads would be covered with snow, all the kids in the neighborhood would congregate there on Friday and Saturday nights.

Jimmy and Patty Salerno (newlyweds at that time) lived in a house beside the lower end of the bridge. Jimmy would let us build a big bonfire (in his yard) from old truck tires that he also supplied. We always tried to see who

could go the farthest down the road on their sleds.

The first thing you had to do was make sure there were no vehicles coming up the road (learned that little bit of info the hard way). Then, you belly-smacked on your sled at the top of the hill, came down across the bridge, preferably in the middle (there were no guard rails), then had to negotiate the sharp left turn on the other end trying to make it to the community building turn. Depending on how slick the road was, sometimes you’d have so much speed coming off the bridge that you couldn’t make the lower turn and ended up in the row of mailboxes on the other side (set on telephone poles). They didn’t budge.

Because of the bridge’s location, it was hard for vehicles to get up the hill when the road was slick. There was no way to get a run for it, so while sled riding, we’d make some extra money pushing people up the hill. We’d make a windfall from alcohol-challenged motorists trying to make it up the hill to Rosie’s “Dew Drop Inn” and from Williams Mines coal miners at shift change. Now, I do want to dispel the rumor that we intentionally packed down the snow on the hill to make it so slick...water worked better.

One year, we took the hood off an old ’50 Buick from our junkyard and used it for a sled. We hooked it to the back of the farm tractor using a 20-foot log chain. At first, we tried it out on the half-mile one-lane dirt/gravel road that separated the two farms. We

quickly learned that the 20- foot chain was a mistake because you couldn’t guide it and the hood went wherever it wanted... you were on your own. After ending up in the barbed wire fence because of the length, we shortened up the chain to about six feet, so the hood wouldn’t wander too far from the back of the tractor. That worked much better.

We did drag it up and down Pine Bluff on the main road a couple of times while taking turns driving the tractor. Sometimes, the hood would hit bare places in the road and the sparks would fly. I remember our cousin Mart offered to hook the hood to the back of his car and take us for a ride. We declined...his car went a lot faster than the old ’53 “Golden Jubilee”.

freshmen at WVU was always a challenge, I asked her what I needed to do when it was time to submit my schedule. She said not to worry, because the basketball team was assigned classes first, and whatever classes I wanted, I would get. It was then that I realized that there were some real benefits to being on the basketball team.

The first practice for the freshman team was the first time that we were all together and we were introduced to the six scholarship players. Will Robinson was an all-American high school player from Uniontown, Pennsylvania and was one of WVU’s most notable recruits since the Jerry West and Hot Rod Huntley era. Will was joined by Curt Price from Charleston, John Wooton from Beckley, Billy Wells from Williamson,

Gary Browne from Washington, DC, and WVU’s first 7-footer, Mike Heitz from Indiana. The WVU freshman coach was Chuck Windsor and he was assisted by former WVU player, Carl Head.

When we walked into the dressing room, at each locker, was a new pair of Converse basketball shoes, practice uniforms, socks, and towels. Coach Windsor joked with us and told us that WVU had the order for the largest pair of Converse basketball shoes and also the smallest pair that year. The 7-footer, Mike Heitz had the largest and Tim Gocke of Bridgeport had the smallest.

Our first practice as a team was an introduction to big-time college basketball. We ran up and down the court until our tongues

were hanging out and realized that we had a lot of work to do. Towards the end of practice was the first time we saw a basketball, and the coaches divided up the big men and the ball handlers. I fell into the big man category and joined Mike Heitz, Billy Wells, Gary Browne, and Greg Frye from Fairmont to work out with Coach Head. At 6-feet 4-inches tall, I was usually the tallest player on the court in high school and looking up to a 7-footer was daunting.

The speed of the game was also an eye-opener. Watching Will Robinson glide up the court and sink a twenty-footer was amazing.

Curt Price was also an amazing talent. He was an all-state player at Charleston High and played every position on the floor. At 6-feet 1-inch tall, he could jump with any player

on the court and was like a coach on the floor.

After a few weeks of practice, we started to jell as a team. For the non-scholarship players, we realized that our playing time was going to be limited and most of the year, we would be watching Will Robinson dazzle the crowd with an amazing ability to score from anywhere on the court. That really didn’t matter; we were Mountaineers and living out a dream. As we approached the first game, the newspapers were talking about the freshman team and how it might be one of the best ever. Even knowing I was probably going to be sitting on the bench for the whole game, I was as nervous as I’d ever been on a basketball court.

Are you someone experiencing hypertension or high blood pressure?

If so, continue reading to discover which medicines in your medicine cabinet could affect this medical condition.

How prevalent is hypertension?

Hypertension, also known as high blood pressure, occurs in nearly half of all adults in America. While it can be present in younger to middle-aged individuals due to medical history or lifestyle choices, it is more frequently found in older adults – age 60 and above.

Though its prevalence is undeniable in the United States, many people remain unaware that they have high blood pressure. Luckily, this is easy to determine in a routine doctor's visit or through an at-home monitoring device. It is essential to be in the know about the status of your blood pressure to take action steps toward treatment or management, if necessary.

How to Determine if You Have High Blood Pressure

At your next doctor's visit, have your blood pressure checked by your physician's office. Usually carried out as a preventative measure, your physician's office will often share your blood pressure reading with you during your visit.

As the American Heart Association shares, an average blood pressure reading is 120/80. If your blood pressure test is continuously higher than average, talk with your doctor about how to treat and manage hypertension. Healthy lifestyle choices are a great place to start. With proper treatment and management, you can control your blood pressure to help you live a long and healthy life.

The Connection Between High Blood Pressure and Your Medicine Cabinet

So how does high blood pressure play a role in discussing the medicines in your medicine cabinet? Your medicine cabinet may currently contain one or more medications that could be elevating your blood pressure.

If you are treating your hypertension, you need to be aware that you could be undermining your well-being by taking certain medications from your medicine cabinet, in addition to your blood pressure medications.

Over-the-Counter Medications that can Affect Hypertension

Everyday medications available for purchase over the counter may contain ingredients that cause increased blood pressure.

Two of the most common medications that fall into this category:

- Pseudoephedrine
- Phenylephrine

These can be found in medications used to combat coughs, colds, or flu, as well as decongestants.

Someone with hypertension should also stay away from:

- Non-steroidal anti-inflammatory drugs (NSAIDs) like ibuprofen and naproxen. These medications can increase the risk of a heart attack or stroke with high doses or prolonged use.
- Antacids high in sodium
- Weight-loss stimulants
- Herbal remedies
- Dietary supplements

If you have a question about a specific medication potentially affecting high blood pressure, ask your doctor or pharmacist for clarification.

Prescription Medications that Pose a Threat to Hypertension

In addition to over-the-counter medications, there are also common prescription medications that can inadvertently increase blood pressure.

- Oral steroids used to treat conditions such as gout, lupus, and rheumatoid arthritis
- Certain antidepressants that are SNRIs
- Attention disorder medicines

Immunosuppressants, central nervous system stimulants, and drugs used to treat autoimmune diseases and cancers can also affect blood pressure.

Stay Alert on Which Medications in your Medicine Cabinet May Increase Blood Pressure

A practical first step is to review the contents of your medicine cabinet and read the medication labels. If you see an item we have discussed as a potential blood pressure risk, talk with your doctor to determine a safer alternative. When reviewing over-the-counter medications, read the labels to see if any ingredients may pose a risk. You may even ask the store's pharmacist.

Keep a complete, up-to-date list of medications you take, even those given to you as samples, to show your doctor, especially when considering adding a new medication into your routine.

In addition, use a single pharmacy whenever possible. If you use multiple pharmacies, make sure that each pharmacy has record of all your medications. That way, when filling prescriptions, your pharmacists is more likely to alert you if any potential interactions may be hazardous to your health.

What Causes Pediatric Hearing Loss?

There are two types of hearing loss: nerve hearing loss (also called sensorineural hearing loss – SNHL) and conductive hearing loss.

Nerve hearing loss is permanent and can be caused by various factors, including:

- Genetic factors
- Infection (such as meningitis or Congenital Cytomegalovirus – CMV)
- Head trauma
- Noise trauma
- Anatomic abnormalities
- Certain medications

In some instances, the cause for nerve hearing loss is unknown.

Conductive hearing loss, on the other hand, is often temporary. This experience is caused by fluid in the middle ear or an eardrum or hearing bones abnormality. As noted by the CDC, medicine or surgery can treat temporary hearing loss.

In children and adults, ear infections occur in the middle ear, leaving fluid behind and causing temporary obstruction of sound. Children may experience fluid in the middle ear if there is an issue with their Eustachian tube – the tube from the nose to the ear.

How can one prevent hearing loss? Wearing ear protection at loud events, avoiding loud noises, and steering clear of head trauma will help prevent initial and worsening hearing loss.

Expect dinosaurs to be back in March

Millions of years ago, dinosaurs roamed the earth. And in an instant, they disappeared. Theories suggest that a meteor hit the earth causing annihilation of all life. Fast forward to today and in parts all over the world, paleontologists dig, searching for remains that may tell the story of the creatures and their habits. And it is because of the scientists who were curious enough to go looking for the T-Rexes and long necks that we are able to bring them back to life with our Walking with Dinosaurs exhibit.

Years ago, our exhibit started as a small booth with different types of fossils and a few display boards with tidbits of information or fun facts about dinosaurs for the students in Harrison County. They would visit on field days and hear our interpretations about dinos and their habits. They would conclude with some art activity and later be sent back on the bus to their respective school. We’ve come a long way from those days as Director Mike Book boasts in a recent interview.

“When I think back

about the early stages of our Dino Enrichments and the work we put into it, I am amazed as to how it has grown from small potatoes to what it is today,” said Book. “We have grown this into one of the perineal attractions in the area and our numbers prove that. The families and the dinosaur enthusiasts get hands-on experience at one of the best collections of fossils that money can buy.”

It is funny to hear the end of that quote as the exhibit has been free to any patron that visits the Recreation Complex. But, his comments are on point as to what is either seen in glass or even held in your hand has a value of tens of thousands of dollars. At one time, there was

close to \$100,000 worth of full-sized replicas in the main room alone. For Book, this is one of his favorite programs that the Parks Department offers.

“We offer the same quality of exhibit pieces that you find in all the major museums throughout the world. Those who fly will see the T-rex as you exit the gates and head to the main hub of the Pittsburgh Airport. We have those items for view. We have been blessed by so many full-sized pieces that it is almost impossible to choose a favorite exhibit piece over another.”

Our program has drawn a ton of interest simply because people want to know more about the dinosaurs. Mark

Jones, an administrator at Bridgeport High School, visits the exhibit on many weekends simply because of the passion his son has with the creatures. It is this family time that allows the parents and the kids to interact together in hopes of walking away with some knowledge about this topic.

Teachers rally early to contact staff about the dinosaurs and when they can get on the schedule for the field day. Book, who handles the registration portion of the enrichment, has had requests for dates minutes after the email notification is released to the schools. The dates for this year begin in mid-March and will continue into the month of May. This change in dates from early

February to early spring was made because of school cancellations due to inclement weather and problems with rescheduling.

“Weather has always hampered our program. Schools would get cancelled due to snow and, therefore, we would not have class that day. The biggest problem we faced was finding days to reschedule these classes. So, a move up in the calendar would help combat this issue and it would allow for some playground play if time and warm weather would allow,” said Book.

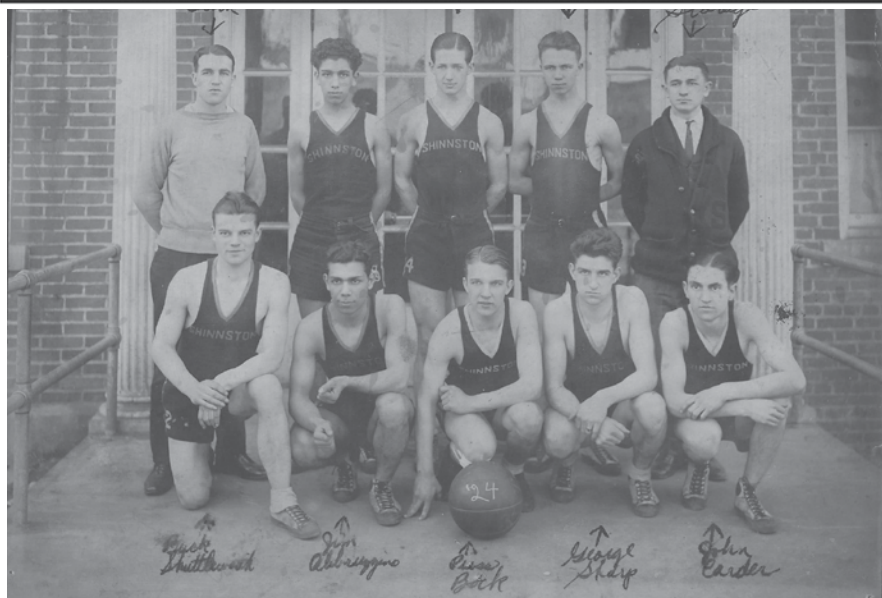

newspapers themselves. It’s one of those things that sound so good in theory but end up being so bad in practice. This year’s effort involves House Bill 4260. It carries the title “Creating the State Central Legal Advertising website.” Delegate Brandon Steele, R-Raleigh, is the lead sponsor. Delegates Geoff Foster, R-Putnam, and John Mandt Jr., R-Cabell, are co-sponsors. The bill was filed Jan. 19. On Jan. 27 it was sent to the House Judiciary Committee, where it remains. HB 4260 would eliminate the second and third publication of some public notices in favor of placing them in a new state website for such notices. Don Smith, executive director of the West Virginia Press Association, said the state’s newspaper industry always looks for ways to enhance the reach of public notices, including using the internet, but replacing print

publication with internet publication is a bad idea. Problems go beyond the fact that much of the state has inadequate internet service, he said. “Newspaper publication is a valuable and traditional source of public notice,” Smith said. When notices appear in print, people can share them with friends and family, he said. “You don’t have to find it yourself. Someone else can see it,” he said. With internet-based publication, people would need to actively search for what they need rather than having it there in front of them, he said. It takes the responsibility off the government and places it on the public, he said. “That is not the intent of public notice,” Smith said. There’s also the fact that online public notices can be buried in a user-unfriendly website. That would be a great way to hide important but inconvenient information.

Smith describes that process as an exchange of value and an investment in information. On some legals, counties can more than make up the costs of legal ads with publication fees they assess to the subjects of those ads with fees they assess, Smith said. Two years ago, at a meeting of the House Judiciary Committee, Smith said Boone County reported that it paid \$4,923 for legal ads during the 2018-19 budget year, but it collected \$69,725 in publication fees. That works out to more than \$14 received for every dollar spent on legal ads. What private enterprise, county government or school board would turn down a return on investment of 14-to-1? Sure, there is some self-interest when newspapers object to limiting or eliminating some legal advertising. Newspapers make money on legal ads. Legal advertising is a reliable source of income in a time when

other ad revenues are diminishing — even if the state sets the rates it will pay for those ads. Weekly newspapers depend more on public notices and legal advertising than dailies. Online news sites come and go with varying degrees of success and quality, but weeklies are usually the sole source of information for the less-populous counties. Weeklies are where people read about government actions and high school sports. Public notices allow people to know when a company wants to discharge waste into the air or water. It’s how people know when local government is about to hire a company to build a new ambulance station or pave a road. Public notices provide a direct, unfiltered look into what’s happening. Daily newspapers are more likely to survive this assault on their income than weeklies, but they, too, will suffer. Weekly newspapers in West Virginia

employ about 400 people. Should legislators who are hostile to local news media sacrifice those jobs to satisfy their anger? Of course not. “What county or municipality is better off if its newspaper closes?” Smith asks. “When it’s trying to help everybody else, government should not target the newspaper industry as an industry it’s trying to hurt.” A combination of print and internet publication of public notices works best for the public. HB 4260 is not needed for another reason, Smith said. Last year, the full Legislature passed into law Senate Bill 642, which orders the state auditor to create a state website for legal ads and requires all state agencies to place their legal ads on the website once it’s functioning. SB 642 adds publication on a state website in addition to the traditional publication in newspapers to increase public notice. Also last year,

Senate Concurrent Resolution 57 called for a related study of the state’s website for publication of legal notices in lieu of newspaper publication. The study will consider cost savings and the effectiveness of public notice. The auditor’s office is working on the website now and data can be gathered once it’s online. The trial period for that website will provide data on the effectiveness of print and online publication of legal notices “instead of the whim of one or two legislators,” Smith said. HB 4260 is another in a yearly battle of legislators who want to punish newspapers for slights, whether real or perceived. The survival of local media and — by extension and in principle — the public’s right to know what those legislators are doing is more important than a few egos. HB 4260 needs to die in committee for this year and for years to come.

Cases of online child sexual abuse surge in WV

As the COVID-19 pandemic persists, West Virginians have reported a drastic increase in cases of child sexual abuse involving the Internet.

West Virginians reported about 450 more cases of online child sexual exploitation to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children in 2021 than in 2020, and about 650 more cases than 2019.

In 2019, parents, guardians, police, and Internet companies, such as Facebook, reported 1,139 cybertips to the center, according to Sgt. James Kozik, director of the West Virginia State Police Crimes Against Children Unit. In 2020, that number increased to 1,333 tips. In 2021, they reported 1,791 tips. That’s about a 50 percent increase from 2019, before the pandemic, to 2021.

People who want to sexually abuse children may use the Internet in several ways.

They may condition kids to trust them over time, a practice called “grooming,” then

manipulate the child into sending a photo or meeting them in person. They may pretend to be another child. They may make threats.

They may also take or share photos or videos of children being sexually abused or explicit images of children.

Lisa Zappia, a licensed counselor and CEO of Prestera mental health center, noted that as kids spent more time isolated, families have dealt with more stress and conflict.

Meanwhile, extracurriculars, classes, and other outside-the-home activities slowed or were canceled, so kids have seen friends and loved ones less often.

“If you’ve got somebody reaching out to them who’s interested in them, professing to be a supportive person, acting like they care, acting like they’re willing to help them with stuff, then they’re going to engage in conversations because they’re young, and they think this person is wanting to be helpful... So they look for that connection,” Zappia said.

Zappia, who worked to help prevent sex offenders from re-offending in a previous job, said like other people, sex offenders exhibit some of their worst behaviors when they’re under stress.

Sgt. Kozik said perpetrators became more aggressive during the pandemic, demanding in-person meetings or images of particular acts.

“And there is an impression amongst offenders that during the pandemic, that nobody was watching,” he said. “And my belief is that many times that was correct.”

Sgt. Kozik said the vast majority of the tips reported to the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children involve the possession, manufacture, and distribution of child sexual abuse materials. That includes explicit photos and videos of kids, as well as photos and videos of kids experiencing sexual abuse.

Since a photo or video can be shared multiple times, the number of reports is unlikely to be the same as the number of victims. But the number of reports does show the problem has dramatically escalated.

The second most common type of report involved a perpetrator using the internet with the intent to commit a sexual offense or abduction.

The West Virginia Child Advocacy

Network is a group of centers throughout the state that conduct interviews of abused children for police investigations and link those kids with services like counseling.

Margot Evick, director of the Randolph-Tucker Children’s Advocacy Center, said in 2020, two kids told interviewers at her center they had been solicited for photos. In 2021, there were nine.

“We were all allowing our children to be online more because they were doing schoolwork,” she said. “But also because we were all home, isolated. And it was the only way they could connect with their peers again.”

Maureen Runyon, coordinator of the Child Advocacy Center at Women and Children’s Hospital in Charleston, said that even before the pandemic, online solicitation of children was shockingly common. Advocates would interview kids about an in-person incident, and find kids had been asked to send private photos online dozens of times, often through the chat function of online games.

“In their mind, this stuff is not a big deal, because it happens all the time,” she said.

According to Kate Flack, CEO of the West Virginia Child Advocacy Network, 19 kids were victims of “commercial sexual exploitation,” which refers to sex trafficking, during the 2020-2021 fiscal year, up from 13 the prior

year. While many people think of strangers when they hear the term sex trafficking, parents

and other people that kids know can also be traffickers.

Sex trafficking is federally defined as: “the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for the purposes of a commercial sex act, in which the commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion, or in which the person induced to perform such an act has not attained 18 years of age.”

And in 2018-2019, 38 kids told child advocacy centers they’d been depicted in explicit images or videos, according to Flack. By the 2019-2020 fiscal year, that number increased to 44. For the 2020-2021 year, the number increased to 69.

Preventing the problem

While parents, guardians, and other caring adults can’t eliminate all risk, Runyon noted that there are ways parents and guardians can decrease the likelihood their kids will be targeted. They can block certain apps on phones, and parents can require permission

before downloads.

She said she tells her kids that if they ever feel uncomfortable, they can ask her to pick them up any time, day or night. They can just say they “don’t feel good.”

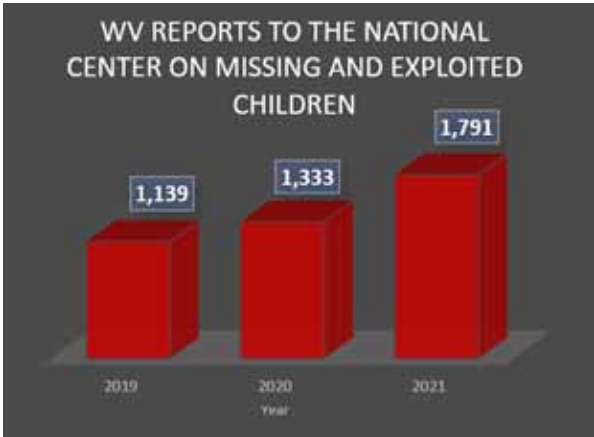
“I think you have to continually ask, not wait for children to come and tell you,” she said. “You’ve got to give them permission to do these kinds of things.”

Parents and guardians can also demonstrate to kids that those subjects don’t have to be secretive by teaching them age-appropriate names for their anatomy.

“Offenders target children who are less comfortable talking about those topics, who display naivete, because that means they’re less likely to disclose because of shame,” said Roberts Peters, founder of the SHIELD taskforce, an anti-child abuse group. “And they’re less likely to be able to articulate, especially in younger ages, the specificity of what occurred.”

To Peters, “ultimately, it’s about the relationship.”

“What keeps kids safe is a loving relationship with a caring, supportive adult, where these topics relating to sex, relating to safety, are not taboo,” he said. “And the child knows that if they were in a compromising situation, they could come forward, and it wouldn’t be a punitive approach. It would be an empowering approach, and a loving response by their caregivers.”



PSC fines Suddenlink \$2.2 million, orders it to open call center

The Public Service Commission issued a final order last week in its investigation into Suddenlink’s quality of service, finding that the company had failed to provide safe, adequate, and reliable service to its West Virginia subscribers. The Commission also determined that Suddenlink intentionally reduced its maintenance work and budget, reduced the number of full-time employees, changed its method of communicating with customers and ignored thousands of customer complaints.

The Commission assessed immediate penalties of \$2,242,000, which is the maximum penalty to date. The Commission has the authority to impose

future penalties.

The Commission also ordered Suddenlink to locate a call center in West Virginia. The company is to notify the Commission within 90 days, detailing its expected location and the anticipated date the center will open.

“Suddenlink’s conduct and performance with respect to its operations in West Virginia have been nothing short of egregious,” stated PSC Chair Charlotte Lane. “There is no excuse for its conduct except to increase its bottom line, doing so with a blatant disregard for its subscribers. Suddenlink should be penalized for its actions.”

Lane met with representatives of Suddenlink last year to discuss the staggering number of quality of service

complaints the Commission had received, including delays in service restoration, billing errors, and the inability to place orders for service or contact personnel regarding the status of service. Suddenlink was directed to provide the commission a correction plan within 30 days. In response, Suddenlink sent a letter that contained neither a correction plan nor details of the steps that the company had taken to improve service.
