Garbage fees increase

Editor

Enterprise was recently able to secure a rate increase without requiring approval from the state Public Service Commission, due to a 2020 state law allowing solid waste carriers to increase rates as consumer

prices increase. Enterprise Sanitation, which has customers in Harrison and Marion counties, filed a request seeking a 5.62% increase on 2, according to PSC filings. The previous base rate for residential customers was \$20.60; the new rate is \$21.76.

The West Virginia Legislature passed a law in 2020 allowing solid waste common carriers to annually increase beginning January 1, 2021, by giving notice to the Public Service Commission and its customers at least 30 days prior to January 1 of each year, with the rates to be effective on January 1, according to the PSC's 2021 Management Summary Report.

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) is a measure of the average change over time in the prices paid by consumers for Continued on Page 3

After coming to work football Miners Memorial became a driving force and federal black lung rushing record. legislation.

armed posse ambushed striking miners in their Stanaford near Beckley. Six miners were killed; Federal Judge B. F. Keller exonerated the posse.

Feb. 25, Newspaperman Comstock was born in Richwood. In 1957, he founded the West Virginia Hillbilly. weekly a newspaper that circulated both inside and outside the state.

Feb. 26, 1869: The legislature approved a bill moving the state capital to Charleston.

Feb. 26, 1972: One of the country's worst swept through Layland mining-related disasters occurred on this date on Buffalo Creek in Logan County. A coal waste dam collapsed, sending 132 million gallons of water, coal refuse and silt into the valley. In the end, 125 people, including families, were killed, and 1,000 people were injured. Feb.

1867: 27, Marshall College was established as a normal school for the training of Governor Wally Barron teachers. The first term began June 15, 1868, with 25 students enrolled in three departments.



Golden Harvest Pork Stew



Chase away chills with a thick, filling stew. Slow cookers can be unsung kitchen heroes any time of the year, but particularly during the colder seasons. That's because slow cookers take on one-pot meals with ease. A person simply places all the ingredients inside the crock, then returns in 8 hours or so to a completely cooked meal to enjoy! Certain recipes, including stews, lend themselves well to the slow-cooking method. While beef is often associated with stew, plenty of proteins can take the place of beef, including pork. This recipe for Golden Harvest Pork Stew, utilizes pork and combines it with potatoes, carrots and corn for a stew that some may even mistake for a chowder.

Golden Harvest Pork Stew

- 1 lb. boneless pork cutlets, cut into 1-inch pieces
 - 2 Tbsp. all-purpose flour, divided
 - 1 Tbsp. vegetable oil
- medium Yukon gold potatoes, unpeeled 2 and cut into 1-inch cubes
- large sweet potato, peeled and cut into 1 1-inch cubes
- chopped carrots
- 1 ear corn, broken into 4 pieces, or 1/2 cup corn
- 1/2 cup chicken broth jalapeno pepper, seeded and finely 1
- chopped clove garlic, minced 1
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1/4 teaspoon black pepper
 - 1/4 teaspoon dried thyme
 - Chopped parsley
- 1. Toss pork pieces with 1 tablespoon flour; set aside. Heat oil in large skillet over mediumhigh heat until hot. Add pork; cook until browned on all sides. Transfer to slow cooker.
- 2. Add remaining ingredients, except parsley and 1 tablespoon flour. Cover; cook on low 5 to
- 3. Stir 1/4 cup cooking liquid into remaining 1 tablespoon flour in small bowl. Stir flour mixture into stew. Turn slow cooker to high. Cook 10 minutes or until thickened. Adjust seasonings, if desired. To serve, sprinkle with parsley.

In the early part of 1957, a unique experience occurred for me but a very common experience for the average teen attending high school. I met a young lady, Naomi McIntire, from Enterprise, and was smitten at first glance. This may not seem important to you as a reader, but it was important for the band named the Emeralds whose members would eventually add to the long list of music credits and traditions for the city of Shinnston.

It was through my association with Naomi that brought me together with her brother Martin who, although he didn't know it at the time, was the catalyst for one of those rare opportunities to build great memories. Not just for our high school years, by bringing forever, together a group of young musicians who
