



Non-traditional nursing program accepting applicants

School of Nursing is accepting applications until July 1 for students to fill its first class for the spring of 2023.

The pandemic put a spotlight on a problem that those in the nursing profession have known existed for about 20 years. There are not enough nurses. Veronica Gallo, WVU School of Nursing professor, said there are several reasons for this shortage, including an aging

population among both the general population and the nursing pool. This means there are more people in need of care and less people available to care for them.

Gallo also said there are several new opportunities available for trained nurses, including spas, case management, in-home care, and hospice. This leaves a lack of nurses for traditional bedside nursing needs.

Another reason

for the shortage of nurses highlighted by COVID-19 is burnout. According to Gallo, nurses struggle with burnout even when there is no worldwide pandemic.

The WVU and UHC endeavor will be a brand-new solution taking a page straight from the history of nursing. In nursing's early days, hospitals did their own training. As colleges and universities became

B.F. Goodrich was located directly across the street from Blair Motor and their mechanics were in almost every day. They had nicknames for everyone, and I was given the moniker "Leadfoot" for my inexperience in knowing how to drive the standard transmission delivery truck.

Most of the old guys have long since retired and several have passed away. Goodrich closed many years ago but Wholesale Tire has remained in business and recently changing their name to In and Out Tire.

In February, Larry Hileman, an employee for over forty years retired and worked his last day. Larry worked his way up to manager and was one of the most knowledgeable people about tires and mechanical issues that I have ever met. You could call him up and describe a noise coming from your car and more than likely, Larry would know what to do and was able to squeeze you into the schedule.

Over his career, I'm sure that Larry had sold tens of thousands of tires and helped fix thousands of issues for area residents. If I was out of town and my wife was having an issue with her car, I would tell her to call Larry and do what he says. I hope Larry enjoys his retirement and knows that his work made a difference in so many lives.

Bill would help VFD recruitment

West Virginians are accustomed to relying on friends and neighbors during times of need. Our state's volunteer fire departments — made up of those friends and neighbors — provide a reliable safety net for communities across the state.

That safety net, however, is unraveling. Too many volunteer departments, strained financially, are running out of volunteers.

The West Virginia State Firemen's Association supports Senate Bill 420. If passed and signed by the governor, the bill would increase

funding to volunteer and part-volunteer fire departments by modifying the surcharge on taxable fire insurance premiums from .55% to 1%.

Several volunteer fire departments have closed their doors during the past 13 years. The consequences are troubling. Families and businesses are losing access to emergency services and fire protection. After a station closes, the nearest fire department to a home or business may be 25 miles away — not five miles away. Response times inevitably increase, and those additional minutes can mean the difference between life and death.

This week in West Virginia history

The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia at www.wvencyclopedia.org.

March 10, 1920: West Virginia became the 34th state to ratify the 19th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, which guaranteed the right of women to vote.

March 11, 1847: Boone County was formed from parts of Logan, Kanawha, and Cabell counties and named for Daniel Boone.

March 11, 1848: Putnam County was formed from portions of Kanawha, Mason, and Cabell counties. The new county was named in honor of Gen. Israel Putnam, who commanded the Continental Army at Bunker Hill.

March 11, 1856: Roane County was created from parts of Kanawha, Jackson, and Gilmer counties. The new county was named for Judge Spencer Roane, a son-in-law of Patrick Henry.

March 12, 1850: Wheeling Hospital was chartered. During the Civil War, the institution was used as a general military hospital. The Sisters of Saint Joseph were hired as army nurses, treating wounded Union and Confederate soldiers side by side.

March 13, 2002: Herbalist and folk doctor Catfish Gray died in Huntington. Gray was known for his vast knowledge of traditional plant lore and for his quaint and engaging personality.

At the height of the folklore revival of the 1970s, Gray was a frequent newspaper and television interview subject.

March 14, 1931: Noting the interest in the annual reunion of Carnifex Ferry battle veterans, the legislature created the Carnifex Ferry Battlefield Park Commission.

March 15, 1882: Union leader Frank Keeney was born on Cabin Creek, Kanawha County. Keeney, who went to work in the mines as a boy, became a rank-and-file leader during the Paint Creek-Cabin Creek Strike of 1912–13.

March 15, 1952: Governor Earl Ray Tomblin was born in Logan County. He was elected as a Democrat from Logan County to the House of Delegates in 1974, when he was only 22 years old and still a senior at West Virginia University.

March 16, 1906: Country musician Buddy Starcher was born Oby Edgar Starcher near Ripley. In 1946, Starcher cut his first recordings on Four Star, including his best-known composition, "I'll Still Write Your Name in the Sand," which became a hit in 1949.

more prominent across the country, the educating of nurses was gradually turned over to them. Gallo said the new program is "a very exciting" mashup of the two strategies.

UHC will be responsible for providing classrooms and opportunities for student clinicals, while the education students receive will mirror that received by students in Morgantown.

The fifth floor of the newly constructed east wing of UHC will be the home of the nursing classes, according to a press release submitted by the hospital. This 5000-square foot

wing will house two classrooms, a skills lab, conference rooms, a student lounge, and offices.

This project is the fourth of WVU's satellite nursing programs. There are existing programs in Charleston, Beckley, Keyser, and Morgantown.

Gallo said each of these endeavors is held to the same standard of education as the on-campus program. They learn the same skills, are trained to maintain the same attitude, and are required to take the same board exams. But the alternative to change careers with minimal time

allow students who prefer a smaller classroom, who are uncomfortable with the traditional college experience, or who are unable to transfer to Morgantown the opportunity to obtain a bachelor's degree. Bridgeport's fast-tracked program is a new strategy. Because the 24 students who will be accepted into the classes each year will already hold a bachelor's degree, this degree will consist of 66 credits of solely nursing classes and will only require 18 months to complete. This will offer people the opportunity to change careers with minimal time

requirement.

Wendy Holdren, director of communications and marketing for WVU School of Nursing, calls this "a great partnership between WVU and UHC." Both Holdren and Gallo said that one of the major strengths of this union is that clinical opportunities will be immediately available to students.

"This program is a national program housed right in the hospital," Gallo said. "Students can walk right out of the classroom, and, boom, you're in your clinicals."

recruitment and retention becoming more challenging each year, we are likely to see additional volunteer departments close. Those closures put additional stress on the remaining departments, which must expand their service areas and make certain they have adequate personnel to respond in a timely, professional manner.

Senate Bill 420 identifies a logical source of revenue, a fire insurance policy surcharge. With local fire departments closing and emergency services waning as a result, home and business owners will see increases in their fire insurance

rates. Insurance companies recognize the connection between the quality and proximity of emergency service and the risk that homeowners and businesses face.

Given that reality, strengthening West Virginia's volunteer fire departments is prudent for both public safety reasons and financial reasons.

Our citizens see their local firefighters hold hot dog sales and raffles to raise money to support volunteer departments. Equipment, fuel, and training are expensive, but the most critical element of every fire department is people.

We must recruit and retain volunteers who will sacrifice their time and accept the risks associated with providing critical emergency services. Their commitment makes our communities stronger.

Volunteer fire departments play a critical role in West Virginia communities. Our citizens know our volunteers and trust them. Our VFDs have rich traditions in supporting the quality of life in our communities, but we cannot take them for granted.

This is not a new problem. It is a problem that has reached a critical stage. We

believe the people of West Virginia have a keen interest in ensuring the success of their local VFDs. By working with the Legislature, we can address this chronic problem and allow our communities to continue to rely on local emergency services.

(Editor's note: As of deadline, SB 420 had passed the state Senate. After passing both the Senate and House of Delegates, bills may be signed into law by the governor; the governor may veto the bill, or it may become law without his signature. The legislative session ends Saturday.)

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In West Virginia and elsewhere, numerous attempts are under way to ban discussion of some of our nation's less comfortable history, especially as it relates to race and gender, from classrooms and workplaces.

Gagging teachers and forbidding honest conversations are not only unwise but impossible in an age where any student can—and does—find information on the Internet faster than parents. This creates an unwelcoming environment that won't entice new businesses or keep our young people here. Children are already forming groups to read and learn about the subjects that

Throughout the year and under normal conditions, our Enrichment Programs have been utilized by schools all over Harrison County as well as other outlying schools. Thousands of kids attend our programs and the demand has always been high on getting a date reserved. They are not necessarily play dates for the kids, but a chance to get away from the classroom and have a hands-on experience that you may not find in books.

While education is something you would not think would be offered here at the Recreation Complex, Director Mike Book has found a way to make it happen here with Parks and Recreation, and it is that additive that makes our department unique.

"Enrichments and the programs we offer during the school year

have had wonderful feedback over the years as many teachers and others have either sent thank you cards or posted activity on their school media pages. And it has been through word of mouth that has made our enrichment programs some of the better field day activities for schools," said Book.

"We take in all the emails and then chart their requests, once we can see if it works, then we send a link to them to register for their class. There is such a demand for the events that if we do not have some uniform way of handling requests, then things can really fall off the rails. This procedure has been pretty solid over the past few seasons."

The registration for the dinosaur exhibit begins this week, and based on response from the flyer we sent to the teachers a couple weeks ago, we should fill up in no time. This exhibit has always created a buzz within the education community, and I am sure that those who can attend will be impressed with all the hard work that we are doing. Prehistoric Planet has mediated with other

vendors in helping with many of the pieces that will be on display including the T-Rex, which will be shown with a different look than in the past. We have had Sue, the largest T-Rex head found, but sometimes without the body, you really cannot grasp how dominant-looking the king of the dinosaurs were. Having both on display will allow that without having to imagine based on scale comparisons.

"The team really gets wrapped up in this enrichment and it really shows with the final product," said Book. "It is always a wonderful creation when finished and the looks on the kids' faces makes all of our hard work worthwhile. I am sure we will get the same reactions this year."

House passes magistrate, election, natural gas bills

CHARLESTON — While contentious debates over bills in the West Virginia Senate were few and far between, the House of Delegates broke out in several debates over multiple bills, dragging out Crossover Day nearly into the early evening March 2.

The House passed 31 bills in time for Crossover Day when bills must be passed and sent to the state Senate. Lawmakers have until midnight Saturday, March 12, to pass bills and send them to Gov. Jim Justice for his signature.

Debate and discussion of bills took sometimes as much as an hour or more depending on the bill. Some of the bills resulting in lengthy debate included House Bill 2910, a bill to modify the allowable number of magistrate judges per county. The bill passed 66-29.

HB 2910 would establish factors for allocating magistrates to counties every 10 years based on a county's population and the caseload of magistrates in the county starting in 2024. No one county could have less than two magistrates, but the bill could result in some counties losing magistrates and some counties gaining magistrates. The bill would cap the number of magistrates in the state at the current level of 158 magistrates.

An amendment to HB 2910 approved by delegates Wednesday would also require the West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals to develop a rule to create a system that would allow a magistrate to preside over certain cases on a circuit or regional basis. Del. John Hardy, R-Berkeley, said the bill would help growing parts of the state where magistrates are swamped with cases without additional magistrates to help shoulder the caseload.

"I believe that the time is right. I believe the policy is a step in the right direction," Hardy said. "It's been far too long, 25 years since we have reallocated or taken another look at our magistrates. We know there have been huge shifts in population in the state. We know what certain areas of the state are underserved and access to justice is being denied."

Del. Cody Thompson, D-Randolph, said HB 2910 would result in several southern West Virginia counties and rural counties losing magistrates.

"Reducing them by one is really going to overload their workload," Thompson said. "When we start reducing the

number of magistrates, it's not going to work. We're going to have major problems when it comes to our judicial system ... I can't agree with it, and I won't vote for it."

House Bill 4293 would make it a crime for any person or election official to mail or deliver an application for an absentee ballot to any voter except when specifically requested by that voter. The bill passed 72-22.

HB 4293 makes it a misdemeanor to knowingly and intentionally mail or deliver an absentee ballot application without a specific request by a voter. While election officials are completely prohibited, a person is limited to 10 applications for mailing or delivery. Both a person or election official could face a \$500 fine if convicted or imprisoned for up to six months.

"There has been a history of voter fraud and a history with election integrity. On that basis, I think this is a really, really great bill," said Del. Chris Pritt, R-Kanawha. "I think it is going to put us in a really good position. It's going to send an example to the rest of the nation as to what election integrity looks like."

"The ultimate hypocrisy is politicians in this body, elected officials, are worried about leaving people alone in sending out an unsolicited application for a ballot," said House Minority Whip Shawn Fluharty, D-Ohio, in speaking against the bill. "Do you do the same thing when you send direct mailers to people with your mugs on them saying 'please vote for me'? No, you send unsolicited junk mail all the time. And you want to make it a crime to send something actually productive that's a public document."

House Bill 4336, providing for the valuation of natural resources property, passed 65-29, with a bipartisan group of several Republican and Democratic delegates representing natural gas-producing counties voting no.

HB4336 would provide a revised and more specific methodology to the State Tax Department for valuing property producing oil, natural gas, and natural gas liquids for property tax assessments, fixing a bill passed last year and addressing a legislative rule rejected in January from the State Tax Department that provided an assessment formula that lawmakers disagreed with.

The bill would require the State Tax Commissioner to develop a revised methodology to value oil and natural gas properties based on the fair market value based on a yield capitalization model. Net proceeds would come from the

actual gross receipts on a sales volume basis and the actual price received as reported on the taxpayer's return once royalties and annual operating costs are subtracted from gross receipts.

"The bill is a compromise effort to soften the blow to counties for moving to actual receipts, actual expenses," said Del. Diana Graves, R-Kanawha, who worked on this bill and last year's bill.

Graves said she involved Northern Panhandle state senators, the State Tax Department, and consulted with the Wetzel County Assessor's office. House Finance Committee Chairman Vernon Criss, R-Wood, said HB 4336 would put the state in compliance with a 2019 West Virginia Supreme Court of Appeals decision that determined the way the state assessed natural gas-producing property was unfair.

"It's not fair to one of the oldest industries in the state that they've played by the rules, they've made their appeals, they were told they were OK on their appeals, and now we don't want to play the game," Criss said. "If you want us to continue to be in the oil and gas business in this state, you need to be fair to them and we're not being fair to them right now."

But several delegates from natural gas-producing counties spoke against the bill, citing lack of data on how much the new formulation could hurt county budgets and county school system budgets.

"I think it is really important that we're fair ... but we don't have a fiscal note, we don't know how this is going to impact our communities," said Del. Lisa Zukoff, D-Marshall. "I'm happy that the (natural) gas prices are up and we know it's going to be a surplus this year, but what about next year? There are just too many unknowns with this."

"I'm concerned that if we continue down this path, then some other out-of-state entity might come in here and want to build ... and then say 'we're not being taxed right. We need to fix this.' Then we'll be back here all over again," said Del. David Kelly, R-Tyler. "We need to be careful. It's a slippery slope that we're on."

The House passed other bills, including: HB 4001, the broadband regulation bill; HB 4020, splitting the Department of Health and Human Resources into two cabinet departments; and HB 4320, which would allow natural immunity or antibodies to any illness to be considered equal or better than vaccine-induced immunity.

They sold Paparazzi jewelry, Tupperware, homemade jewelry, fresh pepperoni rolls, and hand-carved wood

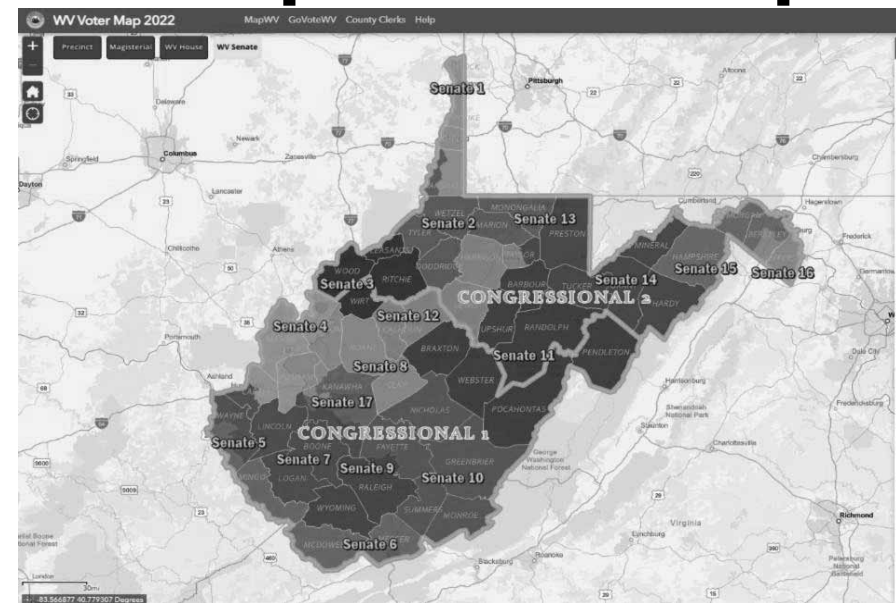
projects, among other goods. The event

State officials release new precinct map

West Virginia Secretary of State Mac Warner is releasing an online map providing voters with a statewide view of the new county magisterial and precinct districts ahead of the May 10 primary election.

As county election officials continue updating hundreds of thousands of voter records statewide that resulted from the 2021 legislative redistricting process, it is important to provide voters with an alternative to identifying their new

districts before they receive an updated voter registration card in the mail from their county clerk.

Voters may enter their home address in the website search bar and their district and precinct information will appear on the screen.

But Warner said the lookup tool is not an official source of information for voters' precinct and voting district information. In the weeks leading up to the May primary, county clerks will mail an updated registration card to each voter whose voting location

changed due to redistricting. If a voter does not receive an updated voter registration card, their polling place remains the same as the past election.

Eligible but unregistered citizens can register to vote 24 hours a day at GoVoteWV.com.

Hope Scholarship application period opens

State Treasurer Riley Moore announced applications to use the Hope Scholarship education savings account program for the upcoming 2022-2023 school year became available online on March 1. The application period for the

upcoming school year will remain open through May 15.

State lawmakers passed a law making way for education savings accounts last year. The Hope Scholarship is an education savings account program available for kindergarten through 12th grade students. It is designed to allow

parents and families to use the state portion of their child's education funding to tailor an individualized learning experience that works best for their child.

To qualify for the Hope Scholarship, a student must be a West Virginia resident and be either:

Eligible or required to be enrolled in a

kindergarten program.

Enrolled full-time in a public elementary or secondary school program in this state for the entire instructional term during the academic year immediately preceding the academic year for which the student is applying to participate in the Hope Scholarship Program.

Or, enrolled full-time and attending a public elementary or secondary school program in this state for at least 45 calendar days during an instructional term at the time of application.

In addition to filling out the application, state law also requires participating families to fill out a notice of intent to participate in the

program with their local county superintendent. A sample template for that notice is also available online at HopeScholarshipWV.com.

Treasurer Moore also announced his office hired Adam Shuemake of Oak Hill to serve as Director of the Hope Scholarship Program.
