## Nelson will not be tried for Dryfork arson case

The Tucker County Circuit Court convened with the Honorable Judge James Courier presiding. The court heard several juvenile cases, as well as others including a right of way dispute, and a guardianship request. Also appearing in court were James Nelson and his son-in-law Lester Mook, with daughter Tammy Mook joining via audio, only.

Previously according to the state, Nelson and the Mooks burned down a vacation home at 1675 Dry Fork Road February 28th, 2019 after the owner refused to sell the property to them. An informant cooperating with the police first identified the three as the perpetrators, claiming that she

had been present during the crimes. However, on a previous day, Nelson's lawyer, Daniel James, took particular exception to the informant's credibility, and objected vociferously.

While in court, the state decided to let Nelson go. Prosecutor Savannah Wilkins told the court that while she had combed through the evidence locker and spoken to the police, she had no evidence that would corroborate the informant's testimony that Nelson had been present during the crimes. "I don't believe I can meet that burden," Wilkins said.

## Darkmatter releases first recorded single "The Highway"

Skyler and Shane Humphrey, Tyler Bolyard, and Seth Dotson had no idea how far they'd go when they formed the band DarkMatter. On September 14, 2021 they released their first

recorded single titled The Highway.

The first time this band played together live was 2014. Since then they have played many times but knew that they were more capable of just covering others music. That is when they decided to write their own music. They had their first break-

through at Brew Skies in Timberline, thanks to Mountain State Brewery. They were on the line up at Brew Skies for two years. It was a great experience and they wanted more.

With the help of Rob Masten, who took the band under his wing, and Chris Newsom they started their climb to their first single release. Skyler gives credit to these two men, "Rob believed in us at a young age. Chirs showed us the ropes of recording." Recording takes a different skill set than just playing live.

Over the years the band would collect and get pieces of equipment for an in-home recording studio a little at a time. Before long they had a complete recording studio. The newest released single has been a work in progress since 2019. After two and a half years this single can now be heard on Spotify, Amazon Music, Pandora, YouTube, and soon on Apple Music. The first time they performed the song live was July 4, 2019 in Thomas, at Mountaineer Days.

The band performed their last live concert before the pandemic in Janu-

## Public meetings on proposed subdivision ordinance delayed

The Tucker County Planning Commission met to go over a draft of a new ordinance still in the proposal stages. The commission intended to present the proposed ordinance, which deals with new housing subdivisions, to the public this month. However, due to delays related to COVID-19, and because of disputes over the language of the ordinance, those public meetings have been postponed indefinitely.

Tucker County is one of the few counties in the state that does not have a subdivision ordinance. The intention of the ordinance is to ensure that future developers in Tucker County build their units in a professional, proper manner. For the ordinance to pass, two out of three county commissioners must vote in favor of it after a period of public comment.

Over the course of the summer, County Commissioners Lowell Moore and Mike Roseneau have attended various Planning Commission meetings, and have expressed agreement with the planning commission that the county needs such an ordinance to protect the public from sloppy developers. However, at the meeting, conducted over Zoom, some confusion and discord broke out. According to West Virginia state law, the ordinance must address both major and minor subdivisions— major referring to large projects, and minor referring to smaller ones.

With respect to the minor subdivision language, Rosenau raised some concerns over how the ordinance

## Judge Nelson has short day in court, grants continuances

Three out of the five criminal cases to be heard before the Honorable Judge Nelson on Tuesday September 14, have been continued.

Eric Pennington was to appear but due to positive COVID19 cases within Tygart Valley Regional Jail he could not appear in person. His attorney contacted the court prior to the hearing with this information and it was decided to continue this case until October 12, 2021.

Jonathan Lambert appeared via satellite from the jail for provocation of his probation. Lambert's attorney argued that there was not ample time to prepare for the case and asked that it be continued. Judge Nelson granted the continuance. Lambert will appear again on October 12, 2021.

Jason Hebb also appeared via jail satellite. There is a plea deal on the table for Mr. Hebb and it was mailed to the jail for him to look over. Hebb told Judge Nelson that he had not received a copy of this. Judge Nelson ordered a continuance for October 12, 2021. He instructed Hebb to be sure to ask the jail for his mail so he can be ready at his next hearing.

Dominic Bongiovanni was transported from jail and entered the courtroom in shackles. Mr. Davis, Bongiovanni's attorney, opened up with

arguments supporting his belief that Bongiovanni should be released from jail and issued probation. Bongiovanni has been incarcerated for one year. Davis argued "He wants a certain level of accountability and to continue on the path of sobriety." Checking in with probation means Bongiovanni will have to submit to weekly alcohol and drug testing. Davis informed the court that Bongiovanni has a place to live if released from jail.

Frank Bush, prosecutor, argued that he has seven prior convictions and parole violations. He has no ties to the community and he does not work. Bush asked that Judge Nelson stick to the 1-10 year sentence.

After Bush closed, Nelson opened the court to hear from Bongiovanni. "I will never be back here, I guarantee it." He claims the previous criminal charges were from his younger years. He has lived in West Virginia for 10 years and wants to remain here. He does not have a job, as he is retired. When asked why the judge should believe what he says, to which he replied, "My age. I want to live longer and do good."

Judge Nelson revoked the 1-10 year jail sentence and sentenced him to fiveyears probation. If he does good after the first year then his probation sentence would be ended at that time. Nelson firmly stated at the end, "You come back, you go do your time."



## Parsons City Council recognizes Bright for Ovarian Cancer Awareness Month

The Parsons City Council met running through an unusually light agenda. The councilmembers approved the prior month's expenses totaling \$110, 251.23, and recognized Roxanne Bright, who has been promoting ovarian cancer awareness through the "Turn The Towns Teal Campaign."

Via the campaign, volunteers such as Bright tie teal ribbons throughout town with symptom cards and other

information related to ovarian cancer during the month of September. Because there is no early detection test for ovarian cancer, building awareness of the symptoms and risk factors is key, especially since if detected in the early stages, the survival rate for ovarian cancer is between 90% and 95%. Bright, who is an ovarian cancer survivor herself, sported teal nails and said she has been promoting information about ovarian cancer on Facebook. The council applauded her for her efforts, and huddled to take a

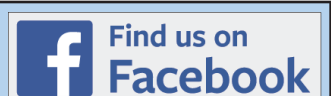
picture, snapping their masks into place.

Police Chief, Kevin Keplinger, raised the idea of starting a Parsons Police Department Volunteer Association, whose volunteers could receive Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) training. The council was in favor, noting that police volunteers could help with events such as "the COVID shot line, or car show." Keplinger admitted there is "some liability," however, when initiating civilians

As for the Mooks, Wilkins said she believes there is enough physical evidence to link them to the crimes. Lester Mook's lawyer, Pat Nichols, indicated the defense team will continue to try to undermine the informant's credibility, and is seeking her mental health records, and previous criminal history. They also are interested in the informant's phone records, noting that of about 80 calls she received in jail, "40 or 50" were from Staci Casstevens, who also happened to appear in Courier's court via teleconferencing August 20. On that day, Casstevens plead guilty to uttering a bad check in the amount of \$75 dollars at Big John's Family Restaurant in February of 2020. Casstevens is currently serving out a different sentence in Pendleton County. It is unclear how she is related to the informant in the Dryfork arson case.

Mook and Nelson, who have been out on bail, sat next to each other in court and remained impassive as they learned the Mooks will now go to trial alone.

could unintentionally impact landowners who merely want to sell off a few acres of land to their children or to friends. Similarly, Councilmember Ben Herrick raised the scenario where a landowner needs to sell off a few acres to pay for medical bills, or another such hardship. Both men argued that in these situations, the landowner should not have to deal with any added bureaucracy, and essentially be exempt from the ordinance.

While the other councilmembers agreed with the spirit of Rosenau and Herrick's comments, councilmember Tim McClean noted that family members selling land to each other are the only parties exempt from the ordinance as the language is written currently. Everyone else is considered "the public," and is therefore subject to the ordinance. The original thinking behind that distinction, McClean explained, was to prevent any bad-faith developers from buying a small parcel of land and building sub-standard apartments on it. Rosenau indicated that even so, he was not happy with the current language, and wants to ensure landowners in Tucker County can complete small sales of their property the same way they always have, without having to interact with the planning commission.

The planning commission thus retired tasked with a thorny yet familiar mission to bureaucrats everywhere: how to solve one problem without creating more.

## Child Passenger Safety Week is September 19-25; Make Sure Your Child is in the Right Seat

CHARLESTON, WV -- Governor Jim Justice has proclaimed September 19-25 as Child Passenger Safety Week in West Virginia. The proclamation was requested by the West Virginia Governor's Highway Safety Program (GHSP), which is working in conjunction with the U.S. Department of Transportation's National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) as part of the national observation for Child Passenger Safety Week. The week is dedicated to educating parents and caregivers about the importance of correctly choosing, installing, and using car seats, booster seats, and seat belts.

"With school in session and sports underway, I know life is busy for many West Virginia families. I encourage you to take an hour or so out of this safety week to double and triple check your child's car seat or booster seat. Make sure our most precious cargo is as safe as can be," said Gov. Justice.

"We know parents and caregivers have a lot on their plates, so we hope that Child Passenger Safety Week will provide an opportunity for parents and caregivers to take a little time to ensure their child is as safe as possible when in a car, truck, van or SUV," said Amy Boggs, Child Passenger Safety Program Coordinator for the GHSP.

"Tragically, two children under 13 years of age were killed every day in 2019 in the U.S. while riding in vehicles. No parent ever wants to get it wrong when it comes to a child's safety. Parents: Don't think you know, know you know that your kids are secured correctly in their car seats," Boggs continued.

Motor vehicle crashes are a leading killer of children, and the latest research from NHTSA shows that nearly half (46%) of car seats are misused. Boggs added that using size- and age-appropriate car seats and installing them correctly are the best ways to reduce these deaths.

"More than one-third of children 12 and younger who died in crashes in 2019 while riding in cars, pickups, vans, and SUVs were not properly secured – whether in a car seat or with a seat belt. Many of those kids could have survived if they had been properly secured in the vehicle," Boggs concluded.

From 2015 to 2019, there were 1,709 "tweens" (8 to 14 years old) killed in passenger vehicles, and in 2019 alone, the 8-12-year-old age group had the highest number of fatalities (229) among children in passenger vehicles. It is critical that parents and caregivers ensure that, if a child is too large or old for a car seat, they are first put into a booster seat until the seat belt can fit correctly.

### Car Seats Versus Booster Seats

There is also a deadly misconception that a certain type of vehicle may offer greater protection for your child. In 2019, 47% of unrestrained children killed in vehicle crashes were riding in vans, followed closely by SUVs (42%), and light trucks (42%). Children are safest when correctly secured in the right car seat or booster seat for their size — no matter the vehicle type. No matter how safe you think your vehicle may be, it is never safe, nor legal, to let your child ride unbuckled.

NHTSA recommends keeping children rear-facing as long as possible, up to the top height and weight allowed by the particular seats. It's the best way to keep them safe. Once a child outgrows the rear-facing car seat, he or she is ready to travel in a forward-facing car seat with a harness and tether. After outgrowing the forward-facing car seat, a child should be placed in a booster seat until she or he is tall enough to fit in a seat belt properly.

Booster seats are an essential step between car seats and seat belts. These transitional seats position the seat belt so it fits properly over the stronger parts of your child's body.

Don't feel pressured to put your child in a seat belt too soon. If your child is ready to use a seat belt, ensure the seat belt fits correctly. The safest place for all kids under 13 is in the back seat.


### Learn About Car Seat Safety Virtually

Child Passenger Safety Week ends with National Seat Check Saturday on September 25, 2021. The GHSP facilitates Child Passenger Safety year-round with fitting stations across West Virginia which are staffed with nationally certified Child Passenger Safety Technicians who have been specifically trained on child car seat installation and other safety measures. as police volunteers. "We don't want people rattling door knobs at 2 in the morning," he said.

Citizens may be surprised to learn that 80% of what their city government discusses is sewage and water. Over the weekend, a sewer line backed up into a house near Churchill Lane, and the city was unable to make contact with the personnel they pay to be on-call for such events. The issue was resolved when the city paid a private plumber to fix the issue, but all council members agreed this was not a good long-term solution, and a frustrating problem. "It torqued me," said councilmember Timothy Auvil.

Currently, the city pays several indi-

viduals with knowledge of the sewer lines to stay on call after business hours, but it is a nonrestrictive policy, explained Jason Myers, former City Administrator of Parsons. "If you mandate them to stay within (the area)," Myers said, "you have to pay them hourly." He suggested taking the weekly on-call pay away from the personnel who did not show up as a reprimand.

Interviews for the vacant City Manager job were delayed again due to sickness, this time because Myers' wife fell ill, and Myers, who lives in Clarksburg, was unable to attend the rescheduled interviews.

City Council meetings are held at city hall are open to the public.

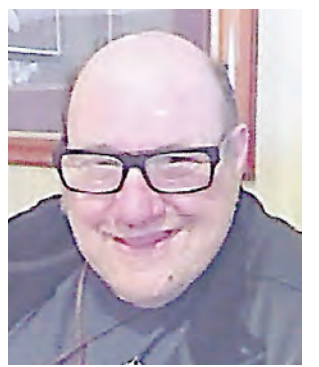

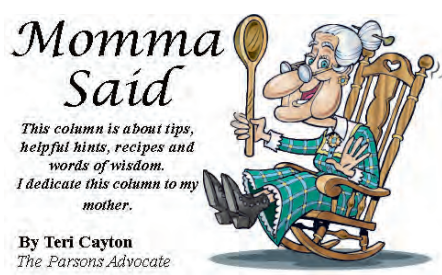

## Blueberry Crumble

### Ingredients

To Prepare the Berries

- 6 cups fresh blueberries
- 1/2 cup white granulated sugar
- 1 tablespoon corn starch
- 1 tablespoon lemon zest
- 1-2 tablespoon fresh lemon juice
- 1/2 teaspoon salt

### Crumble Ingredients

- 1/3 cup all purpose flour
- 1/2 cup rolled oats
- 1/3 cup white granulated sugar (Brown sugar can be used too.)
- 6 tablespoons cubed cold butter

### Instructions

1. Add the berries to a baking dish, followed by the sugar, corn starch, lemon zest, lemon juice, and salt. Using a spatula, mix until well combined and the berries are coated.
2. In a mixing bowl, combine the flour, rolled oats, sugar, and butter. Using your finger tips or pastry cutter, mix everything together until a crumbly mixture forms.
3. Spread the crumble over the berries until completely covered.
4. Place in a 350 degree F or 180 C preheated oven for 30 to 40 minutes.
5. Remove from the oven and serve with some vanilla ice cream.
6. Enjoy your easy blueberry crumble.



Charleston WV - The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to *e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia* at [www.wvencyclopedia.org](http://www.wvencyclopedia.org).

**Sept. 22, 1856:** Albert Blakeslee "A. B." White was born in Cleveland, Ohio. He was West Virginia's 11th governor, serving from 1901-05. He was the fourth person to serve as governor from Wood County, his adopted home.

**Sept. 22, 1894:** Louis Bennett Jr. was born in Weston. Bennett was West Virginia's only World War I flying ace. With 12 combat kills, including three aircraft and nine balloons, Bennett placed himself ninth on the roster of aces. This record was accomplished in just 10 days after assignment to his combat unit.

**Sept. 22, 1970:** The "Brinkley Bridge" in Wayne County collapsed under the weight of an overloaded truck. The bridge was named for newscaster David Brinkley who had filmed a 1960 news report about the poor condition of the span.

**Sept. 23, 1922:** Five men were struck and killed at the Glen Rogers mine in Wyoming County when equipment fell during the construction of a deep shaft.

**Sept. 23, 1938:** The Mingo Oak was cut down after succumbing to the fumes of a burning coal refuse pile. The Mingo Oak, which stood near the Logan-Mingo county line, was more than 500 years old and may have been the largest white oak in the world.

**Sept. 24, 1918:** George Spencer "Spanky" Roberts was born in London, Kanawha County. He entered aviation cadet training with the first class of Tuskegee Airmen and became the first African-American military pilot from West Virginia.

**Sept. 25, 1864:** George Smith Patton was killed at the Battle of Winchester. Patton, a Charleston lawyer, had organized the Kanawha Riflemen, a Vir-

ginia militia company. He was the grandfather of Gen. George S. Patton of World War II.

**Sept. 26, 1816:** David Hunter Strother was born in Martinsburg. He was an artist and an author who used the pen name "Porte Crayon."

**Sept. 26, 1863:** The Great Seal of West Virginia was adopted by the legislature. The seal, which has remained unchanged, was designed by Joseph H. Diss Debar.

**Sept. 27, 1914:** Author Catherine Marshall was born in Johnson City, Tennessee. Her family moved to West Virginia and lived in Keyser during the late 1920s and the 1930s. Her

best-loved novel, *Christy* (1967), was based on her mother's girlhood in the southern mountains.

**Sept. 28, 1955:** Labor activist Sarah "Mother" Blizzard died at the age of 90. Blizzard was deeply involved in the United Mine Workers of America, from the organization's early beginnings in the late 19th century.



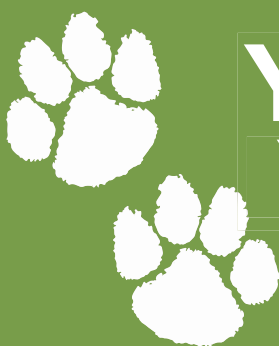

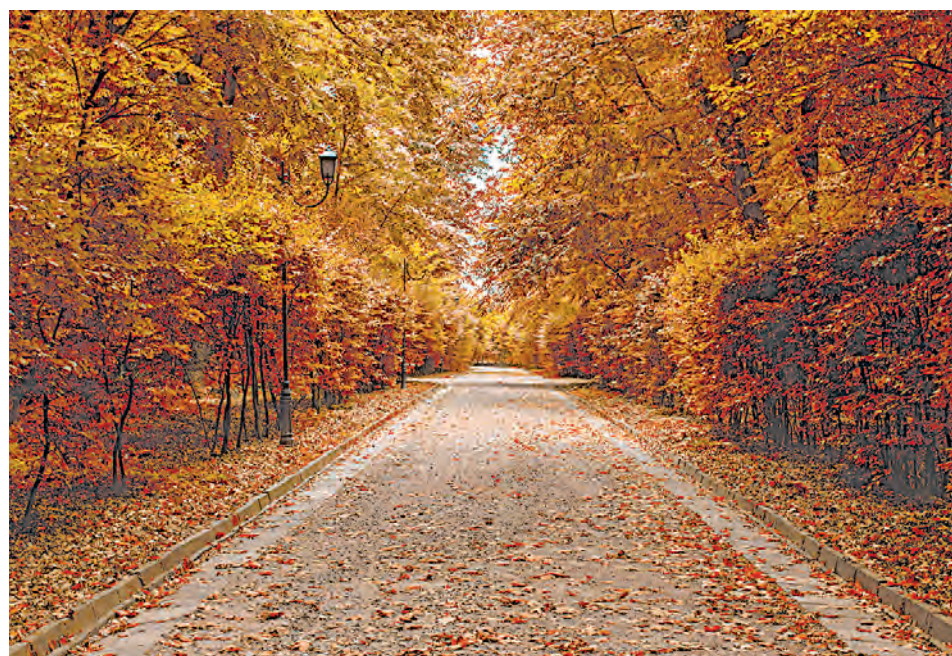

Weather is often the first indicator that the seasons are changing. For many people across the globe, the hot days of summer will soon be giving way to the more crisp days of fall.

For those who live in regions where summer only subtly gives way to fall or is seemingly gone before the end of August, the 2019 autumnal equinox occurs on September 23. That marks the official beginning of fall, also known as autumn. In fact, that the season the follows summer seemingly goes by two different names is just one of many interesting facts about fall.

A season by any other name. Fall is the term most often used to reference the season succeeding summer in the United States. But the season is referred to as "autumn" in other parts of the world, including Great Britain. Fall was once even known as "harvest" because of the harvest moon, which appears close to the autumnal equinox.

The colors of fall foliage are actually present year-round. Fall is known for its colorful foliage. But the pigments responsible for those colors are actually present year-round. According to the SUNY College of Environmental Science and For-

estry, green, yellow and orange pigments are present year-round. However, during spring and summer, the leaves serve as factories where many foods necessary to help the tree grow are manufactured. That process takes place in the leaf in cells containing chlorophyll, which gives the leaves their green color. This process ceases as hours of daylight decrease and temperatures drop. As a result, chlorophyll breaks down, the green color disappears and the vivid colors of fall foliage begin to appear.

Squirrels have a (sophisticated) plan out there. Squirrels hiding food in autumn for the upcoming winter is a familiar sight. And squirrels are more organized than many people may know. Ground-breaking research released in 1991 found that, even when squirrels bury that stash of nuts closely to one another, they will each return to the precise location of their personal cache. Recent research also has shown that squirrels bury their stash based on certain traits, such as the type of nut being buried.

Babies born in fall are more likely to see the century mark. Researchers at the University of Chicago studied more than 1,500 centenarians born in the United States between 1880 and 1895. They then compared birth and death information with those centenarians' siblings and spouses so they could compare their early environment and genetic background and their adult environment. Their research found that most centenarians were born between September and November.

# Leaf peeping planning guide

Millions of people each year look forward to the magnificent colors on display in autumn. Fall offers irreplaceable views, whether you're atop a mountain ridge or thick in the folds of a forest. In addition, the crackle of leaves underfoot and the earthy smell of the soil tempts the senses even more. Some advance planning can help make fall foliage trips that much more enjoyable and awe-inspiring.

## Peak viewing times

Areas of the northernmost latitude will start to show color earlier than more southern areas. Generally speaking, the leaf-viewing

season begins in late September and runs through early November for much of North America. Peak times for viewing depend on areas of travel and time of year. For

large swaths of Canada and the United States, plan trips for late-September to mid-October. The Weather Channel offers maps and charts at [www.weather.com/maps/fall-foliage](http://www.weather.com/maps/fall-foliage) for the peak times for many areas of the U.S.

## Pick your destination

Anywhere with deciduous trees provides the opportunity to witness blazing autumn color. During leaf-peeping season, travelers can go coast to coast and

see awesome vistas. Some regions are particularly known for their leaf displays. New York's Catskill and Adirondack regions are prime spots for visitors in the autumn. Those who live further north will find that leaves in Vermont are such an attraction that routes are published indicating where to enjoy the best views. Further south, Central and Eastern Virginia peak in late October. And don't forget the shores of the Great

Lakes, which are awash in reds, oranges and yellows by mid-September. The travel resource Frommer's offers more leaf-peeping locales to visit.

## Pack the right gear

While most people are not without a smartphone that can capture amazing high-resolution imagery, serious leaf photographers may want to take out their prized camera equipment for leaf-peeping excursions. Also bring along a map or a GPS-enabled device so you can explore back roads and areas off the beaten path more readily.

There are plenty of apps that can help with foliage-finding adventures, so a phone is a handy tool. When packing, also bring along

hiking boots, comfortable layered clothing and any equipment you'd normally take for an afternoon in the great outdoors.

Another idea is to hit the ATM machine prior to the visit. Many smaller towns and their local shops may not take credit cards, so it's best to have cash on hand for food and souvenirs.

## Extend the day

Make leaf-peeping part of a larger series of events for the day. Scope out vineyards where you can sample local wines or plan trips around orchards, where you can come home with beautiful photos as well as fresh-picked apples and pumpkins. You may find a county fair or street festival while exploring.



# Lucas Warner Wins Half Marathon - Again

Tucker County's Lucas Warner took first place in the Blackwater Canyon Half Marathon recently. The race from Thomas down the Canyon to Mill Race Park in Parsons typically draws around 120 runners from around the eastern United States.

Warner has won the race all three years it has been held, crossing the finish line this year at 1 hour 13 minutes and 39 seconds, a personal record and almost three minutes ahead of the second place finisher. Though a half marathon is officially 13.1 miles, this particular course measures closer to 13.3 miles, which means his 13.1 mile time would be 1:12:32. This is equivalent to a 5K pace of 18:33, or a 5:32 mile pace.

In addition to holding the course record for this race, in 2015 he broke the course record for Charleston's Frozen Sasquatch 25K (15.5 miles), coming in nine minutes ahead of number 2 and breaking the previous course record by over three minutes with

a time of 1:46:29.

In 2020 Warner came in first in the Frozen Sasquatch 50K (31 miles), breaking the previous course record, which had stood for 6 years, by over a minute, with a time of 3:59:37. Both his Frozen Sasquatch course records still stand.

One of Warner's favorite races is Tucker County's own Highlands Sky 40 mile Trail Run, which has attracted nearly 200 athletes from all over the country every year since its founding in 2003. Warner has run the race each of the last 6 years, winning it twice, in 2016 and most recently in 2019, when he finished 29 minutes ahead of the second runner. Current weather and trail conditions have a lot of bearing on times in these races, which cover a lot of rugged and difficult terrain. His fastest time for this race was in 2015 when he covered the 40 miles in 5 hours 57 minutes 28seconds.

He has also run in half marathons in Veracruz, Mexico, and in

2011 in Segovia, Spain, where he took first place in his category.

He ran track and cross country all four years for Berea College in Kentucky, and all four years qualified for Nationals in both sports. In 2013 he broke Berea's School record in the 3000 meter steeplechase.

Warner has been running both competitively and for fun nearly all his life. He says he got much of his early inspiration from hearing stories of his Grandfather Warner, who was a track and cross country star at Ohio State in the early 1930s.

Son of Denice Reese and John Warner of Hendricks, Lucas is a 2008 graduate of Tucker County High School where he was also an outstanding athlete in both track and cross country all four years. He made All State in cross country two years in a row, and his senior year he was State Runner-up in the 3200 meter run. His time of 10:08.8 in the 3200 still stands as the Tucker County school record.



# Morrissey Announces Tucker County – Berkeley Springs as Opioid Abuse Prevention Game of the Week

CHARLESTON — West Virginia Attorney General Patrick Morrissey announced his office will feature the Tucker County vs. Berkeley Springs gridiron matchup as an Opioid Abuse Prevention Game of the Week.

Throughout each week, the initiative engages with student athletes, coaches, school officials and communities across West Virginia. Representatives from the Attorney General's Office inform the respective coaches as to the dangers of opioid use and provide educational material for display and distribution in the schools to foster more discussion of the issue.

The week culminates with the Attorney General's Office staffing an information booth at each of the select sporting events to distribute opioid abuse awareness materials.

"Prevention remains key in tackling the devastation wrought by opioid abuse once and for all," Attorney General Morrissey said. "Each week this initiative provides yet another opportunity to present lifesaving information to communities across West Virginia. Without education, addiction can begin with treatment for the most routine of injuries, so it is crucial that we inform everyone – young and old – about the risks of prescription opioids in hopes that added awareness can make the difference in stopping senseless death."

The initiative, now in its fifth year, is part of a broader partnership to tackle opioid use in high school athletics. It involves the Attorney General's Office, West Virginia Secondary School Activities Commission and the West Virginia Board of Medicine.

"It's our privilege to host the Opioid Abuse Prevention Game of the Week," Berkeley Springs Principal Mitch Nida said. "It is so important to bring awareness to our community and educate our students on the warning signs of opioid abuse so that they may identify those in need and seek the proper channels for help. Bringing awareness and education on opioid intervention and recovery is a big step in resolving the opioid crisis."

Opioid painkillers may temporarily relieve pain, but do nothing to address the underlying injury and can have serious side effects.

The medication also carries striking similarities to heroin.

The Attorney General and his partners worry the unnecessary usage of opioid painkillers to treat athletic injuries could lead to increased dependence, abuse and addiction.

Parents and caregivers are urged to discuss alternative treatment plans with their child's healthcare provider. Such alternatives include physical, occupational and massage therapy, along with chiropractic medicine, acupuncture and over-the-counter medications.

If an opioid proves necessary, parents and caregivers are encouraged to only use the medication as directed, closely monitor their child's use, safely dispose of any unused pills and talk about the inherent dangers of misuse, abuse and sharing.

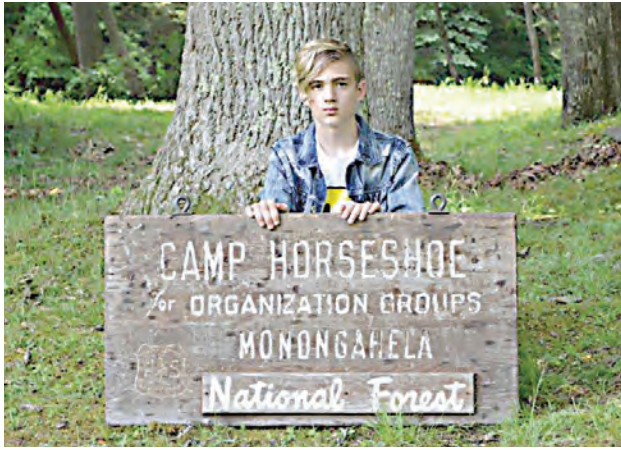

# Report reveals West Virginia spends 12th most on welfare

Public welfare encompasses a variety of federal, state, and local programs, including Social Security and TANF, which offer direct assistance to eligible populations, Medicaid and Medicare, which offer healthcare to low-income and elderly populations, unemployment insurance, and other important support to Americans.

In the last 20 years alone, state and local welfare spending has more than tripled, rising from \$233 billion nationally in 2000 to \$743 billion in 2019. As a share of total spending, welfare spending has risen from 13.4% of state and local budgets at the start of the millennium to 18.8% in 2019. Researchers ranked states according to state and local welfare spending per capita and included the share of total state spending dedicated to welfare spending in each location.

In West Virginia, 25.7% of total state spending is dedicated to welfare spend-

ing, compared to the national average of 18.8%. In total, West Virginia spends about \$2,708 per resident on

welfare each year. Out of all U.S. states, West Virginia spends the 12th most on welfare.
