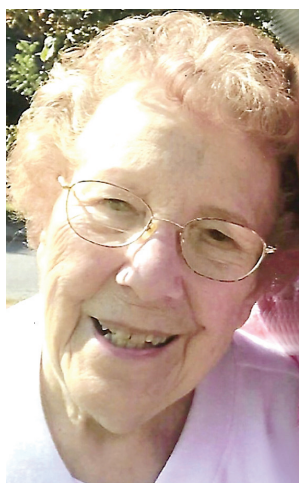

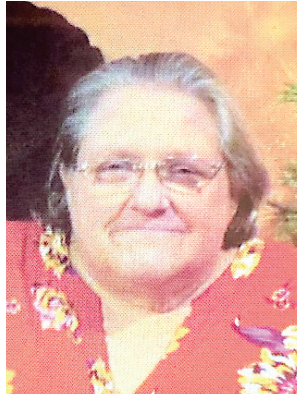

Jobs Act and other federal and state funding and grants.

The nine-mile, four-lane corridor will connect just east of Parsons, crossing over Backbone Mountain, to connect with the existing portion of Corridor H at Davis. The latest design also includes a relocation of WV 32 to serve as a truck bypass route for the town of Thomas.

The four-lane highway will pass under WV 32 with an overpass bridge. The interchange was moved to the east to include a service road, preserving the natural flow to the towns of Thomas and Davis. This will also reduce the footprint for sound and viewshed in the area.

The project will also provide Tucker County High School with direct access to Corridor H with an interchange that includes the safety mea-

sures of no left turns onto the corridor for buses or students entering and exiting the school. This design will reduce traffic backups and accidents.

In addition, a 1000’ long steel arch bridge with a center span of 700’ is being designed to span the North Fork of the Blackwater River. A planned overlook, with informational site on the history of the area, will be on the Southeast end of the bridge looking toward Douglas Falls.

Construction of Corridor H from Parsons to Davis is anticipated to begin in 2024, with completion expected in 2030, however, every opportunity will be explored to accelerate that schedule.

"We're going to build that road," said Secretary Wriston. "And we're going to build it right."

Organic Deer Juice Garden Spray

- 6 whole cloves garlic
- 1 – 2.5 oz. container chili powder
- 1 – 2.5 oz. container cayenne pepper
- 1 bar Fels-Naptha soap, grated
- 6 shallots
- 4 eggs
- Cheese cloth
- 5 gallon bucket with lid or large container with lid
- Hot water

For best results put garlic cloves, shallots and eggs (shell and all) in a food

processor and grind. Fill bucket or large container with hot water. Place all ingredients in a large piece of cheesecloth and tie securely. Place in bucket or container of water and replace lid. Let sit for a few days until fully infused. Stir liquid and place in spray bottle. Spray around plants usually eaten by deer or rabbits. They both rely on their sense of smell and this is not to their liking. If you have a lot of plants you can make a large batch and pour a border around your plants.

Charleston WV — The following events happened on these dates in West Virginia history. To read more, go to *e-WV: The West Virginia Encyclopedia* at www.wvencyclopedia.org.

April 19, 1896: Writer Melville Davisson Post was born in Harrison County. His best-known works are the Randolph Mason series, published in three volumes, and the more successful collection, *Uncle Abner: Master of Mysteries*.

April 19, 1902: Author Jean Lee Latham was born in Buckhannon. She wrote a number of children’s books, including *Carry On, Mr. Bowditch*, which won the 1956 Newberry Award.

April 20, 1823: General Jesse Lee Reno was born in Wheeling. He graduated from West Point in 1846, with another cadet from western Virginia, Thomas J. Jackson, later known as “Stonewall.” Reno was the highest-ranking officer from present West Virginia killed in the Civil War.

April 20, 1863: President Lincoln issued a proclamation that in 60 days, West Virginia would become a state. This occasion was marked 100 years later during the state’s Centennial celebration with a special ceremonial session of the West Virginia legislature on April 20, 1963, in Wheeling.

April 20, 1909: Fiddler Melvin Wine was born near Burnsville. A favorite of old-time music enthusiasts nationally, he was

chosen as a National Heritage Fellow in 1991 by the National Endowment for the Arts, the highest recognition given to a folk artist in the United States.

April 20, 1939: Poet Irene McKinney was born in Belington, Barbour County. Governor Gaston Caperton appointed her state poet laureate in 1993, and she served in that capacity until her death in 2012.

April 21, 1908: Traditional musician Phoebe Cottrell Parsons was born in Calhoun County. Parsons’s traditional clawhammer banjo style, unaccompanied ballad singing, riddles and storytelling have influenced countless numbers of younger musicians.

April 21, 1936: President Franklin Roosevelt established the Jefferson National Forest. The West Virginia portion of this forest includes 18,530 acres in Monroe County.

April 22, 1908: Marshall “Little Sleepy” Glenn was born in Elkins. Glenn coached basketball at West Virginia University from 1934 to 1938 and football from 1937 to 1940. He was inducted into the WVU Sports Hall of Fame in 1992.

April 22, 2003: Activist Judy Bonds, a Raleigh County native, received the Goldman Environmental Prize for her fight against mountaintop removal mining. Her efforts inspired thousands and turned a local issue in West Virginia into a national cause.



April 23, 1857: Andrew S. Rowan was born in Gap Mills, Monroe County. Rowan, a military officer, was chosen as the messenger when President William McKinley wanted to send a message to Cuban General Calixto Garcia during the Spanish-American War. The 1899 pamphlet *A Message to Garcia* made the incident famous.

April 24, 1865: McNeill’s Rangers surrendered to Union troops at New Creek (now Keyser). The Confederate guerrilla force probably never numbered more than 100 men at any time but managed to inflict regular damage on Union operations.

April 25, 1863: About 1,500 Confederate soldiers under Gen. William “Grumble” Jones advanced through Greenland Gap, a deep pass through New Creek Mountain in present Grant County. The Confederates encountered 87 Union soldiers who held off several assaults before finally surrendering.

April 25, 1923: Union leader Arnold Ray Miller was born at Leewood on Cabin Creek in Kanawha County. In December 1972 he defeated Tony Boyle to become president of the United Mine Workers.

Snip-It-Ticket: Low Cost Spay/Neuter Program

The Tucker County Animal Shelter is administering a Low Cost Spay/Neuter Program for residents of Tucker County through a grant administered by the West Virginia Department of Agriculture with the West Virginia Spay Neuter Assistance Program and with matching funds from the Tucker County Commission. The total grant award amount is \$19,990 in low cost spay/neuter vouchers with a focus on low-income Tucker County residents.

Priority goes to applicants who fit the following low-income guidelines:

Eligible owners and caretakers must currently

be receiving assistance from at least one of the following state and federal public assistance programs: The Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); Medicaid; Supplemental Security Income (SSI); The West Virginia Low Income Energy Assistance Program (LIEAP); Social Security Disability; Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF); Aid to Families with Dependent Children (AFDC); Children's Health Insurance Program (CHIP); or Low Income Veterans Assistance. Please upload proof of current enrollment

in one or more of these programs to qualify. If your income does not fall into these guidelines, you may apply but priority for vouchers will be placed on those who fall under applicable income guidelines.

If low-income applications do not fully expend the grant total by April 30, 2023, the voucher availability will open to Tucker County residents regardless of income. All applicants must provide proof of Tucker County residency (current government issued photo ID with Tucker County address, proof of current paid Tucker County taxes).

The voucher covers up to \$120.00 off spay and

\$85.00 off neuter and rabies vaccination at All Creatures Great and Small Veterinary Clinic (304) 637-2400 located in Elkins.

We have a limited number of vouchers to issue, please call the Tucker County Animal Shelter (304) 478-6232 to request a voucher. Individuals may request up to 5 vouchers. Vouchers are non-transferable and non-replicable. Please inform All Creatures Great and Small that you have a Snip-It-Ticket Voucher when you schedule your appointment. Please ensure that you show up for your appointment and follow all guidelines from the clinic.

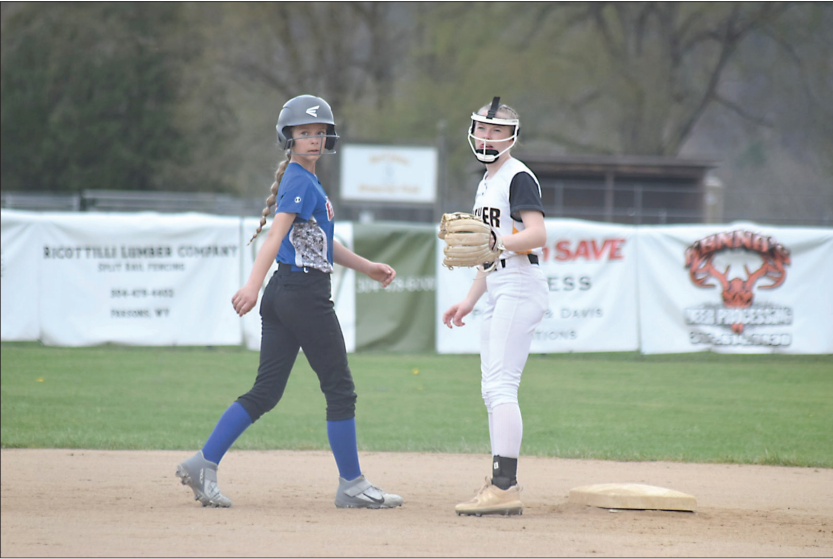

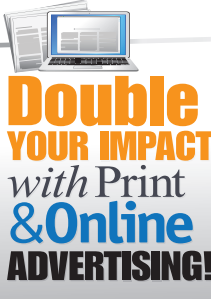

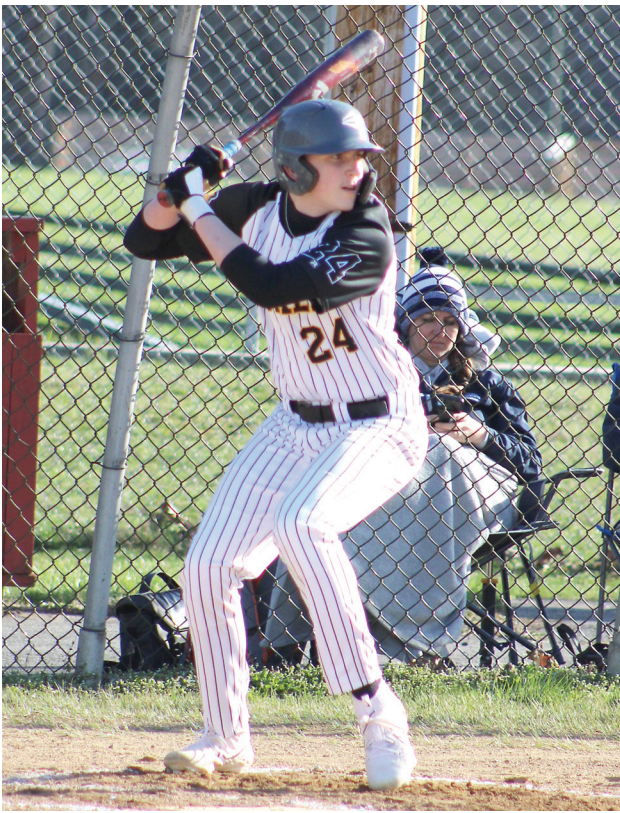
There were several potential candidates at the job fair. St. George staff also educated students about career opportunities within the medical field and their communities and networked with attendees.
