# **New City Attorney Attends First Meeting**

New Parsons City Attorney Timothy Stranko attended his first meeting as the official attorney for the City of Parsons. Stranko began his duties on September 1. Stranko sat in on the regular City of Parsons Council meeting.

Prior to the council entering executive session, Strako spoke on his recent tour of city facilities and his impression of the City's staff. "I spent a lovely afternoon with Aggie and the Mayor touring the city facilities and meeting your staff and you should really be proud of the people," Stranko said. "They were just 100% in with what the city's doing and they care a lot about their jobs. I was very impressed."

According to Stranko, there was a discussion of the Open Meetings Act and how agendas were addressed. "After that visit, we did talk about the agenda and the meetings act and the importance of no unforced errors. We're going to follow the Open Meetings Act to the letter. So then after that, I sent a memo to Aggie on these issues. One of the subordinate issues is the one we were discussing, but the memo itself stands on its own as an important reminder of how agendas are made in compliance with the Open Meeting Act. In this political environment, you just can't be too careful about compliance."

According to Stranko, the memo contained the Lead Case from the Ethics Commission on Agendas as an attachment. "But you will notice in that memo that the Code requires, as an aside I recommend, that we have some written rules about how we do business. How council does business. If you're interested in that, not required, but if you're interested in that I could certainly bring some examples along and share those with you in your next packet."

Following the council's vote to approve the agenda at the beginning of the meeting, Council Member Tim Turner questioned Stranko on the official procedure for agendas. "Could I ask our attorney a question?" Turner said. "It's my understanding that in Robert's Rules of Order that once the agenda is posted, it is the agenda and you do not have to vote on the agenda. You do not have to vote to accept the agenda because once it is posted that is the agenda."

Stranko differed in his interpretation and opinion of the matter. "No, I don't agree," Stranko said. "I think that the proper procedure is the one we just followed."

According to Turner, Roberts Rules of Order differ. "Roberts Rules of Order doesn't call for that," Turner said.

Stranko said that the rules state that the agenda is agreed upon by the council, but is set by the chair. "Trying to balance Roberts Rule of Order, I'm not sure which rule of order you're citing," Stranko said. "The rule that I am familiar with allows the chair to set the agenda, but not to dictate the agenda. The agenda is agreed upon by the quorum and I think that's a more fair, whatever my opinion may be. I think that's a more fair way to proceed."

Stranko said he would revisit Roberts Rules of Order

# Corricks Ford Battlefield Organization Dissolved

After 11 years in operation, the Corricks Ford Battlefield Association has been dissolved. Roger Ware addressed the Parsons City Council to present a check for the remainder of the organizations funds to the council. Ware presented the City with a check for \$3,774.19 with a recommendation that the funds go towards the purchase of benches for the park.

According to Ware, the organization was founded 11 years ago. "I'm Roger Ware and about 11 years ago we started an organization called Corricks Ford Battlefield Association," Ware said.

Ware said the group was tied to the 2011

## Renewable Natural Gas Company, LLC Proposes Partnership with Tucker County Solid Waste Authority

Jeffrey Craig of Renewable Natural Gas Company, LLC addressed the Tucker County Solid Waste Authority at the board's regular meeting on September 18th. Craig and his company proposed a partnership to collect, process and sell renewable methane gas produced at the Tucker County Landfill in Davis. According to Craig and in documents he supplied to the the Parsons Advocate and the Solid Waste Authority Board, the arrangement could yield the TCSWA an approximate \$370,000 in 2025 increasing to an approximate \$459,000 in 2043.

Craig said he had first visited the board in December with a preliminary presentation and due to recent developments, his company is excited about the prospect of developing the Landfill site. "Its been about a year since I first came down here," Craig said. "In December we came down and gave a preliminary presentation. And a lot has happened since then. Both inside our company

The Tucker County Development Authority heard the details of the recently completed Wetlands Delineation Report on the County Industrial Park at a Special session of the Authority held on September 7th. Executive Director, Steve Leyh outlined the highlights of the report, as well as the possibility of more useable land than existed on the initial 2005 study and map. "This is what we have always worked off of," Leyh said. "The idea was we could develop here, develop these, develop this and then eventually work over to that. All that's out the window."

The original map of the Industrial Park from 2005 had outlined 12 lots, according to Leyh. "Initially, they had laid out 12 lots for the Industrial Park total," Leyh said. "Now, obviously these can be cut up into any size, but they identified 12 different lots for the Industrial Park."

According to Leyh, in the initial

# Parsons PD to Target Distracted Driving

City of Parsons Police Chief Kevin Keplinger addressed the Parsons City Council about his department's eligibility for the Governor's Highway Safety Program funding. The funding would allow the department to begin a series of Distracted Driving Enforcement Patrols.

Keplinger said the updating of equipment has led to the department's eligibility. "We've been moving forward with different areas within our department," Keplinger said. "The mobile data terminals in the cars. We put in the wifi hot spots that we use. All that has made us eligible for a Governor's Highway Safety Program funding."

According to Keplinger, the emphasis of the program changes throughout the year. "Throughout the year, the Governor's Highway Safety Program does various areas of emphasis," Keplinger said. "Right now it is distracted driving...Next month it might be Click it or Ticket, it may be child safety seats."

Keplinger said he would handle all the paperwork with the Governor's representative in Fairmont. Keplinger also said the program is a reimbursement program with the patrolman initially being paid overtime through the city for the Emphasis Patrols."He'll report his hours on our timesheet which will be turned in and then what I will do I, I will turn in a grand total tally sheet to the Governor's Highway Safety Program, not on his overtime sheet or his overtime rate, but what the actual cost to the city is," Keplinger said. "Which is a little bit different."

Keplinger said there were fixed costs to the city for employees. "It was something...that I didn't really realize. I was like time and a half is time and a half. Well, not necessarily when you're dealing with the city," Keplinger said. "There are fixed costs."

According to Keplinger, the city would be reimbursed for the patrolman's wage and all associated fixed costs while he is performing the patrols. "So, the city will not be out any money at all with these," Keplinger said. "We will be reimbursed for the fixed cost, the cost that would actually cost him to be out there with his retirement, workers comp. You know, all the costs we have, but he would actually be paid his time and a half rate."

Keplinger said he had the availability of \$800 from the program for this period. "I have the opportunity, the option or the availability of \$800 for this period," Keplinger

The following criminal complaint has been filed in the Tucker County Magistrate office:

Daniel Kenton Leach, of Kerens, was charged with one felony count of Wanton endangerment involving a firearm. According to the complaint on Friday, Sept. 22 Patrolman First Class N.C. Gidley received a call from Tucker County 911 in regards to an active domestic situation. They advised that the reporting party (RP) stated that her sister had left with the daughter from their residence earlier in the day and had come to the RP's residence for safety from her husband. RP advised that the male subject, later identified as Daniel Leach, was driving around in a white van which had Elkins Motorsports stickers on the side, in an attempt to locate the wife and daughter.

Gidley responded in that direction along with Deputy Gidley of the TCSO, Officer Prickett of the WVDNR and Trooper Clark of the WVSP and Tucker County 911 advised the subject had pulled a firearm on the RP's husband and was reported as being on Billings Ave. near Mill Race Park. Pfc. Gidley was driving down First St. when he passed what he believed to be the subject's vehicle. Tucker 911 then advised that the subject had just passed Kidwell's Auto Parts. Prickett observed the vehicle approaching the traffic light at the intersection of First and Main St. Pfc. Gidley turned around and approached the vehicle as Prickett and Deputy Gidley pulled into position for a high-risk traffic stop as the subject was allegedly reported to be in armed with a shotgun. The stop was completed without incident and the subject was placed in handcuffs. A

# shotgun and ammunition were located in the passenger seat of the vehicle.

Leach stated that he and his wife had been fighting when she left. He was looking for her when he was informed they were in Parsons, so he drove over and tried looking for them in the trailer park. He looked at other places in Parsons then went back to the trailer park. He turned around and started back to the trailer park when he stated he heard someone yell, which then turned into a verbal altercation with the male. Leach stated the male got out of his vehicle, along with the passenger and both approached his vehicle. Leach allegedly stated he grabbed the shotgun and stated, "reach in here big boy, reach in here." At this time he left the area.

After the subject was detained and the vehicle was moved from the roadway by Deputy Gidley, he and Prickett went to the Overlook Dr. residence and met with the RP and victim. Deputy Gidley then contacted PFC. Gidley and advised he obtain a statement from the victim of the incident. Deputy Gidley advised that the victim was able to accurately describe the shotgun as being a short shotgun with no butt-stock. Deputy Gidley informed PFC. Gidley that the second victim was no longer at Overlook Dr. residence and could not be located at the time.

The statement reads that the victim identified Leach's vehicle and confronted him. The victim told Leach to leave and not cause trouble. The victim then exited his vehicle at which point, he states that Leach allegedly produced a "small shotgun" and pointed it at the victim. The victim stated that leach then pointed it at the other individual that was with the victim and allegedly said, "What are you going to do bitch, I'll shoot you too." The victim then stated they then got back into the vehicle and left the area.

It was determined from the statements of the victim and Leach that this incident occurred in the area of Billings Ave, near Hampton Dr. and Memorial Dr. Leach was then informed that he was under arrest for Wanton Endangerment and was read his Miranda Rights. He was then transported by Pfc. Gidley to the WVSP Barracks in Parsons for processing and then to the Tygart Valley Regional Jail.

All individuals are presumed innocent until proven otherwise in a court of law.

to clarify the issue and re-familiarize himself. "I'll look at Roberts Rules again, Councilor," Stranko said, "to see if I'm incorrect, but I'm happy to admit a mistake, but I didn't bring them with me."

Turner said that he had served on several boards. "Nor did I, but I served on several boards as President and I know that once the agenda's posted, it is as it is and you can't change it," Turner said.

Stranko said he disagreed and clarified his stance on the issue, but did reiterate that he would revisit the rules and present a definitive answer.

"Well, I disagree," Stranko said. "The principle is the quorum, in particular with the kind of government we have here, which is weak mayor, strong council that the quorum is the one that's responsible for the agenda and the presiding officer doesn't dictate the agenda. In fact, I'm going to give any member of the council an opportunity at the beginning of the meeting to say, 'No, I also want to talk about whatever the issue might be.' Now, of course with the Open Governmental Proceedings Act, we couldn't act on that, but at the next meeting, we could discuss it at that

highway grant. Which we had some big plans to do things with that and that just sort of took the air out of the balloon."

Ware said the organization has also recently lost one of their officers. "Here recently, we lost one of our officers, Kathy Moore, and that was pretty huge," Ware said. "I was really close with Kathy."

According to Ware, the decision was made to dissolve the organization. "At this point in time, we just felt that its best that we dissolve the organization rather than to have it be a dead organization and not doing anything," Ware said.

Ware said that during the dissolution process, money was left in the bank. "But in that process, we also

said. "Now that's up to."

Keplinger also said he does not anticipate using the entire amount. "I don't anticipate using that much," Keplinger said. "But I would like for permission for him to be able to work a few of these patrols."

Keplinger said the patrols would be targeting Distracted Driving. According to Keplinger, Distracted Driving is any device held in a person's hand, even a cell phone on speaker. According to Keplinger, all hand-held devices must be mounted or Bluetooth in order to not qualify as Distracted Driving. "It would be a two-hour, three hour, four hour Distracted Driving Patrol, which have some money left in the bank," Ware said. "And to that, we addressed that with the bank and with the other officers and things and decided that we'll give that money to the City of Parsons. It would be the best thing to further Corricks Ford Battlefield."

According to Ware, a walk in the battlefield spurred a thought as to how the money could be utilized. "Now one thing, and when I first talked to people about this, I didn't really have any idea what the money should be used for," Ware said. "But I went out there the other day and I was walking around and was like, 'We need some benches.' We need something that will hold up. A good commercial type bench. They're about a \$1,000 a piece to get a sizable

2005 study the Industrial Park had just over 50 acres of land able to be developed with the layout not allowing easy access to the Phase Two properties. "Initially the total number of acreage was 50.42 acres total," Leyh said. "50 Acres developable." Of the land in the initial survey, four lots had road access and four in Phase Two did not have any current road access, according to Leyh.

Leyh said there were several lots either in wetlands or impacted by the flood plane. "So, here we are, 2023," Leyh said. "This was 2005, fast forward to 2023. Lot one, 5.22 acres, completely not useable now. It is wetlands. So Lot one is now all wetlands. So forget about it, we're not moving on it. Lot four is partially impacted by flood plane now and is divided by a wetlands in between. Lot five which is this tiny .43 acre lot, is now completely within the flood plane. And then you come the 2.5 acre lot, which is Lot seven, and it is slightly impacted by the flood plane...Lot three...now has a wetland in the middle of it. So, if you could roll the dice and have the worst possible luck, this is what we've got."

Leyh said the new study changed everything for development of the Industrial Park. "So, here's the good news, or what I'm calling good news because we need good news," Leyh said. "The original lot layout in 2005 had 12 lots of roughly 50 developable acres. Half the acreage in 2005 was on the access road and the other half of the acreages was on the far side. The new map changes everything."

The Wetlands Delineation showed, according to Leyh, that there were over 85 acres of land on the site that could not be developed. "The Industrial Park is 147.28 acres total," Leyh said. "We have 85.42 acres of that, let's just round that, 85 acres you cannot develop under any circumstances because of wetlands, most of its wetlands."

In total, according the Leyh, the Industrial Park has just over 60 acres of land that can be developed. "We have about an acre already developed," Leyh said. "That leaves us 60 acres left to develop. For those of you that are keeping score on this, of that 60 acres, 60.86 acres, 38.72 of the acres are in what we are calling Phase Two. That leaves 22 acres accessible."

According to Leyh, the new Wetland Delineation gained the Industrial Park over 10 acres of useable land for development. "Here's what's crazy about this," Leyh said. "The Wetland Delineation we had done in 2023, netthings," Leyh said. "We gained bits of land on these edges on the inside and we gained, which I think is really a game changer, connection to Phase Two. So, 2023, no longer do we have to have the access road come in from the highway, because we can now go straight across...from our road."

"RK&K said, 'This is what we recommend,'" Leyh said. "They think that this piece of property... is about one to two feet in the flood plane and if we filled that in, one to two feet, that this could make a nice two acre lot, right as you come in on the inside of the road. Which is pretty important. Its not going to be as big as our five acre lot, but we're still going to have two acres right at the intersection which is still going to be a game changer for us."

According to Leyh, the areas in a flood plane could still be developed if the Authority brought in filler and raised the area out of the flood plane, but the Authority would need the permission of the City of Davis to complete the task. "We would have to get permission from the Town of Davis since they manage the flood plane," Leyh said. "But you could fill that in and its developable."

According the Leyh, most of the flood plane lots are one to four feet into the flood plane with the deepest being in the middle at six to seven feet. "This is one to two, this is one to four," Leyh said. "And these are all pretty much one to two feet. She said the kink in the middle, the middle is deep in at like six or seven feet and she said you don't want to mess with that anyway because it is going to connect right in."

Leyh also said that there was a wetland that was not surface connected that could be filled in for more land as well. "The wetland does not connect over here," Leyh said. "The same is true of this, because of a Supreme Court Decision, this wetland up in here on Lot three, which I thought we were doomed, because its not surface connected to the other wetland, because they are not connected, this could be filled in without any problems."

"So I'm a little bit more optimistic now that I have had a look at this now," Leyh said., "We also gained... there's a huge new pink area in the center connecting Lot three with the lots on the other side which we did not have before. That is new, dry, safe land for development so I am encouraged by that."



ted us 10 and a half acres of new land. So we gained."

Leyh said the biggest change was in the center of the Industrial Park map. "The biggest change between the 2005 map and the 2023 map is this section here in the center between the highway and the Industrial Park Access Road," Leyh said. "It is no longer a wetland. Its in a flood plane, there's an elevation change...we lost them to the flood plane in the sense that they are going to have to get raised up."

According to Leyh, the land gains and new map have given the Authority a new way to access the Phase Two properties. "But, we gained two big erty, the Tucker County Development Authority authorized Leyh to begin taking the necessary steps to sell and lease the usable property lots within the Industrial Park. In a unanimously approved motion made by Tucker County Development Authority Member Dennis Filler, Leyh would be authorized to persue land transactions with a 50 percent sale and 50 percent lease of properties within the Phase One area.

and in the industry so we're really excited about the opportunity to work down here."

"What we're proposing is to pay 12% of the gross revenues we receive from the gas," Craig said. "If we paid you a royalty of 12% a year, I think you could reasonably expect over the next 15 to 20 years, in the range of 300 to 400,000 dollars."

According to Craig, the estimated price he gave the board was lower than market price currently. "This price is very low compared to what the market price is right now," Craig said. "For evaluation purposes I've used a market price of \$18, we're probably over \$25."

According to Craig, installation of the gas collection system would be at no charge to the Solid Waste Authority. "What we're proposing is at our nickel to install a gas collection system on the landfill to collect as much gas, the methane, as we can collect and then interconnect with the Columbia Gas Transmission Pipeline," Craig said. "Which is, as you know, runs right around the landfill."

According to Craig, his company would handle the design and permitting of the project. "What we would do is pay for the installation of the system," Craig said. "Whether it be the design, the permit. We would own it, we would operate it. And actually that works out better. We prefer that. We do a lot of operations for a lot of sites."

Craig said he did not anticipate there being any issues with tying into the Columbia Pipeline as his company has an established relationship with the pipeline. "We've worked with Columbia on other projects in the past," Craig said. "Which was one of the benefits of this project because they're really great to work with. A lot of pipelines are not, but Columbia is. They really know what they are doing. Because their system collects a lot of natural gas, they're used to having people tap into their line and deliver them gas. A lot of pipelines are not and it makes it very difficult."

According to Craig, all the equipment in the proposed project is temporary and easily moved. "As you will see, all the equipment is skid mounted, nothing that is stick built. Everything comes in on skids. You either have it on foundations or like the compressor unit, on gravel and then you wire it together and you pipe it together. So there's not anything fixed to the site that can't be moved or relocated if we had to."

Craig said Chemex Global of Houston is the Project Team member company in charge of fabrication. "That's what Chemex does," Craig said. "They build the skids." Other companies in

the Project Team include Atlanta based ET Environmental and Lee Enterprises Consulting, according to Craig.

Craig said the landfill had the potential to produce over a million diesel gallons equivalents of gas a year. "Believe it or not, this site has the capability to produce over a million diesel gallon equivalents a year," Craig said. "So what does that mean? Well, the BTU volume in a million cubic feet of gas and the BTU volume in a gallon of diesel that's where that comparison comes from."

According to Craig, his company sells the gas in BTUs. "So the way we sell this gas is in BTUs," Craig said. "And there's about, I want to say...probably depending on how much gas, I'm sure a million and maybe close to a million and a half of gasoline or diesel gallon equivalents."

According to Craig, UPS is one of his company's main customers. Craig said. "Our principal customers are UPS... They now have over 300 delivery vehicles operating on compressed natural gas and that compressed natural gas is actually a lot of our renewable natural gas. Nationwide, they want their fleet of over 25,000 vehicles all converted to natural gas, or compressed natural gas, what we called compressed natural gas, renewable natural gas, by 2030. So right now there's not nearly enough gas to supply them. There's far more demand for renewable natural gas than there is supply...The other big customers are FedEx and Amazon. Who's got trucks on the road? Fleets, those are our customers."

Craig said his company had also been



contacted by a manufacturer of jet fuel wanting to purchase their natural gas. "The other interesting – and we got contacted last week by a company out of Houston who wants to buy our gas to make jet fuel. They'll use it in their process to make jet fuel. So the renewables aren't a fad, they're here to stay."

According to Craig, renewable natural gas is inexpensive to collect and process. "Renewable natural gas, of all the renewable fuels, is the cleanest and its the cheapest," Craig said. "Because to collect gas out of landfill and clean it up and make it pipeline quality is not expensive compared to doing a lot of other things. So long term, we think this is a great business to be in."

According to Craig, the gas is produced by the decomposition of waste within the landfill and creates methane, which is what his company collects and refines. Craig also said that unlike conventional natural gas wells that have a decline curve, landfill gas is dependent on how much material is added to the landfill. "The BTUs is all contained in the methane," Craig said. "The more waste to add to the landfill, the more gas you produce. So unlike a natural gas well that will have a decline curve, ours is just the opposite. We would expect on this site, for the gas curve to continue to increase, the amount of gas to increase as long as more waste was added to the landfill."

Craig said that the project would not be able to process all of the gas with the average being around 75%. According to Craig, the site could yield upwards of 1,000 cubic feet per minute of gas generated. "So we say, out of the thousand,

how much can we reasonably expect to be able to process? I would say about 750 standard cubic feet per minute."



1 TO 1<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> POUNDS boneless skinless chicken breast

 $\bullet$  1/4 CUP olive oil

- 2 TABLESPOONS red wine vinegar
- 1 TEASPOON dried thyme
- 1/2 TEASPOON salt
- Freshly ground black pepper
- 4 CUPS Romaine lettuce
- 2 CUPS kale
- 2 CUPS baby spinach
- 1 CUP grape tomatoes halved
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> English cucumber sliced
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> red onion sliced thin
- 1 ripe mango diced
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>3</sub> CUP toasted sliced almonds
- 2 OUNCES goat cheese

#### TANGY DRESSING:

- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> CUP apple cider vinegar
- 2 TABLESPOONS tomato paste
- 1 TABLESPOON brown sugar
- 2 TEASPOONS chopped fresh parsley
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> TEASPOON salt
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub> CUP vegetable oil

#### Instructions

1. Marinate the chicken by combining the olive oil, red wine vinegar, dried thyme, and salt in a zip lock bag or non-reactive bowl. Add the chicken breast and coat both sides with the mixture. Refrigerate for 1 hour or as long as overnight.

2. Make the dressing in a bowl or in a mini chopper. Combine the apple cider vinegar, tomato paste, brown sugar, chopped parsley and salt. Then drizzle in the oil while whisking until the dressing has emulsified and thickened. Chill until ready to serve.


3. Preheat your indoor or outdoor grill to high heat and grill the chicken breasts for about 5 to 8 minutes on each side until they reach the internal temperature of 165°F with an instant read thermometer. Exact timing will depend on the thickness of the chicken breasts. Transfer the chicken to a cutting board and allow it to cool slightly.

4. Remove the stems from the kale. Chop the romaine and kale leaves into bite sized pieces and place them in a large salad bowl with the baby spinach. Top the greens with the grape tomatoes, cucumbers, red onions, mangoes, and sliced almonds. Chop the warm chicken into cubes and add it to the salad. Drizzle some dressing on top and toss the salad to coat all of the ingredients lightly with dressing. Season to taste with salt and freshly ground black pepper.

5. Transfer the salad to serving plates and top each plate with some goat cheese. Serve immediately.

If making the salad ahead of time, let the chicken cool completely before adding it to the salad. Add the dressing and goat cheese right before serving.



# **WVDNR Reminds Hunters** to Buy Deer Stamps Before **Archery Season Starts Saturday**

SOUTH CHARLESTON, W.VA. -Hunters who want a chance to take up to two additional deer during West Virginia's statewide deer archery and crossbow season have until 11:59 p.m. on Sept. 29 to purchase their deer stamps.

Licensed hunters may harvest one deer on their base license during the archery and crossbow season and may take up to two additional deer if they purchase a Class RB or RRB stamp before the season starts on Sept. 30. Hunters may purchase their license and stamps at WVhunt.com or at an authorized license retailer.

"West Virginia's fall seasons are a great time to get back in the game and enjoy an outdoor adventure," said West Virginia Division of Natural Resources Director Brett McMillion. "We want to encourage folks to take advantage of the opportunity to take additional deer during this season. Not only do you get a chance to fill your freezer with extra meat, you get even more chances to enjoy West Virginia's incredible fall foliage."

Deer Archery Season Regulations Depending on the county, one or two additional deer may be taken during the season. Resident landowners hunting on their own property and Class DT license holders are not required to purchase additional archery stamps.

Hunters may take up to two deer in one day, but may not take more than one antlered deer in a day. Hunters may not take more than three antlered deer during the regular deer seasons and the following Mountaineer Heritage season combined.

In nine counties or portions thereof, hunters must take an antlerless deer in any regular deer season before harvesting a second antlered deer in that county. In West Virginia's four archery-only counties (Logan, McDowell, Mingo and Wyoming), hunters may not take more than two deer during the archery season and one deer must be antlerless.

Hunters are reminded that all deer must be electronically registered and legally tagged, but the first deer doesn't need to be checked before harvesting a second deer on the same day.

CHARLESTON, WV - The West Virginia Governor's Highway Safety Program (GHSP) is working with local law enforcement statewide to encourage drivers on West Virginia roads to buckle up during the statewide Click It or Ticket high-visibility enforcement mobilization that runs from October 6-22, 2023. This mobilization is part of the GHSP's continual efforts to increase seat belt usage in West Virginia. This mobilization also runs in conjunction with the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA) Region 3 regional mobilization, Operation Crash Reduction, running from October 6-9, 2023.

Operation Crash Reduction and the October Click It or Ticket are conducted during Columbus Day weekend, as historically, it is one of the deadliest holiday weekends for fatal crashes in NHTSA Region 3. Region 3 includes Delaware, the District of Columbia, Kentucky, Maryland, North Carolina, Virginia, and West Virginia.

"We want all drivers and passengers traveling in West Virginia to be safe on the roadways and to always wear their seat belt," said Gov. Jim Justice.

From 2011 to 2020, October was the most dangerous month on West Virginia's roads, with a total of 309 traffic fatalities during that time period. In 2021, 40 percent of all passenger vehicle occupants killed in crashes in West Virginia were unrestrained. To help save lives, we need to step up seat belt enforcement, day and night.

saving seat belt messaging, we ask that every driver and passenger take responsibility when they are driving or riding in vehicles. Too many people die on our roads because they were not buckled or not buckled correctly," said GHSP Occupant Protection Program Coordinator Amy Boggs.

Law enforcement officers across West Virginia will be out in full force, ticketing drivers who are caught traveling without a correctly buckled seat belt or transporting unrestrained children. This statewide seat belt campaign is aimed at enforcing seat belt use to help keep all vehicle occupants safe.

"At the current statewide seat belt usage rate of 92.5 percent, unbuckled drivers or passengers have a 20.10 times higher likelihood of being killed if they are in a crash. The reality is: seat belts save lives. Not buckling up is not worth the risk. Click It. Don't Risk It," concluded Boggs.

Wearing your seat belt is required by law, but don't just buckle up to avoid a ticket. The values of our families' and friends' lives in West Virginia are incalculable. The \$25 violators pay if ticketed pales in comparison to the lives of the people we love most. If you are caught driving while unbuckled and you get a ticket, look at it as your wakeup call. A ticket is far less expensive than paying with your life or the lives of your family and friends.

# **The Smallest Chu**



On Sunday, Oct. 15, 2023, Our Lady of the Pines and The Hope, Love and Charity Foundation will be hosting an open House and Ribbon Cutting Ceremony for our newest building, a Welcome Center with facilities, from 1 -3 p.m. There will be light refreshments provided. Come and celebrate this day with us.

West Virginia has many special and beautiful chapels. The state's most unique chapel, however, is Our Lady of the Pines located in Silver Lake. But perhaps not many Catholics know that the state is home to what is considered "the smallest church in 48 states." At the time of its construction in 1958 by Lithuanian immigrant, Peter Milkint Alaska nor Hawaii had joined the Union, lending sensibility to the church's claim at the time. Even though it might no longer be the smallest, this church in Eglon, WV is still very beautiful. Today it is known to locals as The Smallest Church.

The church may be tiny but it is no less divine. Mr. and Mrs. Milkint built the tiny chapel as a memorial to their departed parents. Measuring 12x24 feet, The Lady of the Pines Catholic Church is found in Silver Lake, an unincorporated community in Preston County, WV. During the end of the 1930's, Silver Lake began to attract vacationers looking to rent out cabins on the nearby man-made lake. A park and a campground were also built in the 1930's, hosting activities like boating, swimming and picnicking. That is when "the smallest church in 48 states" was born. The church was built as a family church, it hosts one tiny alter and six pews so the chapel can seat 12.

Today, the church has become a cultural landmark, featured on road signs and appearing on local postcards that can be sent through the Silver Lake mail office, appropriately considered, "the smallest post office in the world." You can drop your mail off here, hence its title as a mailing office. The church has postcards so come equipped with stamps or drop your money with the card and you can send one of those postcards during your visit.

When you stop by to visit Our Lady of the Pines Chapel, please sign your name to the registry then cherish the memories. The church is well marked and is located just off US219 at 101 Breedlove Road, Eglon WV 26716.

ELKINS, W.Va. - Hunters getting ready for the fall hunting seasons may now consult the 2023 Hunting Outlook and Mast Survey, the West Virginia Division of Natural Resources announced today.

The annual Hunting Outlook and Mast Survey provides details about the abundance of mast, such as wild fruits and nuts, produced by 18 species of trees and shrubs and the forecasted impacts to West Virginia's wildlife.

"Beech, walnut and hickory production was up compared to 2022 production and above average across all ecological regions," said Holly Morris, furbearer and small game project leader for the WVDNR's Wildlife

Resources Section. "In addition, red and black oak and scarlet oak production was up compared to last year and above the long-term average."

Soft mast production was mixed this year and hunters should pay close attention to the ecological regions they'll be hunting. Hunters should do plenty of scouting to determine how mast conditions will affect their plans. Locating good, natural foods can increase a hunter's odds of success.

Hunters can find a wealth of facts in the Hunting Outlook and Mast Survey, which is a helpful resource to consult before heading into the field. The report, compiled by the WVDNR's Wildlife Resources Section with the help of volunteers and other agencies, may be downloaded at WVdnr.gov/mast-survey.

# Oct. 1 started fall fire season

CHARLESTON, W.Va. – Fall fire season started Sunday, Oct. 1, and continues through Dec. 31. The West Virginia Division of Forestry (WV DOF) reminds residents to confine their outdoor burning to 5 p.m. to 7 a.m. Fires set during that time must be put out before 7 a.m.

"Autumn's vibrant hues bring joy, but they also signal the start of our fall fire season. We are asking everyone to please help us safeguard our forests from the threat of wildfire by following burning laws," said Jeremy Jones, State Forester and Director of the West Virginia Division of Forestry.

Debris burning is West Virginia's most common cause of wildfires, averaging more than 35% of all wildfires over the past ten years.

As the crisp, dry fall season replaces the humid summer, the air offers less moisture for grasses and leaf litter to absorb. Dry leaves and forest floor debris become more flammable. Burning is prohibited during the day because, even in fall, relative humidity typically increases in the evening.

A summary of forest fire laws and safe fire practices can be found on the state Division of Forestry website here.

The West Virginia Division of Forestry

ginia State Code Chapter 20-3-5. Fires set during that time must be put out before 7 a.m.

The fall fire season state law restrictions include:

• No outdoor burning from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m.

• Any fire set between 5 p.m. and 7 a.m. must be extinguished before 7 a.m.

• Fires must be attended at all times.

• Before leaving any fire for any length of time, the fire must be completely extinguished.

• Clear at least a 10-foot area (safety strip) around the fire and make sure all burnable material has been removed.

• Any equipment that can throw sparks and operating on land subject to fire by any cause must be provided with an adequate spark arrestor.

• If your fire escapes, you are liable for the costs of fighting the fire and any damage the fire may cause.

• Violation of the burning law is punishable by a fine of up to \$1,000.

The WV DOF can issue commercial permits to burn during the prohibited periods.

The Division of Forestry protects nearly 12 million acres of forestland across West Virginia. For more information on fire

# Senate Passes Manchin, Romney Bipartisan **Resolution to Reinstate Senate Dress Code**

Washington, DC – Today, the U.S. Senate passed U.S. Senators Joe Manchin (D-WV) and Mitt Romney's (R-UT) bipartisan resolution that would reinstate the business attire dress code on the Senate floor. The Senate passed the resolution by unanimous consent.

"For 234 years, every Senator that has had the honor of serving in this distinguished body has assumed there were some basic written rules of decorum, conduct and civility, one of which was a dress code. Just over a week ago, we all learned that there were not - in fact - any written rules about what Senators could and could not wear on the floor of the Senate. So Senator Romney and I got together and we thought maybe it's time that we finally codify something that was the precedented rule for 234 years. We drafted this simple twopage resolution that'll put all of this to bed once and for all, by codifying the long-standing practice into a Senate Rule and making it very clear for the sergeant of arms to enforce," Senator Manchin said in part during his speech on the Senate floor.

"The United States Capitol is more than just a place of work-it serves as a symbol of freedom and democracy to the world," said Senator Romney. "Hard work was done, and sacrifices made, to ensure that our legislative branch of government wasn't just housed in some tent. As senators, we should demonstrate a high level of reverence for the institution in which we serve—and our attire is one of the most basic expressions of that respect. I'm proud to stand with my colleagues on both sides of the aisle to call for a return to a level of dress becoming of the Senate."

# Congressman Alex X. Mooney Introduces the No Gun Rights Infringement Sham Act

WASHINGTON Rep. Alex X. Mooney introduced H.R. 5767, the No Gun Rights Infringement Sham Act, or No GRISHAM Act, to prohibit states or local governments that suspend concealed or open firearm carry permits from receiving any Federal financial assistance.

For background, New Mexico Governor Michelle Lujan Grisham issued an emergency order earlier this month which suspended open and concealed firearm carry in Albuquerque and the surrounding county for 30 days. A judge temporarily blocked the order, saying it likely violated the U.S. Constitution.

Nine House Republicans signed onto the bill as original cosponsors: Reps. Andy Biggs,

Lauren Boebert, Paul Gosar, Carol Miller, Mary Miller, Barry Moore, Ralph Norman, Andy Ogles, and Claudia Tenney.

This legislation is endorsed by the National Rifle Association (NRA) and the National Shooting Sports Foundation (NSSF).

"This order is a direct attack on the Second Amendment Right to Keep and Bear Arms. The Governor is in direct violation of her oath of office to uphold the U.S Constitution." said Congressman Alex X. Mooney. "No state government that so deliberately disregards your constitutional rights should receive a single federal dollar."

"Fundamental Second Amendment rights belong to law-abiding American citizens. They're not to be toyed with by Governor Grisham or any politicians who ignore the Constitution and treat them as government-approved privileges to be plucked away on a whim," said Lawrence G. Keane, NSSF Senior Vice President and General Counsel. "Sadly, some politicians refuse to recognize that they serve to protect their citizens' rights. Congressman Mooney's legislation is a stark reminder in a language that only certain politicians can understand - money. Politicians who meddle in the lawful commerce of firearms and tamper with Constitutional rights should and under this bill will pay a price."
