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Headstones Being Reset at Davis Cemetery



The Town of Davis Council approved 50% funding towards the purchase of materials to fund a project to reset many leaning headstones at the town cemetery.

An initially identified 177 headstones are slated to be reset at Davis Cemetery, according to Davis Cemetery Committee Chair Jeanette Ware. Ware updated the Davis Town Council Wednesday, September 25th on the project at the Council's regular meeting.

Ware said that three families had donated to the project, but that the cost would exceed the donated amount. City employee Joni Felton said that funds were available in the Cemetery fund for towards project. Ware said that donations were being accepted for the project, as well.

The project, according to Ware, consists of resetting the foundations or re-pouring the bases of the headstones, some of which has completely toppled over. Some of the headstones are from Civil War era soldiers, Ware said, and many no longer have living family members. Ware said there is an effort ongoing to find family of as many of the graves as possible, however, but the families will not be asked to pay for the restoration costs. Ware said the effort was mainly to inform the families of the restoration.

Ware said the contractor has been completing the work in a rapid pace. According to Ware 23 stones were completed in two and half days. Council Member Doug Martin said one of the stones required 860 pounds of concrete alone to reset the foundation.

Ware said work on the project is proceeding from the front to the back since that is what people see when they first enter the cemetery grounds, but assured that all the stones that need resetting would be completed eventually.

Ware also said she had considered releas-

ing the names of the headstones in an effort to find more family members, but overall was pleased with the project's progress. "I'm happy and I'm pleased," Ware said.

Ware asked the Council for approval for funds for concrete. Felton said the money was available and just needed approval from the Council to move forward. In a motion made by Mayor Al Tomson, the Council approved payment of 50% upfront cost for materials on the project.

Riverwalk Controversy Continues at Town Council Meeting

Controversy over the Riverwalk development in the Town of Davis continued Wednesday night September 25th at the Davis Town Council. Davis resident and developer, Pete Johnson appeared before the Town Council and Mayor Al Tomson to read from a prepared statement during the public comment session of the meeting.

In his statement, Johnson referenced difficulties he said he has endured in maintaining his building permit. According to Johnson in his statement, his permit expired due to the legal proceedings he was enduring with the Town over the Riverwalk Development project eminent domain claim that was recently dismissed by the Town. Johnson also mentioned a series of what he viewed as targeted delays by Mayor Tomson towards him and his develop-

Mayor Tomson responded by begin-

ning to read from letters that his office had received from not only the Town attorney, but Johnson's attorneys, as Tomson said that the eminent domain filing did not impact the construction of Johnson's home in Phase One, as the filing was only on Phase

Johnson rebutted that the filing impacted all of Riverwalk since it included the road that ran through the entirety of the project. The conversation then turned to whether Johnson was a residnet or a developer with Johnson stating that he never intended to be a developer and only became one because he saw a need and a solution to help bring housing to Davis.

It was during a much heated point in the discussion between Johnson and Tomson that City employee Joni Felton stood up and informed Johnson that his time was up and that the matter needed to be settled between attorneys. "This really needs to go between attorneys, Felton said.

Oct. 2, 1923: Hershel "Woody" Williams was born in Quiet Dell. During World War II, Williams neutralized seven concrete pillboxes at the Battle of Iwo Jima. Prior to his death in 2022, he was the last surviving Medal of Honor recipient from World

Oct. 2, 1949: The first class began training at the State Police Academy in Institute. The 20 cadets graduated on Dec. 20, 1949.

Oct. 3, 1935: A patient at



Oct. 6, 1928: Traditional musician William "Frank" George was born in Bluefield. The multi-instrumentalist and his wife, Jane George, were leaders in the old-time revival of the 1960s and 1970s.

Weston State Hospital started a fire in the main building that destroyed six men's wards

and caused a cupola to fall through the roof. The building was repaired, and the hospital remained in service for nearly 60 more years.

Oct. 4, 1934: Sam Huff was born at Edna, near Morgantown. Huff was part of a fearsome defense that led West Virginia University to a 38-7 record between 1952 and 1955, including three consecutive wins over rival Penn State.

Oct. 4, 1967: Basketball player Vicky Bullett was born in Martinsburg. While starring at the University of Maryland, she helped lead the U.S. women's basketball team to a gold medal in the 1988 Olympics.

Oct. 5, 1992: Andrews Methodist Episcopal Church in Grafton was designated as a National Historic Landmark, one of only 17 in the state. The first Mother's Day observance took place at the church on May 10, 1908.

Oct. 7, 1747: Pioneer Ebenezer Zane, the founder of Wheeling, was born on the South Branch of the Potomac River near present Moorefield in Hardy County.

Oct. 7, 1900: Poet Roy Lee Harmon was born in Boone County. He was the founder of the West Virginia Poetry Society and served as the state's poet laureate for 38 years.

Oct. 7, 1957: Musician Michael W. Smith was born in Kenova. One of the topselling artists in gospel music history, he has recorded 25 albums, had 35 number-one songs, and written over a dozen books.

Oct. 8, 1993: The Rev. Bernard Coffindaffer died unexpectedly of a heart attack. Starting in 1984, Coffindaffer began erecting clusters of crosses in West Virginia and other states. He was buried in Nicholas County, just across the highway from a set of his

Healthy Pumpkin Muffins

Ingredients

- 3 cups all-purpose flour
- ½ cup packed brown sugar
- 3 tsp. baking powder • ½ tsp. baking soda
- 1 tsp. salt
- 3 tsp. ground cinnamon
- ¼ tsp. ground nutmeg
- ½ tsp. ground ginger • 15 oz. can pure pumpkin puree
- 2 large eggs
- 3/4 cup nonfat greek yogurt
- ¼ cup olive oil
- ½ cup milk
- Pumpkin seeds, optional

Instructions

- In a mixing bowl combine the flour, brown sugar, baking powder, baking soda, salt, cinnamon, nutmeg, and ginger. Stir together and set aside.
- In a larger mixing bowl combine the pumpkin, eggs, greek yogurt, olive oil, and milk. Stir to combine. • Gradually mix the dry ingredients
- into the wet ingredients, mixing just

until combined. The batter will be very thick.

• Cover the bowl with a towel and allow the batter to rest for 15 minutes. During this time, preheat the oven to 425°F / 220°C.

• For bakery style muffins, line a 12 count muffin pan with 6 muffins liners, meaning you'll only fill every other muffin well with batter. I recommend spraying the liners with non-stick cooking spray because this batter does tend to stick to the liners. Fill the liners with 6-8 heaping tablespoons of batter. Sprinkle pumpkin seeds over the muffins if desired. Place one pan in the center of the oven and bake for 7 minutes at 425°F / 220°C, then keep the muffins in the oven, turn the temperature down to 350°F / 180°C and bake for 13-16 minutes or until a toothpick inserted in the center comes out clean. Allow the muffins to cool in the pan. Repeat with the remaining batter, bumping the temperature back up to 425°F / 220°C.



NOTICE OF FILING AND HEARING

On July 31, 2024, Mountaineer Gas Company (Mountaineer) filed its annual Application for approval of an Infrastructure Replacement and Expansion Program for 2025 (2025 IREP) with revised IREP rates for 2025, pursuant to W.Va. Code § 24-2-lk, which authorizes the Public Service Commission (Commission) of West Virginia to approve cost recovery of projects to replace, upgrade and expand natural gas utility infrastructure that are deemed to be just and reasonable and in the public interest.

In its Application, Mountaineer forecasts capital investment for calendar year 2025 of \$74 million as part of its multi-year plan. The 2025 IREP covers several categories of plant asset replacements and improvements, including mains, service lines, measurement and regulator stations, and house regulators. These plant investments are proposed to be made in Mountaineer service territories throughout the State. These investments are identified in the Application, which is on file and available for public inspection at the Commission's offices at 201 Brooks Street, Charleston, West Virginia and which may be viewed on the Commission's website, www. sc.state.wv.us.

Mountaineer proposes to increase IREP revenues by \$8.9 million, an overall revenue increase of approximately 2.80%. The IREP investments included in this filing reflect plant additions made or projected to be made from 2023 to 2025. The increased rates are requested to be effective January 1, 2025. The IREP rates apply as either fixed or volumetric rate increments, depending on the applicable rate schedule under which service is rendered. Mountaineer projects that if the program and IREP rate increase are approved as requested, the average monthly bill for its various classes of customers will be changed on January 1, 2025, as shown below:

Furthermore, the requested rates and charges are only a proposal and are subject to change (increase or decrease) by the Commission in its review of the filing. Any change in rates and charges will not become effective until authorized and approved by the Commission.

The Commission set a procedural schedule, including a hearing date on the Application that will begin at 9:30 a.m. on November 4, 2024, in the Howard M. Cunningham Hearing Room at the Commission's offices at 201 Brooks Street, Charleston, West Virginia. If no opposition to the Application is received by the Commission within one week of the hearing date, the hearing may be waived, and the Commission may

issue a final order within 150 days of the Application filing date. Anyone desiring to intervene should file a written petition to intervene within 15 days following the date of this publication unless otherwise modified by Commission order. All requests to intervene should briefly state the reason for the request to intervene and comply with the rules on intervention set forth in the Commission's Rules of Practice and Procedure. The Commission will receive public comments until the beginning of the hearing. All written comments submitted by the public and affected state(s) pursuant to this notice must be received by the DAQ within thirty (30) days of the date of publication of this notice. Under concurrent review, written comments submitted by the U.S. EPA must be received by the DAQ within forty-five (45) days from the date of publication of this notice or from the date the U.S. EPA receives this draft/proposed permit renewal, whichever is later. In the event the 30th/45th day is a Saturday, Sunday, or legal holiday, the comment period will be extended until 5:00 p.m. on the following regularly scheduled business day. The public shall have 135 days from the date of publication of this notice to file petitions for concurrently reviewed permits. Upon notice by the U.S. EPA to the DAQ, prior to the end of the 45 day notice period, the U.S. EPA may choose to hold the 30 day comment period on the draft permit and the 45 day comment period on the proposed permit sequentially. During the public comment period any interested person may submit written comments on the draft permit and, if no public hearing has been scheduled, may request a public hearing. A request for a public hearing shall be in writing and shall state the nature of the issues proposed to be raised in the hearing. The Director of the DAQ shall grant such a request for a hearing if she concludes that a public hearing is appropriate. Any public hearing shall be held in the general area in which the facility is located, after 30 day notice is given. The DAQ will consider all written comments prior to final action on the permit.




