Authorities on hunt for fugitive after sighting in Craig

Craig County locals were shocked last Friday, August 12 to catch a brief glimpse of Shawn Tolbert, 42, a Burkeville man who has been fleeing from state police and now the Craig Sheriff’s Department. Tolbert’s appearance has disrupted New Castle school bus schedules and put the county on high alert, but the strange series of events surrounding his evasion from police raises questions as to who the man is and why he’s on the run.

Tolbert got the attention of state police the previous day on Thursday, Aug. 11 after leading state troopers on a high-speed chase on Interstate 81 that ended with a crash in Craig County before Tolbert continued the chase on foot. Tolbert was not wanted in connection with any crime he may have committed before that point; the state trooper on the scene claimed he singled Tolbert out for a traffic stop as a possible suspect in a theft near Buchanan due to the appearance of his vehicle, but investigators have since ruled Tolbert out in that particular crime. After the original officer switched on

his siren, Tolbert immediately fled for unknown reasons. According to public background checks, Tolbert has previously been charged with numerous crimes such as DUI, failure to appear in court and violating probation—however, Tolbert was not actively wanted by police at the time of the chase.

Now wanted by state troopers for three counts of felony evasion from police and three counts of reckless driving, Tolbert fled into the dense woods of Craig County and is believed to still be hiding out there armed and dangerous. After being spotted in Craig, the Sheriff’s Department has obtained additional charges against Tolbert: criminal trespassing, obstruction, false identification and two counts of felony assault on a police officer.

As of presstime, Tolbert is still at large and believed to be on foot in the Sinking Creek area around Level Green and Northside, though no further information has been released regarding his identity or motives. Police are asking the public to be extremely cautious if spotting Tolbert and to immediately contact law enforcement.

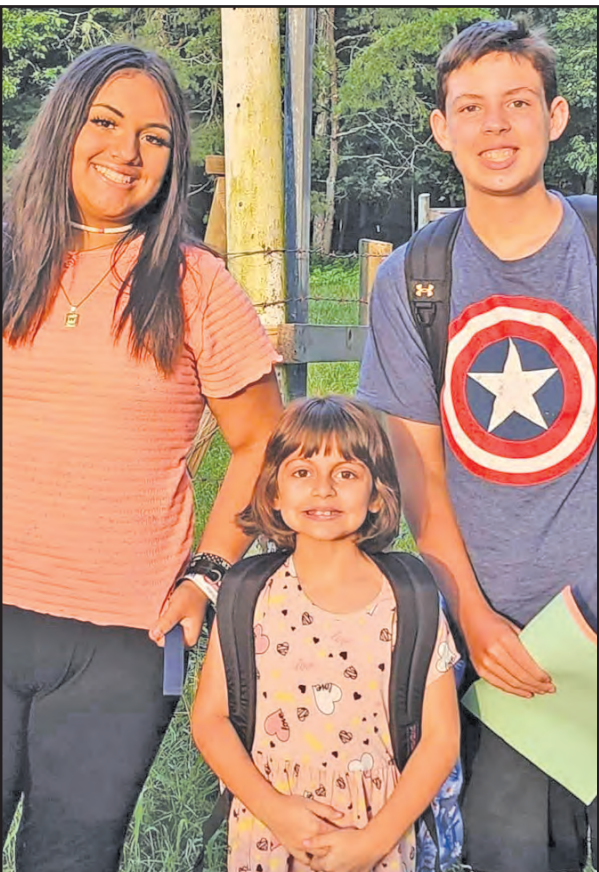

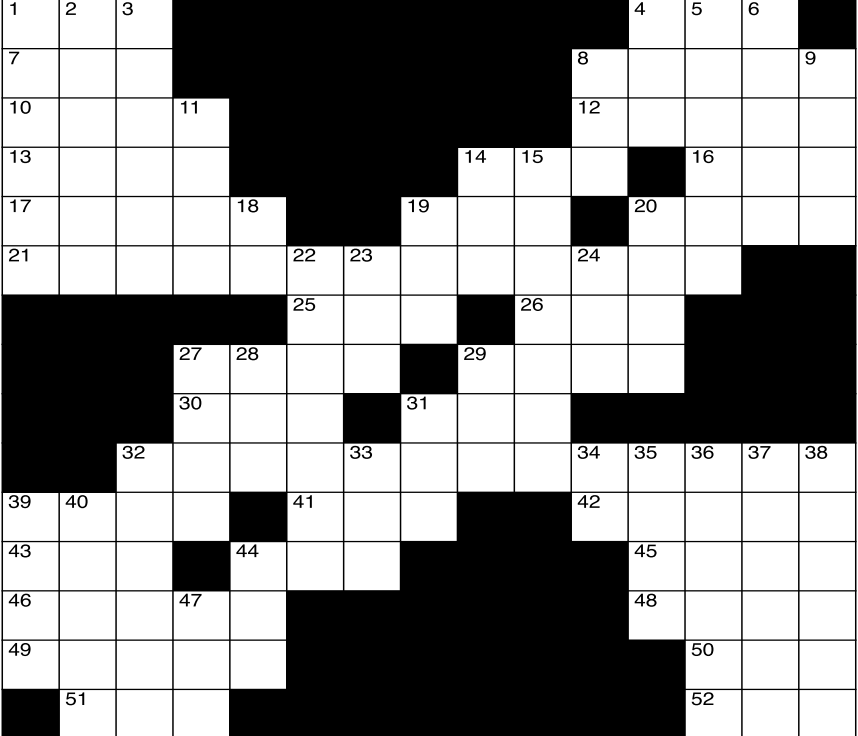

The pantry is open to Craig County citizens and there are no eligibility requirements. You do not have to be receiving benefits or services from DSS to get food from the pantry.

"We only ask how many are in your household and what the ages are so we can gear what we put in the bags," Franklin said. "All a Craig County citizen has to do is come to our DSS office Monday through Friday 9-4 and ask for supplies from the pantry."

The size and ages in

the household will determine how many bags a person can receive. Craig County citizens can come once a month, no questions asked. Items you may receive are spaghetti sauce, noodles, hamburger or tuna with tuna helper, peanut butter, jelly, a loaf of bread, cheese and butter, along with a few can goods. Personal hygiene products for the young and old, male or female are also available.

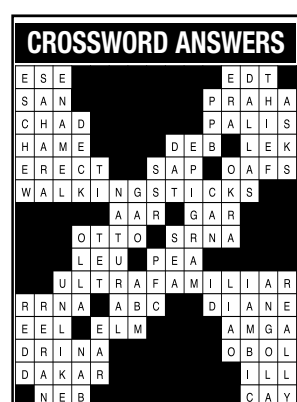
"We promise to be discreet when you come for those personal items,"

Franklin said. "We try to keep some laundry detergent and some cleaning supplies on hand as well."

News from the 9th: Democrats Gamble With Our Country's Future

Seeing the Democrats continue to push the same failed policies with the hope of different results, I can't help but think of a gambler who has already lost big but who remains at the table hoping the next roll of the dice will pay off.

Let's start with spending. An early priority of President Biden and his party's congressional majorities was the so-called "American Rescue Plan" that spent \$1.9 trillion. Even some liberals like former Clinton and Obama advisor Larry Summers cautioned that the result of such excessive spending would be surging inflation.

Those warnings have been vindicated. Our economy has since suffered from inflation not witnessed

for 40 years. Costs have risen so sharply that the White House actually celebrated July's consumer price index, which found "only" an 8.5 percent rise over the previous year and continued increases in food and housing prices.

Yet the continued priority of President Biden, House Speaker Nancy Pelosi (D-CA), and Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) has been passing another huge spending bill paying for the progressive wish list. In their so-called "Inflation Reduction Act" is \$745 billion of new spending. Among that spending is over \$400 billion for Green New Deal-type policies when removing false two-year sunsets and \$80 billion for the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) to hire 87,000 new agents.

The impact of this spending will be bad enough, but it follows other big-spending packages of spending bills already passed by House Democrats for the next fiscal year. If a package of six appropriations bills sent by House Democrats to the Senate were enacted, it would increase funding by almost \$56 billion over the same appropriations bills from last year, including increases

for the Environmental Protection Agency of twenty percent and the Department of Housing and Urban Development of seventeen percent. The IRS would get \$1 billion more.

Further, note that the government is funded by twelve appropriations bills, so Democrats still have half of them to go.

Pouring money into the economy helped generate the inflation now driving up costs for Americans on goods and services they use every day. More money for these agencies would also empower bureaucrats imposing regulations, which tend to inhibit economic activity and would aggravate our current difficulties. Yet Democrats are ready to do it again with the hope that this time will somehow yield better results.

In their proposed ban on so-called assault weapons, the Democrats are also ready to roll the dice again. The original ban was passed in 1994, thanks in part to the leadership of then-Senate Judiciary Committee Chairman Joe Biden and then-Congressman Chuck Schumer. It expired in 2004, having had little effect on crime rates.

Now, eighteen years after the ex-

piration, Democrats want to reimpose the ban and have voted to do so in the House of Representatives. They acknowledge that the firearms which would fall under the ban are in common use, making the ban unconstitutional under the Supreme Court's ruling in *District of Columbia v. Heller*. Nevertheless, the left remains wedded to unconstitutional and ineffective restrictions on law-abiding gun owners.

At the southern border, the Biden Administration's decision to dismantle enforcement and stop work on the border wall created a crisis. More illegal immigrants have been encountered at the border this fiscal year than in any other on record, and the fiscal year does not even end until September 30.

Responding to the chaos caused by undoing border enforcement measures, the Biden Administration has chosen to . . . undo more border enforcement measures. They have announced an end to the Remain in Mexico policy that required asylum seekers to stay in that country while their claims are processed. The Administration had previously sought to end the policy but had been

blocked by the courts. As illegal immigration and drug trafficking spiked in the meantime, they could have shelved this ill-considered repeal. Instead, President Biden once more doubles down.

In under two years of one-party rule at the federal level, Americans face soaring costs of living, restrictions on constitutional rights, a border out of control, and numerous other problems that would be alleviated if only Democrats recognized the harm their policies have inflicted and changed course. But they just can't walk away from the gaming table, no matter how much they lose. It's too bad we lose, too.

Warner & Kaine announce more than \$2.1 million in funding to address COVID-19 in rural Virginia communities

Today, U.S. Senators Mark R. Warner and Tim Kaine announced \$2,124,300 in emergency rural health care funding to bolster federal support in addressing the COVID-19 pandemic. The funding will be provided to the Ledwith-Lewis Free Clinic in Tappahannock, Page Memorial Hospital in Luray, Tazewell Community Hospital in Tazewell, and Wellmont Health System in Big Stone Gap. This funding was awarded through the Community Facilities Emergency Rural Health Care program at the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA).

"As Virginia communities continue to grapple with the COVID-19 pandemic, it's critical that we provide resources to help protect Virginians," said the Senators. "That's why we are pleased to see these grants go towards COVID vaccination and testing, telehealth and food assistance services, ventilation systems, and financial aid."

The funding will be awarded as below:

- \$36,800 for Ledwith-Lewis Free Clinic in Tappahannock, VA to provide COVID-19 testing kits, rapid testing supplies, and vaccinations, as well as additional staffing to meet the needs of the

rural counties served. This investment will benefit approximately 27,350 residents.

- \$1,000,000 for Page Memorial Hospital in Luray, VA to purchase telehealth, remote monitoring systems, COVID testing, mobile clinic and food assistance. In addition, the funds will be used to train current nursing staff. This project aims to connect rural patients to Valley Health telehealth services and Page County internet infrastructure. This project will benefit approximately 24,042 residents.

- \$335,000 for Carilion Clinic (Tazewell Community Hospital) in Tazewell, VA to upgrade the heating, ventilation, and air conditioning (HVAC) systems. The HVAC system will follow the Center for Disease Control's COVID-19 operational protocols for health care and will service the lab and patient care areas, as the current HVAC system is old and unreliable. This investment will benefit approximately 45,078 residents.

- \$752,500 for Wellmont Health System in Big Stone Gap, VA to replace lost health care revenue and help with financial difficulties experienced during the COVID-19 pandemic. This investment will benefit approximately 70,997 residents.

The USDA's Community Facilities Emergency Rural Health Care program is designed to help broaden access to COVID-19 testing and vaccines, rural health care services, and food assistance through food banks and food distribution facilities.

Senators Warner and Kaine have been strong advocates for rural communities and health care access in the Commonwealth. Last year, both Senators helped pass the American Rescue Plan, a COVID-19 relief bill that provided \$20 billion to improve vaccine distribution, \$10 billion for the Defense Production Act to procure essential medical equipment, and \$50 billion for virus testing, genomic sequencing to detect new variants, contract tracing, and additional PPE. Additionally, Senator Warner introduced legislation, cosponsored by Senator Kaine, to expand telehealth services through Medicare, connecting patients to doctors and cutting costs for patients and providers. Senator Kaine also introduced legislation to expand health care to rural areas through telehealth as part of the Lower Health Care Costs Act of 2019. The bill passed out of the Senate Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions (HELP) Committee as part of the Lower Health Care Costs Act of 2019.
