
He added, "If you look around the

They shared, "Craig County educator Geoff Boyer has dedicated 20 years to teaching math and computer science at Craig County High School. His students design and build portable gaming machines and learn to code using Arduino IDE. A master teacher with Mobile CSP, he travels around the country during the summers to train other teachers, empowering them to impact more students through STEM. In addition to teaching, Geoff also owns his own 3D printing business.

Morgan Romeo, who is the executive director of the Greater Roanoke Workforce Development Board, nominated Boyer. Boyer received the STEM-H Educator Award.

"It is using technology in the classroom," Boyer shared. "My students built keyboards and gaming devices to program." He added. "It was a very special honor that I

shared with my wife, Pam and our school's Susan Stimeling and Gerri VanDyke. I am so proud to represent Craig County and our students. We do a lot of great things with limited resources." In asking if there was anyone he felt helped

him in receiving this award, Boyer responded, "Honestly, it's the students who helped create all of the items we've made. Their inspiration and creativity shaped what we do, and they are motivated to work on their projects. His students ranging from 6th through 12th

grades were involved in this year's projects. Boyer has also done interviews for a magazine

and newsletter. "I have made some contacts in the business

community and hopefully can leverage this to



#### Interstate 81

INTERSTATE 81 LANE WIDENING CONSTRUCTION PROJECT EXIT 137 TO EXIT 141 - A \$179 million design-build project to widen both directions of I-81 between mile markers 136.6 and 141.8 from two to three lanes is set to begin. Starting in February and continuing into the early summer, work will be performed on the inside and outside shoulders along a five-mile section of both northbound and southbound Interstate 81 in Roanoke County and the city of Salem. The shoulders will be built up before barrier wall can be installed for road crews to work behind. Barrier wall will be installed along the shoulders in the spring and summer. Two lanes of I-81 traffic in each direction will remain open during the project with periodic lane closures scheduled during nighttime hours or outside of peak travel times as needed. Drivers can expect the following lane closures and upcoming impacts on northbound and southbound I-81:

#### ADDITIONAL TRAFFIC IMPACTS:

TRAFFIC SHIFT ON WILDWOOD ROAD: Expect a traffic shift with narrow width on Wildwood road after exiting I-81 southbound heading towards Salem. Southbound and northbound I-81 exit and entrance ramp narrows possible at Route 311.

WORK ZONE SPEED: With narrow spacing in lanes due to barrier walls, lack of shoulders and lane shifts in various locations, drivers should adhere to posted 60 mph speed limits in the work zone and allow space when following a vehicle.

RAMP CLOSURES: Ramp closures are possible during nighttime hours, 12 a.m., to 5 a.m. Drivers should watch for message boards dates and times the ramp will be closed.

LANE CLOSURES: Alternating left and right lane and shoulder closures during nighttime hours between 8 p.m. and 6 a.m., Sunday through Thursday, are possible. Lane widths will be reduced to 11 feet. Nightly lane closures may be in place along the right lane with possible nightly ramp narrows as needed for guardrail and shoulder strengthening.

The project also includes replacing six bridges, widening two bridges, installing approximately 2.6 miles of sound barrier walls along northbound I-81, improving the southbound exit 137 offramp intersection at Wildwood Road and adding interchange lighting at exits 137, 140 and 141 are also included in the project. Expected completion in early 2026.

NORTHBOUND AT EXIT 105 NEW RIVER BRIDGE REPLACEMENT IN MONTGOMERY COUNTY - Traffic on northbound I-81 has been switched onto the newly constructed bridge over the New River at the Montgomery/Pulaski County line. The old bridge is being demolished. Lane and shoulder closures may be in place near exit 105. Lane closure may be in effect during the week from 8 p.m. to 7 a.m. Shoulder closures may be in effect at any time during the week. Slow rolls may be performed on I-81 in the north and southbound lanes from mile marker 98 to 109. Speed limit is reduced to 60 miles per hour in the work zone. Shoulder closures will remain in place though the duration of the project. Project completion is estimated by summer 2023. ROUTE 605 - There will be intermittent lane

closures on Route 605 under the bridge and will

be maintained by flagging operations. SLOW ROLLS: A slow roll operation may be

in place daily, Monday through Friday, between mile marker 101 and 105 northbound and between mile marker 109 and 105 southbound, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. Slow rolls may be utilized periodically on both the northbound and southbound lanes from mile marker 98-109 for structural steel deliveries and setting beams.

LANE CLOSURES: Nighttime alternating lane closures will be in place on I-81 northbound between mile markers 104-106 from 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. the following morning.

ROUTE 605: Alternating lane closures and flagging operations will be present on Route 605, located under the New River Bridge, for work overhead on the bridge.

I-81 PAVING OPERATIONS - Weather

permitting, crews will be performing paving operations along Interstate 81. Right and left lane closures may be in place along northbound and southbound lanes during nighttime hours, 7 p.m. to 6 a.m. Drivers should watch for moving vehicles and equipment. Expect possible delays.

I-81 BRIDGE DECK REPAIRS - Weather permitting, crews will repair bridge decks on Interstate 81. Between mile markers 170 to 95, right and left lane closures will be in place northbound and southbound during nighttime hours, 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. the following mornin00g. Drivers should watch for signs and expect possible delays.

EXPRESSWAY OPERATIONS - Weather permitting, crews will pave, patch and repair pavement on various routes. Lane closures may be in place during nighttime hours, 9 p.m. to 6 a.m. the following morning. Drivers should watch for signs and expect possible delays.

#### Roanoke City

13th STREET SE IMPROVEMENTS WITH DETOUR - A project to improve a portion of 13th Street SE in Roanoke is underway. Located in a residential neighborhood just east of downtown Roanoke, this project will improve traffic flow and connectivity along 13th Street SE from Tazewell Avenue to Norfolk Avenue. The project entails reconstructing about 0.2mile of 13th Street as an improved, twolane roadway with 10.5-foot-wide travel lane and a raised median. A new roadway will extend 13th Street to Norfolk Avenue and the intersection at 13th Street and Wise Avenue will be reconfigured to include a roundabout. Bike lanes, sidewalks, crosswalks and curb and gutter will also be added. Southbound 13th Street traffic has a detour in place using Norfolk Avenue onto 12th Street to Tazewell Avenue. This detour will be in place throughout the duration of this project. Signs will be posted to designate the detour route. Northbound 13th Street will remain open to traffic. Flaggers may be possible and the speed limit through the work zone is 25 mph. Alternating lane closures maintained by flagging operations may be in place. The project is expected to be completed in August 2023.

ROADS CLOSED PAVING: Beginning Monday, June 19 through Thursday, June 22, Wise Avenue will be closed between 12th Street and 14th Street for paving. Westbound traffic will be detoured onto Norfolk Avenue and eastbound traffic will be detoured onto Norfolk Avenue or Campbell Avenue. 13th Street northbound will also be closed and southbound traffic will be detoured onto Campbell Avenue.

Pursuant to Virginia Code §§ 15.2-1427 and 58.1-3509, the Craig County Board of Supervisors will hold a public hearing on July 6th, 2023 at 6 p.m. in the Circuit Court Courtroom, Craig County Courthouse, 303 Main Street, New Castle, Virginia.

The purpose of the public hearing will be to receive public comments on the proposed adoption of an ordinance repealing the merchants' capital tax within the County and amending Section 38-1 of the Craig County Code, effective immediately. Any person interested in the proposed ordinance may appear at the public hearing and present their views.

A copy of the full text of the proposed ordinance is on file in the office of the County Administrator of Craig County, 108 Court Street, New Castle, VA 24127, and is available for review during normal business hours. 



1pm and 3pm in the parking lot beside the New Christian Church."


They also shared that distribution boxes have been placed around town to collect food that will be gathered on June 21 and divided between DSS food pantry and the New Christian Church pantry.





## DIAMONDS ARE FOR WINNERS

I watched the coronation of King Charles in May and was amazed at the gold and jewelry on display in the crowns, crosses and anywhere you might stick a diamond, ruby or sapphire. Then I saw the Chiefs championship ring.

The Chiefs unveiled their championship rings last week and they're a sight to behold. It seems like every year the current champion tries to out-do the previous one, and I'm pretty certain the Chiefs have accomplished that.

First off, the ring includes 609 round diamonds, 16 baguette diamonds, whatever a baguette is, and four marquise diamonds. That's 629 diamonds on one ring!! If I didn't know better I wouldn't think you could get 100 diamonds on a ring, much less 629.

I'm wondering who all gets those rings. Certainly everyone on the 45 man roster and let's say another five or six on the practice squad. Let's round it off to 50 players.

Then you have the coaches. I checked the Chiefs wed-site and they list 29 assistant coaches in addition to head coach Andy Reid,

so that's another 30 rings. Of course the owner and front office personnel will be included, and a conservative guess would be another 20. So, I'm thinking

about 100 of the real rings will be given out. I saw an article where over 700 rings were given after the 2020 Chiefs won the Super Bowl, but most of them were "replica" models that went to cheerleaders, support staff and the like. I guess that means it's not solid gold and real diamonds, but it would still be cool

So, let's say 100 real rings are given out, and that's probably a conservative estimate. At 629 diamonds per ring that would be 6,290 diamonds. And I know they're not cheap, because when I bought an engagement ring for my wife 35 years ago I had to save up for a year in advance, and it had just one diamond. Thank goodness she's not a Chiefs'

Along with the diamonds each Super Bowl ring also has 35 custom cut rubies, since the Chiefs' color scheme is red. And, get this, the top of the ring comes off and inside Arrowhead Stadium is revealed with a pair of Lombardi Trophies on the field.

"Winning a Super Bowl is the crowning achievement for an NFL club, and the championship ring is the ultimate symbol of the hard work, dedication and sacrifice that it takes from everyone in the organization to reach this pinnacle," Chiefs President Mark Donovan said, via a press release.

Okay, that's great, but I'd be scared to wear the thing. It would be like standing outside the casino counting 100 dollar bills. You're just asking for someone to hit you over the head and take off with the ring.

And, in a more practical vein, how are you going to get something out of your pocket? With 664 stones, counting diamonds and rubies, that has be a pretty good sized ring. If you feel a sneeze coming on that would be a challenge to get your handkerchief out of your pocket in time.

From what I can see, this Chiefs' ring might be the most elaborate of all-time. A couple years ago former Bucs' coach Bruce Arians was at a Virginia Tech football game and he was happy to show me his ring. It was very nice, indeed, but I doubt if it had over 600 stones.

I've been to the Pro Football Hall of Fame in Canton many times, and one of my favorite displays is the case with all the Super Bowl rings, starting with the Packers in 1967. It was a ring you might actually wear, but as the years progressed you could see them getting bigger and gaudier every season until now the Chiefs are basically wearing a jewelry store on their finger.

Shortly after reading about the new rings I was driving through Roanoke and saw a guy struggling to push a shopping cart, loaded with all his worldly possessions, up a hill. All that money going to bling and some folks are

struggling to get a bite to eat. Makes you think.
